

✓ Kuwait Petroleum Corporation - The Registrant wrote and distributed to various news agencies a press release concerning the filing by Kuwait of a countersuit against Getty for \$230 million. Registrant also contacted staff members of Members of Congress concerning the status of the Mineral Lands Leasing Act of 1920.

✓ Thyssen Nordseewerke, GMBH

No activities during this reporting period. Client terminated as of 12/31/82.

✓ Southern Cone Publishing & Advisory Services, Inc. - The Registrant's primary activity during this reporting period has consisted of monitoring and reporting on issues affecting U.S.-Argentine trade relations through the reading and clipping of approx. seventy U.S. publications dealing with U.S.-Argentine issues and resulting in the production of bi-weekly client reports summarizing our findings. The Registrant produced and distributed three issues of The Argentine Report, Vol. 2, No. 4 with questionnaire and Vol. 3, No. 1 with questionnaire and Vol. 3, No. 2. Registrant staff conducted research, translation, editing, proofing, layout and mailing for Argentine Reports mentioned above, constructed invitation list for would-be participants in 6/83 Seminar, pursued keynote speakers for June seminar, did preparatory work (including facilities arrangements) for June seminar during Feb/Mar/Apr 1983. During January, preparations were made for 2/83 U.S. visit by Dr. Zinn and Ambassador Takacs. During December 1982, registrant worked with Argentine Embassy to reprint Report's interview with Amb. Registrant prepared and distributed news release 12/12/82 announcing IRIS' new regional directors. Relationship with client terminated 2/9/83 due to bankruptcy proceedings.

✓ Arab Women's Council - Registrant produced slide show and script on behalf of foreign client for presentation to American universities and colleges.

✓ Hambros Bank Limited/Sharps, Pixley Limited - Registrant is lobbying Congress to pass S.2870 and H.R. 5858, a private bill to compensate those British financial institutions which deal in silver for losses suffered when Treasury Department ended its silver pegging program in 1967. Various Members of Congress and staff members were contacted by registrant concerning foreign principal's point of view.

HRH PRINCE TALAL BIN ABDUL AZIZ AL-SAUD - Registrant wrote and distributed press releases to media (print and broadcast), media advisories, and background information on HRH Prince Talal in conjunction with his fundraising efforts as Special Envoy for UNICEF and his visits to U.S. cities in this effort (Atlanta, Houston, D.C., New York City, Los Angeles).
