Government of Sudan

During this reporting period, the Registrant advised the Government of Sudan regarding developments in both the Legislative and Executive Branches that affect the interests of Sudan. The Registrant also provided representation before those Branches to discuss the interests of Sudan and obtain treatment beneficial to Sudan in the U.S. foreign assistance programs.

Government of Jamaica

On behalf of the Government of Jamaica, the registrant provided advice regarding developments in the Legislative and Executive Branches affecting the interests of Jamaica. The registrant also provided representation before those Branches to discuss the implementation of various provisions of the Caribbean Basin Economic Recovery Act and the impact of U.S. proposals for revision of country of origin requirements related to textile imports. For this purpose, discussions were held during this reporting period with certain members of Congress, staff personnel of such members, and officials of the Executive Branch.

Also during this period, discussions and meeting were held with officials of the Executive Branch regarding matters of concern to the foreign principal affecting Economic Support Funding assistance for Jamaica. In addition, the registrant advised the foreign principal regarding issues relating to the International Youth Conference held in Kingston, Jamaica in April 1985. For this purpose, discussions and meetings were held with officials of the Executive Branch.
