On behalf of the clients designated herein, the registered members of Gold and Liebengood, Inc., discussed the issues described below. All of these contacts were by phone or office visit and occurred during the six month reporting period.

Fiat, S.p.A.: Activities on behalf of Fiat, S.p.A., involved efforts to secure funding for certain defense programs in which Fiat or its subsidiaries was a competing bidder. This effort required contacts with Members and staff of the House and Senate as well as with Administration officials. In addition, efforts focused on clarifying concerns expressed by the Office of Munitions Control with regard to certain export licenses. This necessitated contacts with the State Department and Department of Defense.

Ricoh Corporation: No political activity was undertaken on behalf of Ricoh Corporation.
