



UK TOP RECIPIENT OF FOREIGN DIRECT INVESTMENT

UN Conference on Trade and Development reports record levels of FDI into the UK

New York, NY – February 7, 2006 The UN Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD) has released data indicating that the UK was the world's largest recipient of foreign direct investment in 2005, well ahead of the US and China. According to the research, FDI into the UK grew 182% last year to US\$219 billion, the highest figure ever recorded for a European country and twice the US\$106 billion invested in the US. The last time the UK topped these figures was 1977.

"The UK's continued strength in FDI is due in large part to US investors, who recognize our success in deregulating and opening up markets to international competition," said Gordon Innes, Director of UK Trade & Investment for the United States. "Our strong economy, stable regulatory regime, flexible workforce and significant cost advantages make the UK the premier location for US companies wishing to compete not only in the Europe market but also today's global market."

"The United Kingdom has enjoyed eight years of economic prosperity, with economists predicting a continued upward growth pattern over the next decade," said Innes. "Our ever-evolving global business culture has contributed greatly to the economic activity we are currently experiencing, but in part we owe this prosperity and economic upward mobility to the close relationships the UK has with our key economic partners, partners like the United States. The US remains the UK's largest investor, second largest export market, and one of our most important economic alliances", said Gordon Innes. "UK business, government, and academia are all working to ensure the UK retains its position as the most competitive place to do business in Europe and we continue to work

closely with our US partners to confirm we continue to meet their business needs.”

According to UNCTAD, total global FDI inflows into developed countries rose from US\$415 billion in 2004 to US\$573 billion in 2005. FDI increases were underpinned by a favourable business climate and economic growth. Mergers and acquisitions – including cross-border activity – increased 40% for the year, and amounted to roughly US\$2.9 trillion in 2005, partly reflecting higher share prices in many major financial markets.

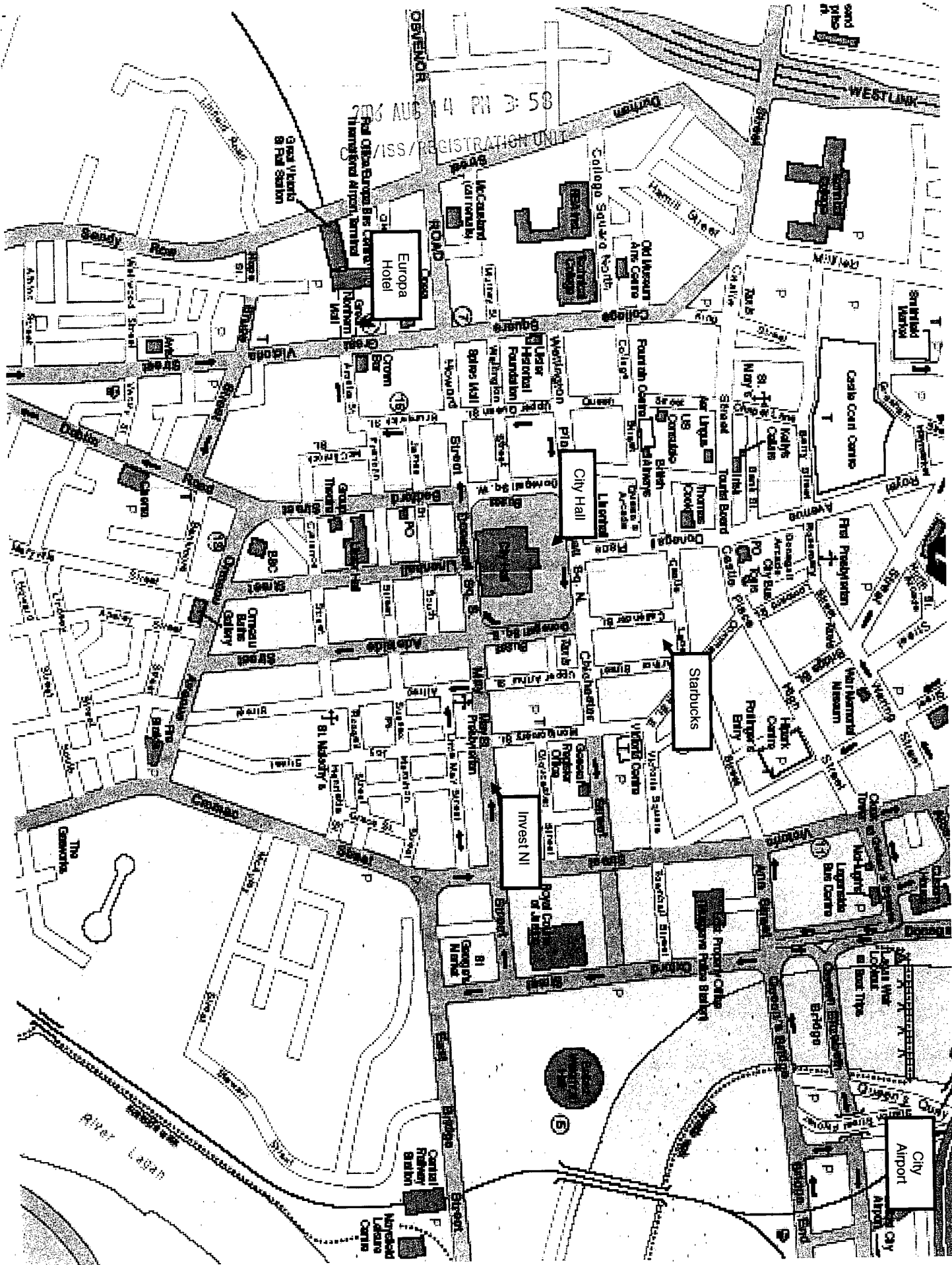
