In that connection we also did the following things: attended the caribbean Marketplace in Jamaica in January, Hosted a dinner for the NYASTA Chapter, made a presentation to the CTA Northwest chapter in Seattle, Washington, attended the CTA East and West coast Trade Shows, coordinated seminars with Caribbean Holidays to promote the Dominican Republic on the East Coast and South West. Attended the 6 Caribbean Conference held in Puerto Rico in June, attended the COTAL conference in Santo Domingo held in June, arraigned several cocktails made numerous television and Radio appearances promoting the country distributed press releases and photos to publications.**





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Dear Nancy,

It has been some time since our meeting and my interview with Ellis Perez. I was pleased to hear that he has been appointed the new Minister of Tourism, and I hope you will convey to him my congratulations and the following idea.

When you came to our studios, Mr. Perez, you and I discussed the possibility of my producing a half-hour radio program on Dominican music and culture. I am still very enthusiastic and think such a program would be an exciting offering to radio stations in the U.S.

As I mentioned, The Broadcasting Foundation of America is a non-profit organization specializing for over 25 years in providing the culture and music of other countries to the American radio audience. Our programs are syndicated and reach millions of listeners throughout the 50 states.

I have recently won a national award for a program I produced, and last year I was invited to Jamaica for 10 days to interview Jamaica's leading cultural personalities and record excerpts of music. From this trip, I produced a 1/4-hour program and a 1/2-hour special entitled - "Jamaica: A People, A Heritage" - which featured music, laughter and interviews with leading artists, theater performers, musicians and singers. Together these programs were syndicated to over 100 commercial and non-commercial stations, and the dateless material is reused.

I wish to propose doing the same type of cultural special on the Dominican Republic, to include interviews with leading cultural personalities and music in order to provide the American audience with a lively cultural understanding of the country and its people.

Transportation, about 7 days accommodation and a local contact to arrange appropriate interviews are the essential things needed to do such a project.

Currently my schedule allows me to travel during the months of January and February. I look forward to hearing from you soon and sharing with you the great value of providing Americans with a greater understanding of Dominican culture through this radio project.


