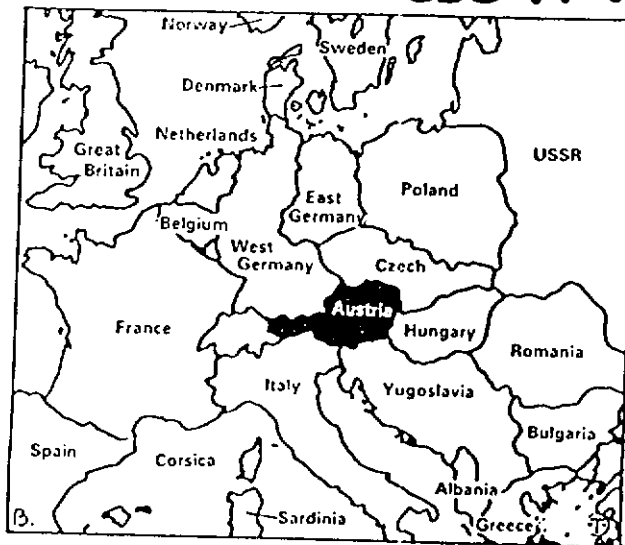

Did You Know?



Roughly the size of Maine, Austria cannot aspire to wield decisive influence upon world history. But this small country at the heart of Europe does play an active role in international politics. It also wants the world to know it, a new report reveals.

- The Report highlights the change in East-West-Relations and the progress in disarmament. Since Vienna is currently hosting two conferences on conventional arms and confidence building measures in Europe, assessments are made from first-hand knowledge.

- The Report also focuses on the changes within the European community in view of the realization of the Internal Market by 1992. Like Switzerland and Sweden, permanently neutral Austria is not

a member of the European Community, but transacts roughly 70 percent of its foreign trade with it.

- The United Nations is another area of interest, since Austria has been very active in the world organization since 1955, contributing significantly to peace-keeping operations.

"For smaller, democratic European countries such as Austria, the vision of a peaceful world and more constructive international relations must be translated into concrete action," writes the Austrian Foreign Minister. 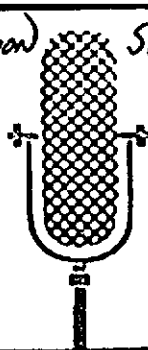

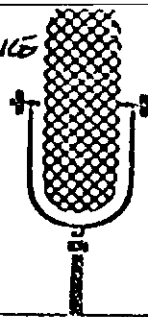

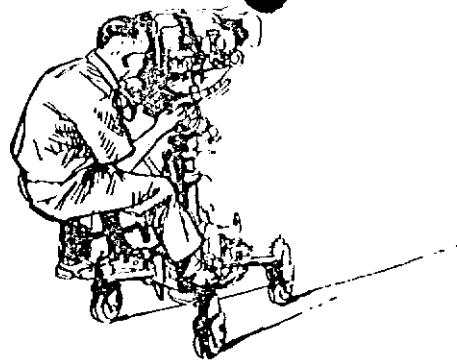
