III-Activities, Question 11

Provided material on Principal's Ambassador to U.S. to Aspen Times, Aspen, Colorado, December 23.

Met informally and unscheduled with Arkansas' Governor Jim Guy Tucker in Dallas, Texas, December 26 and touched on grant made by Saudi Arabia to University of Arkansas and three other institutions of higher learning in that state through Governor Tucker's office earlier in year.

Received calls from and met with personnel of University of Arkansas' Fulbright College at their request a number of times during this registration period to follow through on that grant, including helping arrange details of trip undertaken by University of Arkansas officials and faculty members to Saudi Arabia planned for July 1994.

Talked with Washington Post writers John Lancaster and Rich Weintraub January 6 in response to their inquiries as to partial stretch-out of payments schedule for Saudi military procurement pending in U.S. Same with Wall Street Journal writer (name lost) January 6 on same subject. Same with New York Time writer Eric Schmitt, January 6 on same subject. Talked briefly with U.S. Defense Department procurement official Michael McMurry on same subject at a dinner in Riyadh first week of February and with Assistant Secretary of Defense Charles Freeman in call from him on same subject May 7.

Attended White House announcement ceremony with Principal's Ambassador for Saudi Arabia's purchasing approximately \$6 billion in U.S.-manufactured passenger aircraft. President Clinton, Secretary of State Warren Christopher, Secretary of Commerce Ronald Brown and White House staff members were in attendance along with media and others.

Attended State Department reception as invitee February 24 and briefly met a number of Department personnel. Reception was in connection with Saudi Arabia and other countries participating in World (Soccer) Cup tournament in U.S. summer 1994.

Attended dinner honoring Public Broadcasting Network journalist Paul Duke and talked briefly with journalists who were also there.

Attended American Pharmaceutical Association reception in U.S. Capitol March 15 and briefly met a number of Congressmen and staffers there.

Met with Wall Street journalist Carla Robbins at her request April 22 on diplomatic developments.

Attended talks by Principal's Ambassador at National War College, Washington, D.C. and met with senior officers and staff there April 8.

Received call from Senator Harris Wofford April 22 about meeting businessmen from Pennsylvania interested in qualifying to bid for Saudi government procurement in U.S. Then met with them separately. Attended fund-raising reception for Senator Wofford May 4. Registrant Frederick Dutton also made a contribution to Wofford Re-election campaign - on basis of knowing Sen. Wofford for 34 years.

Had dinner at Registrants' home April 22 with Deputy Secretary of Defense John Deutsch and journalists Cokie Roberts, Steve Roberts, Barbara Cohen, John Cochran, Jack Nelson, Barbara Matasou, Jules Witcover, James Wooten and Ken Bodie.

Invited to dinner with John Mashek and Robert Healy of Boston Globe May 12 and touched on Saudi Arabia.

Invited to lunch May 27 with Los Angeles Times Washington bureau chief Jack Nelson and U.S. Ambassador-designate to Saudi Arabia Ray Mabus, and discussed Saudi Arabia extensively.

Received call as to Principal from New York Times writer Patrick Tyler June 9.

Arranged luncheon for Washington Post journalist John Lancaster with Principal's Ambassador June 10.

Arranged for and met a number of times in May and June with Herb Schmertz and Joe Goldstein, both public relations specialists in New York, to help handle media matters in connection with Saudi Arabia's participation in World Cup Soccer Tournament in U.S.
