In response to request dated September 27, 1984, the following additional information is provided for the registrant's Supplemental Statement filed for the six month period ending April 25, 1984:

If the registrant arranged, sponsored or delivered speeches, lectures or radio or TV broadcasts, give details as to dates, places of delivery, names of speakers and subject matter.

CKLW Radio Broadcasting Ltd.

On behalf of this foreign principal, the registrant monitored the status of the U.S. legislation (S. 1940) designed to provide treatment for U.S. broadcast media advertisements reciprocal to that accorded Canadian advertisers under Canada's C-58 laws. The registrant additionally provided advice concerning the nature of that proposed legislation and sought to protect the interests of the foreign principal under its provisions. For this purpose the registrant held meetings during November of 1983 through the end of the reporting period with the staff of the Senate Finance Committee, the staff of Congressman Gibbons, the staff of the House Trade Subcommittee, the staff of the Ways and Means Committee, and the staff of Senator Riegle. During November 1983 meetings were held with the staff of Senator Bradley, the staff of Senator Heinz, the staff of Senator Boren, the staff of Senator Bentsen, the staff of Congressman Ford and the staff of Congressman Conable. In November 1983 meetings were held directly with Congressman Vanderjagt and Senator Roth. During the period from February 1984 through the end of the reporting period, meetings were held with the staff of Congressman Hertel, the staff of Senator Danforth, and the staff of Congressman Frenzel.

Government of Jamaica

The registrant advised the foreign principal regarding developments in the Legislative and Executive Branches affecting the interests of Jamaica, and provided representation before those

Branches to discuss the impact of various provisions of the U.S. foreign assistance legislation and the Caribbean Basin Economic Recovery Act. With respect to the treatment of Jamaica under provisions of the Caribbean Basin Economic Recovery Act (CBERA) related to copyright of broadcast materials, and particularly for the purpose of assuring that Jamaica was not denied benefits under the CBERA on the basis of such provisions, the registrant met during the period with Congressman Dan Rostenkowski; Congressman Jerry Solomon; Ambassador William Brock; Everett Bierman, Minority Staff Director for the House Foreign Affairs Committee, staff members in the office of Congressman Michael Barnes, Congressman Robert Lagomarsino; Edward Derwinski, Counselor to the Department of State; Thomas Enders and Gerald Rosen of the State Department, Congressman Charles Rangel, Congressman Dick Schulze, Congressman Carroll Campbell, Congressman Frank Guarini, Senator John Heinz, Senator William Roth, Congressman Jack Kemp, Congressman Clarence Long, Senator Daniel Inouye, Senator Robert Kasten, Congressman Robert Livingston, and Congressman Jerry Lewis.

For the purposes of monitoring the progress of foreign assistance legislation and seeking favorable treatment for Jamaica under that legislation, the registrant met during the reporting period with Congressman Andy Ireland, Congressman Jerry Lewis, Congressman Jack Kemp, and Congressman Robert Livingston.

Government of Sudan

The activities undertaken by the registrant during this reporting period on behalf of the Government of Sudan related to the foreign assistance legislation pending before the House of Representatives and the Senate. Contacts made in this regard were for the purpose of explaining the critical need of the Government of Sudan for such foreign assistance and obtaining the best possible treatment for Sudan under this foreign assistance legislation.

Government of Cyprus

The activities undertaken by the registrant during this reporting period on behalf of the Government of Cyprus related to pending foreign assistance legislation in the House of Representatives and the Senate. Contacts made in this regard were for the purpose of explaining the impact of proposed foreign assistance provisions upon Cyprus and to obtain treatment under those provisions which, to the maximum extent possible, improved the economy of Cyprus and created a favorable context for negotiations concerning the reunification of the island of Cyprus.
