Provided liaison with Congressional staff groups concerned with U.S. foreign policy.

Provided information to Congressional offices on events in South Africa; such information included copies of articles from newspapers and magazines; also research on the ANC; U.S. business in South Africa; black unemployment in South Africa.

Assisted with visit of Mr. R.P. Meyer, Member of Parliament in South Africa to Washington, D.C.

Provided information to civic organizations, groups, media, and educational organizations, with information on events in South Africa; such information included copies of magazine and newspaper articles.

Consulted with Ambassador and Embassy personnel on relations with American media, particularly in regard to how to increase attention for reforms taking place in South Africa in such areas as the government's commitment to political participation by all parts of South African society, the government's program of negotiation with all groups that seek change through peaceful means, and the government's commitment to a system of equal rights with no political domination by any one group.

Discussed potential Congressional Committee actions and actions of Congress that would harm relations between the U.S. and South Africa and would harm the cause of reform in South Africa with Members of Congress and their staffs.

Arranged meetings between Congressional staff and Embassy personnel.

Consulted with other consultants and law firms that serve as registered foreign agents for the Republic of South Africa.

Consulted with officials of South African consulates in U.S. on relations between U.S. and South Africa.

Monitored State Department's Advisory Committee on South Africa hearings on South Africa.

Assisted in planning for receptions, dinners and other meetings at Embassy, including the Republic Day reception.

Developed and provided liaison with non-governmental groups and organizations interested in U.S. foreign policy.

- 1) Statements from Oliver Tambo, President of the African National Congress (ANC), concerning his views and the ANC's views on such topics as Communism, terrorism, violence, and nationalization. Included are the following statements: "Long live the Communist Party of the Soviet Union," "We are saying South Africa must bleed and die.... Let the whole country experience this," and "The solution we see is one of nationalization."
- 2) Research packet on the abolition of the pass laws in South Africa, that included "Progress in South Africa," The Washington Times, April 25, 1986, and "Pretoria Makes a Big Concession On Apartheid", The New York Times, April 27, 1986. Also included quotes from leading opposition figures in South Africa on the importance of ending pass laws (including Bishop Tutu's statement that it was "a very significant step") and quotes from non-South African sources such as The New York Times editorial "... a reform worthy of the word." and William Rasberry's statement that it is a "development of major significance."
- 3) Article by Ambassador Herbert Beukes in U.S.A. Today, May 28, 1986, "Pressure won't help; we're ending apartheid," in which Ambassador Beukes points out that "violence as a political instrument should be rejected unequivocally. The right choice is to encourage peaceful negotiations..."
- 4) Newspaper article, "Winnie and the curse of violence," Sunday Times, April 20, 1986, in which Winnie Mandela is quoted as saying, "Together, hand in hand, with our boxes of matches and our necklaces, we shall liberate this country."
- 5) Research sheet "Do Blacks In South Africa Support Economic Sanctions," in which it was pointed out that more than 70% of blacks in South Africa according to a recent poll by a leading research organization opposed sanctions against South Africa.

6) A column by William F. Buckley, "Pity The State Department," National Review, July 4, 1986, in which Buckley points out that South Africa has a right to fight terrorism directed against it from neighboring countries.

7) An Embassy of South Africa letter, of May 30, 1986, that points out the potential for sales of wheat by United States farmers to South Africa.

8) An Embassy of South Africa letter, of June 27, 1986, that points out how South Africa assists in the export of U.S. coal to Asia.

9) Three items from newspapers, including an editorial from The Wall Street Journal of June 20, 1986, in which the questions are asked of the Congress, "Do they want a foreign policy that seeks to promote constructive solutions to intricate political problems around the world? Or do they want a scorched-earth policy attuned to the objectives of the international left? The wrong choice will be expensive in human lives;" a southern Africa map from The Washington Times, June 23, 1986, that points out how South Africa is the economic engine that propels economic growth in black African countries; and an Evans and Novak column "A Label on the ANC," The Washington Post, June 25, 1986, in which it is pointed out that "the 30-member ANC national executive named last year contains at least 19 and up to 25 known communists. The ANC's 1985 political report endorses Soviet repression in Poland and Afghanistan, assails the United States for leading the global offensive of imperialism and condemns Zionist Israel as the proxy of United States Imperialism."

10) Two articles from Washington Jewish Week, July 10, 1986: one "Arab Terrorists Aid South African Groups," points out that "The PLO smells blood in South Africa" and that the PLO and other Arab terrorist groups are training ANC cadres; the other article, "Buthelezi Speaks on Israel, Anti-Semitism," points out Buthelezi's support for Israel and opposition to anti-Semitism.

11) A compilation of articles including "Mixing Sanctions and Profit," The Washington Times, August 13, 1986, that points out that some of the push for sanctions against South Africa in various countries is actually a protectionist move for local industry; "Ministers castigate sanctions," The Washington Times, July 31, 1986, in which 3 black South African pastors opposed sanctions against South Africa which "would further increase black unemployment and unrest...and help advocates of communism who want to prevent negotiations and solutions to the problems;" a George Will column, "Moralists at a Safe Distance," The Washington Post, July 31, 1986, which points out that South Africa doesn't need sanctions but a Marshall Plan targeted at educating, housing, training and capitalizing blacks;" an article by Mangosuthu Buthelezi, "What Sort of South Africa Will Emerge?" Los Angeles Times, July 4, 1986, that points out how the ANC is encouraging violence in South Africa, particularly black-on-black

violence and how he has been targeted for assassination; "A Child's Lot In Uganda: At 14, A Combat Veteran," The New York Times, August 4, 1986; "Rushing toward the Cliff," The Washington Times, July 31, 1986; "Fact Evasion," Fortune, July 7, 1986, in which it is pointed out that the ANC sent a delegation to the Soviet Communist Party Congress this year and three ANC leaders were recently mouthing the party line on Soviet television;" "Emergency shield for Botha's bid to woo black moderates," Christian Science Monitor, July 1, 1986; "Civil War Ravages Southern Sudan," Washington Post, July 2, 1986; and "South Africa: A Look Beyond The Headlines," The Union-Leader, July 3, 1986, that contrasts South Africa with Marxist regimes such as Ethiopia, which are carrying out genocide on their own people.
