Response to #11

Fiat, S.p.A.: On behalf of Fiat, S.p.A., the registrant has been retained to present that company's views in relation to legislation which might affect Fiat's ability to participate in U.S. defense contracts. In addition, registrant presents the company's views with regard to Defense authorization and appropriations legislation and pending trade legislation.

Ricoh Corporation: On behalf of the Ricoh Corporation, registrant has been retained to monitor legislation now pending in the Congress regarding international trade and to report thereon.

Thomson-CSF, Inc.: (contract of March 9, 1987). On behalf of Thomson-CSF, registrant has been retained to monitor the implementation of the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986 and to advise client about same. In addition, registrant monitors U.S. government interest in the development of security systems which may be supplied by the client.

Thomson-CSF, Inc.: (contract of June 1, 1987). On behalf of Thomson-CSF, registrant has been retained to present that company's views in relation to legislation now pending in the Congress which would affect Thomson's participation in bidding on the Voice of America Modernization Program.

Beretta U.S.A. Corp.: On behalf of Beretta, registrant has been retained to present the company's views with regard to Defense authorization and appropriations legislation.

Fiat, S.p.A.: Activities on behalf of Fiat involved efforts to secure funding for certain defense programs in which Fiat or its subsidiaries was a competing bidder. This effort required contacts with Members and staff of the House and Senate as well as with Administration officials.

Ricoh Corporation: No political activity was undertaken on behalf of Ricoh Corporation.

Thomson-CSF, Inc.: (contract of March 9, 1987). Activities on behalf of Thomson involved efforts to monitor the implementation of the Immigration Bill. In addition, registrant sought to identify U.S. government agencies having an interest in certain security systems. This effort required some contacts with Members of Congress and staff and a number of contacts with Administration officials.

Thomson-CSF, Inc.: (contract of June 1, 1987). Activities on behalf of Thomson involved efforts to remove disadvantageous language from legislation, now pending in the Congress, which will impair Thomson's ability to compete for contracts related to the Voice of America Modernization Program. This effort has necessitated numerous Congressional and Administration contacts.

Beretta U.S.A. Corp: No political activity was undertaken on behalf of Beretta during the reporting period.
