Toured Boeing Aircraft plant in Seattle, WA with Saudi Ambassador and his party June 13. Met Company officials and U.S. military personnel assigned there but simply monitored visit, did not participate.

Attanged interview with Saudi Ambassador for John Berry of Newsweek Oct 19 and sat in on interview.

Arranged for Saudi Ambassador to go to CNN studio for appearance by him on Larry King Show August 18 and on International Hour program Sept.25 to discuss the Gulf crisis. Accompanied him to both.

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Accompanied Saudi Ambassador to taping of McLaughlin's One On One program, NBC, on Aug. 19th, 1990.

Arranged for CBS "60 Minutes" to interview Saudi Ambassador at his residence for broadcast Aug 12.

Arranged with Betty Dukert for Saudi Ambassador to appear on NBC Meet the Press program Aug 12 to discuss the Gulf crisis and accompanied him there.

Accompanied Saudi Ambassador for appearance on ABC Nightline program Oct 23 to discuss Gulf crisis but did not arrange it.

Accompanied Saudi Ambassador to talks he gave for students and faculty at Yale University in New Haven Dec 3 and Tufts University Fletcher School of Diplomacy in Boston Dec 4, but did not arrange either.

Accompanied Saudi Ambassador on five trips to Saudi Arabia and London during this period as well as to Beijing and Damascus. Flew with him November 23 from Dhahran, Saudi Arabia to Jeddah accompanied by Senators George Mitchell and Robert Dole, Speaker Thomas Foley and Robert Michel, and talked with them briefly during trip about Saudi Arabia and Gulf crisis but only incidental to their discussions with Saudi Ambassador and other Saudi Officials.
