HOTEL COMPETITION HEATING UP IN SINGAPORE

LOS ANGELES, August 9, 1991 -- Hotels in Singapore are quietly discounting room rates and offering unprecedented services and value-added amenities in an effort to boost occupancy levels to pre-Gulf War levels.

Many of Singapore's hotels, including its renowned luxury properties, are offering discounts ranging from 10% to 30%. The discounts are being offered to walk-in guests as well as long-staying guests, groups and corporations, according to Singapore's leading newspaper, The Straits Times. Certain discounts are offered only after bargaining, and few are available for long-range booking.

But for the traveler with a flexible or changing itinerary, Singapore is rolling out the red carpet. At least one hotel has introduced a package of extras including express, in room check-in service, complimentary food, drinks and laundry services to draw more business travelers to Singapore.

Several Singapore hotels are offering discounts to travel agents as occupancy rates continue their slower-than-expected recovery in the wake of the Persian Gulf War.

2-2-2/HOTEL COMPETITION HEATING UP IN SINGAPORE
