Arab Prince Is UNICEF's Newest Envoy



At a child care center in Hyderabad, India, HRH Prince Talal bin Abdul Aziz al-Saud of Saudi Arabia, Special Envoy for the United Nations Children's Fund, reads to children who are benefitting from his years-long efforts on their behalf. The 52-year-old brother of King Fahd of Saudi Arabia, is often called the "children's prince" in recognition of his efforts to improve the living conditions of children throughout the world. As Honorary Secretary-General to UNICEF, Prince Talal travels throughout the world's most desolate regions and enthusiastically calls upon world leaders to encourage contributions to UNICEF and other United Nations' agencies. So far, the Arabian Gulf states have made a \$200 million commitment to aid UN projects to alleviate suffering in the Third World, thanks to Prince Talal's tireless efforts.

Helping The World's Children

Prince Talal bin Abdul Aziz al-Saud is the 52-year-old brother of King Fahd of Saudi Arabia, but he is better known as the "children's prince"—a man who works throughout the year to improve the living conditions of children everywhere. As Hon-



orary Secretary-General and Special Envoy to the United Nations Children's Fund, Prince

Talal helped to bring about a \$200 million commitment by the Arabian Gulf states to aid UN efforts in the Third World. Here, he explains some of his philosophy about aiding the poor.

A well-known verse in the Koran reads, "As for him who voluntarily performeth a good work, verily God is grateful and knowing."

There are many similar verses in the Holy Bible, one of which is found in the Book of Matthew, Chapter seven, verse twelve: "Therefore all things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them: for this is the law and the prophets."

When I accepted the appointment as Special Envoy, I said "This is the mission given to me by my father, King Abdul Aziz. Before he dies, he told me, 'Assist those who need you most, take under your care the most young.'"



I sometimes wonder how our civilized world puts a man on the moon and spends hundreds of billions on armament but still allows children to die of illness and hunger.

It is morally unacceptable that the gap between the developed and developing countries remains as wide as it is today. It does not matter if the needy are Christian, Muslim or Jew. Hunger does not make such distinctions, and neither should humanitarianism.

If we have in the past given our children a world torn with war and disagreements and plagued with poverty, hunger and disease, then let us today give them the ability to change and create a new society based on love, peace and dignity. Let our slogan be that the future of tomorrow's peace will be decided by the children of today.

PRINCE LEADS EFFORT TO HELP WORLD'S YOUTH



Around the world 47,000 children die each day from hunger. UNICEF, the 1965 Nobel Peace Prize recipient, is working strenuously to assuage the suffering of children everywhere.

The spirit of UNICEF is exemplified by one of its key fundraisers and children's advocates, Prince Talal bin Abdul Aziz al-Saud, 52-year-old brother of King Fahd of Saudi Arabia. As Special Envoy for UNICEF, Prince Talal is often called the "children's prince" in recognition of his efforts to improve the living conditions of children throughout the world.

Prince Talal tirelessly travels the globe raising funds for UNICEF and calling attention to UNICEF activities in developing nations. Meeting with world leaders such as Prime Minister Indira Gandhi of India, President Francois Mitterand of France, Pope John Paul II and Queen Elizabeth II, Prince Talal is persuasive in

his quest for contributions, as he promises, "for the price of a tank I can save 500,000 children from the scourge of dysentery."

Prince Talal emphatically states, "it is morally unacceptable that we do not do more to alleviate the suffering. It does not matter if the needy are Christian, Muslim or Jew. Hunger does not make such distinctions, and neither should humanitarianism."

Since April, 1981, Prince Talal has raised \$58 million for UNICEF. This money financed 20 projects in 21 nations of Africa, Asia and Latin America. The projects ranged from construction of irrigation systems to development of fish farms and agricultural activities.

Prince Talal's commitment to UNICEF and his special concern for children is due to his belief that "the future of tomorrow's peace will be decided by the children of today."
