FRANCISCO GUILLERMO FLORES PÉREZ

Last February, the ARENA party elected Francisco Guillermo Flores Pérez to run as its candidate for President of El Salvador in the March 7, 1999 elections. Mr. Flores has served since May 1997 as one of the youngest Presidents of the Legislative Assembly in El Salvador's history, a position to which he was elected unanimously by all the Political Parties. He has earned national recognition in this position for his fairness and his ability to build a consensus.

Mr. Flores has served as a public official over the past 10 years. During President Cristiani's administration, he served as Deputy Minister for Planning and was the Official Representative of the Social Cabinet. Following this post, he was appointed Deputy Minister of the Presidency and Presidential Advisor. President Calderón Sol named him National Secretary of Communications and Secretary of Information of the Presidency.

Mr. Flores left the Executive Branch to serve as a Representative for the National Constituency in the unicameral Legislative Assembly of El Salvador for two consecutive legislative terms. He became the leader of his Party's fellow legislators and was elected President of the Legislative Assembly with the support of all its members. In addition to his public service, Mr. Flores has taught Philosophy at the José Simeón Cañas University and Philosophy and Sociology at the José Matías Delgado University in San Salvador.

In May of this year, Mr. Flores began his pre-campaign activities by carrying out extensive grassroots consultations throughout the country in order to better address the concerns of all of the sectors of El Salvadoran society.

Born in San Salvador on October 17, 1959, Mr. Flores studied sociology at the University of Hartford, where he received an Associates Degree in Arts. He then went on to receive a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science at Amherst College. He attended the Program of History and Literature at the University of Oxford in England, continued with his postgraduate studies in political economy at Harvard University and received a Master's Degree in Philosophy from World University in California.

Mr. Flores speaks Spanish and English. He is married to Lourdes Rodríguez de Flores and has two children, Gabriela and Juan Marcos.

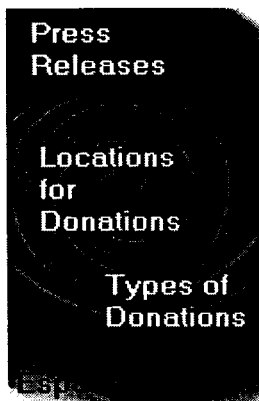

PRELIMINARY INFORMATION ON DAMAGES CAUSED BY TROPICAL STORM MITCH IN EL SALVADOR

The Embassy of El Salvador in Washington DC, informs that yesterday the President of the Republic, Dr. Armando Calderón Sol, continued inspecting the affected areas by tropical storm *Mitch* in the eastern part of the country bringing a message of comfort and encouragement to all disaster victims.

Preliminary estimates of the damages to the entire country show:

- 239 deceased, 135 disappeared, 74 isolated pending to be rescued and 58,788 disaster victims.
- Medical assistance has been provided to 50,000 (fifty thousand) people at the national level which include acute respiratory sicknesses, diarrhea, dermatitis, conjunctivitis, as well as the first incidences of malaria. The risk factors that help to increase these illnesses include sudden temperature changes, flooding, destruction of latrines and the contamination of the waters.
- The destruction on the infrastructure includes damages to the principal highways, secondary access roads and bridges. To date 81 highways have been inspected and some have been restored. The total destruction of three of the main bridges and damages to 17 others has been verified. Due to the high water levels of the rivers that cover the foundations, it has been impossible to inspect a considerable number of bridges.
- Approximately 10,000 homes were totally destroyed and thousands are still uninhabitable
- 830 schools were damaged and the repair is estimated at 40

million Colones (US\$4.6 millions), amount that may increase when the total evaluation is finalized.

- Preliminary figures estimate damages to the agricultural production at 80%
