On behalf of the clients designated herein, the registered members of Gold and Liebengood, Inc., discussed the issues described below with the designated persons. All of these contacts were by phone or office visit and occurred during the 6 month reporting period.

Fiat, S.p.A.: Activities on behalf of Fiat, S.p.A., involved the monitoring of Congressional funding activity for certain defense programs in which Fiat or its subsidiaries was competing bidder. This effort required contacts with Members and staff of the House and Senate. In addition, efforts focused on clarifying concerns expressed by the Office of Munitions Control with regard to certain export licenses.

Thomson-CSF: Activities on behalf of Thomson-CSF involved a determination of federal budget funding levels for certain transportation programs of interest to the company. In addition, registrant contacted Members of Congress and staff regarding the initiation of the Mobile Subscriber Equipment production at a Thomson-CSF subsidiary.
