### III Activities, No. 11 Continued

Wrote and then met with Congressman Bill Emerson (March 18, 1993) and (separately) met with H.R. Foreign Affairs Committee Staff Official Michael Van Dusen (April 8, 1993), in their respective offices, on claims of U.S. companies with regard to doing business in Saudi Arabia, and in which the Congress and U.S. Executive Branch agencies had expressed an interest.

Worked with Principal and met with Mr. David Edwards (January 4, 1993, Georgetown Inn), plus follow-up calls and meetings and with Ambassador Richard Murphy in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, in February 1993 (exact date is missing), as to an endowment gift to be made (and subsequently completed) by Principal for higher educational purposes in the state of Arkansas for Middle East Studies, per 1991 request by then Gov. Clinton and follow-up by successor, Gov. Jim Guy Tucker in January 1993, plus call from Governor Tucker's legal counsel January 15 while registrant was in Riyadh. Also was called on same subject in May 1993, by the University of Arkansas' Dean of the College of Letters and Sciences, Bernard Madison.

Met at Principal's Embassy with Harvard Law School Dean Robert Clark and two faculty members accompanying him May 19 concerning gift sought by Harvard for endowing a chair of Islamic legal studies and related programs there; plus follow-up telephone discussions on that. Went to Harvard with officials of Principal for formal completion of that gift June 8, 1993 and also met there on the endowment with Harvard University President Rudenstine.

Attended meeting January 6 and May 2 with Aspen Institute President David McLaughton and other Institute officials in its offices in Washington, D.C. for planning of future conference on international, political and security issues, including some of relevance to Principal; plus related telephone calls with Institute personnel.

Attended small dinner at Hay Adams Hotel with Senators Kennedy and Dodd, and Principal's Ambassador May 11.

Attended conference with Principal's officials in Tampa, Florida, May 19-20, 1993, sponsored by the U.S. Central Command on "Challenges to Security in Southwest Asia." Met Lt. Gen. Hoar and a number of U.S. military officers and academics attending that conference. Subsequently called N.Y. public relations counselor, The Schmertz Company, 1185 Avenue of the Americas, New York (which has a direct retainer from Principal) to arrange for publication of excerpts from talk by Principal's Ambassador at the Central Command Conference, in the New York Times, May 30, 1993, and also for printing of those excerpts in a six-panel form for use directly by Principal. (Registrant did not handle any other work or funds as to either of those.)

Attended President-Elect Clinton's Gala celebration January 18 and several other pre-Inaugural gatherings, meeting briefly with a broad range of public figures and media representatives, but nothing of substance as to Principal. Similarly attended reception hosted by New York Times in Washington, D.C. March 26, 1993 attended by a number of media people, but no particular discussions as to Principal. Similarly, as to attendance at reopening of Freer Gallery in Washington, D.C. May 6th. Similarly attended a May 23 private dinner at home of Washington businessman Miles Rubin, with Secretary of State Warren Christopher in the group; no discussion as to Principal. Similarly as to attending a White House dinner with President and Mrs. Clinton and others from government and the media June 3 and private dinner June 5 for retiring Supreme Court Justice Byron White. Similarly, in connection with 25th anniversary of the death of Robert F. Kennedy June 6, gave NBC (March 17), CNN (May 27) and People Magazine (May 18 and 25) interviews at their request, and attended Arlington Cemetery ceremonies and large dinner at home of Mrs. Ethel Kennedy, meeting briefly with a broad range of media representatives and public officials, including President Clinton, but no discussion of Principal.
