FURTHER DETAILS RESPONSIVE TO PARAGRAPH 11 OF THE FILING:

1. Talked with and twice met with Adity Raval, production coordinator, ABC – TV. Washington D.C., in response to his initiative inquiring about the possibility of the Saudi ambassador appearing on the Peter Jennings' ABC evening new program and/or the Diana Sawyer morning ABC program, with nothing coming from either inquiry; Also met him at a press conference of the Saudi ambassador at the Saudi Embassy with ABC and NBC camera crews concerning the events of September 11, 2001. The press conference was on Sept. 15, 2001 .

2. Talked with Robert Wheelock , senior producer of ABC's Good Morning America, at his initiative about the possibility of the Saudi ambassador appearing on that program. Nothing came of this.

3. Received telephone calls from Patrick Tyler of the New York Times, a long – time friend, in the last half of Sept., Oct., Nov. and Dec. about his interest in having an interview with the Saudi ambassador. That took place several times in the indicated period after Tyler's requests were forwarded to the ambassador.

4. Received call in late September from ABC State Dept. correspondent Martha Raddatz as to her having an interview with the Saudi ambassador. Referred her to the ambassador's office and Saudi Information Office.

5. Received phone call from ABC's Barbara Walters about her interest in interviewing members of the bin Laden family in Saudi Arabia. Registrant suggested she should call the ambassador's office. Also received call from Jane Meyer with the same request for an article in the New Yorker magazine and Registrant suggested she call the Saudi Information office.

6. Attended luncheon with Saudi ambassador , Len Downey the Executive Editor of the Washington Post and about twenty senior Post journalists. The Ambassador talked and answered questions as to Saudi Arabia and the Middle East. The lunch took place in October.

7. Accompanied Saudi ambassador when he appeared on the ABC Sunday morning program in late September for an interview with Sam Donaldson. Also met briefly on that occasion with journalist Claire Shipman.

8. Accompanied Saudi ambassador when he appeared on ABC's Larry King evening show Oct. 1 but was not otherwise involved.

9. Received call from CNN's Andrea Koppel about possibility of interviewing Saudi ambassador. Suggested she call his office or the Saudi Information Office.

10. Briefly happened to see the Washington Post's Robert Kaiser, a long time friend, at a Washington restaurant, along with Christopher Dickey of Newsweek magazine, and touched on Saudi Arabia. Kaiser later called Registrant on same subject,

and Registrant sent him a fairly recently published study on evolving views of the younger generation in Saudi Arabia.

11. Called and talked briefly on the phone with the Wall Street Journal's Gerald Seib,, a long time acquaintance from when he was the Journal's Middle East correspondent, about recent developments in Saudi Arabia and the Middle East more broadly.

12. Was called several times by Jack Nelson, Chief Washington Correspondent for the Los Angeles Times, in late September and October, about developments in Saudi Arabia. Was asked to meet with him and another member of the L. A. Times staff at its Washington bureau. Also while there, ran into Norman Kempster, the paper's State Dept. correspondent and a long time friend

13. Met with PBS's 'Front Line' producer Lowell Bergman in late September and October about an on-camera interview the Saudi ambassador had already agreed to, with the interview to be at his residence. Footage of the interview was used in two separate PBS documentaries on Saudi Arabia and the overall Middle East situation. Also received a half dozen phone calls from Bergman in Oct. and early November on the same subjects. At the beginning of the ABC project, met very briefly with New York Times journalist Judith Miller, who had arranged directly with the Saudi Ambassador for the interview.

14. Was called in early October by USA Today's Barbara Slavin about the possibility of an interview with the Saudi ambassador. Referred her to his office.

15. Was called by CBS 60 Minutes Correspondent Leslie Stahl about the possibility of an interview with the Saudi Ambassador. Passed the request on to his office but nothing came of that.

16. Was called about Saudi Arabia in October and November by the Washington Post columnist Jim Hoagland, by Krukchank of the Chicago Tribune, by Mark Mathews of the Baltimore Sun, by Evan Thomas and an associate (several times) about an article being prepared for Newsweek magazine, and also undoubtedly several other journalists whose 'call slips' to Registrant were inadvertently lost. All the calls were fairly brief and routinely handled, including referrals to the Saudi Information Office. Received call from NBS correspondent Andrea Mitchell seeking an interview with the Saudi ambassador and referred her to the ambassador's office, with an interview later arranged there. Also was called by Sy Hersch, a long-time acquaintance, telling me he was doing two 'tough' articles on Saudi Arabia for the New Yorker magazine, but there was no further discussion and the calls were very brief.

17. Registrant, in his basic role as attorney for the Saudi Embassy, arranged for the N.Y., Washington and London public relations firm of Burson Marsteller (which had long already had a working relationship with Saudi agencies), to produce and place for publication two full-page newspaper messages expressing Saudi condolence to the families of victims of the Sept. 11th tragedies as well as to U.S. Society as a whole.

18. Registrant (Nancy Dutton) worked with the Saudi Ambassador's wife and the wives of other Arab Ambassadors in Washington making up the Board of Directors of the Mosaic Foundation in the planning and holding of a dinner in mid-November at the Saudi Embassy honoring former South African President Nelson Mandella and raising funds to fight the spread of Aids in Africa and elsewhere. In attendance at the dinner were members of the U.S. government, business community and media as well as others.
