Saudi Arabia:

During the applicable six month reporting period, Berman, Bergner & Boyette represented the client before Members of the US Senate and their staffs regarding the arms sale proposed by President Reagan in the Spring of 1986. This work encompassed both the original Senate vote and the veto override attempt. Other services included more general inter-governmental relations activities, including preparatory planning for a congressional delegation trip to Saudi Arabia in early 1987.

Taiwan/China External Trade Development Council:

Activities rendered to the CCNAA/Taiwan included monitoring legislation on democratization in Taiwan in the House and Senate. Other activities included more general intergovernmental relations activity.
