Attachment A

1. Gave informal talk in mid-July 1979. (Neither my papers nor the records of the International Law Institute show the date as the meeting was not of that significance.)
2. In November 1979. My papers do not show the exact date and the staff at NPR indicates that it is not able to provide the specific date from its available records. The interview in any event was at the request of NPR, was informal and done without any supporting papers, and was very brief in duration. I was responding to a request from its news department and in no way was seeking to do other than answer the questions put to me by NPR. (A substantive question would seem to be presented whether registration policy is to monitor news and public affairs programs where response is made at the initiative of the media and not the instigation or under the direction in any sense of the Registrant or principals.)
3. In response to request for further information: CBS Face the Nation staff personnel telephoned to inquire if I would support or endorse the Saudi Minister of Petroleum appearing on that program on an appropriate date. I recommended that the program telex him directly, as I understand occurred. Subsequent discussions were between the program personnel and the Saudi Arabian Embassy. I believe that I was called once or twice to be kept informed of what was being done and to request my support. I arranged no meeting with Saudi officials or engaged in any activities on behalf of production crews or other related activities other than the above telephone calls. I recommended consideration of the programs but made no further follow-up.
4. At the request of representatives of the Council on Foreign Relations in New York City, I followed through on invitations which they extended directly to the Saudi Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Prince Bandar bin Sultan on the actual dates convenient for the Council and the stated individuals. The actual arrangements were made by those individuals and the Saudi Embassy, with my role simply following up to confirm the arrangements made and the actual occurring of what had been scheduled.
5. At the request of CBS and NBC, inquiries initiated by them in telephone calls to me, I informed the Saudi Ambassador of the interest expressed in going into Saudi Arabia. At the request of NBC and CBS officials, I sent introductory telexes to the Saudi Arabian Foreign Minister, Petroleum Minister, Minister of Industry and Electricity, Planning Minister and Prince Turki Al-Faisal, expressing the hope that cooperation might be extended to the two groups. No additional undertaking was made. I expressed the hope to the Saudi Embassy that visas would be granted but took no further action on that. At the request of CBS and NBC personnel, I talked with them informally in my office about the history, economy and society of Saudi Arabia in the most general way and understand that was part of a number of series of inquiries which they made with relevant Americans and others in preparing for their projects.
