IAI assisted the Embassy with respect to security assistance and other programs to increase Turkey's effectiveness as a member of the NATO alliance.

In particular, IAI held numerous meetings with officials of the Executive Branch, members of Congress, and Congressional staff concerning legislation for the authorization and appropriation of security assistance to the Republic of Turkey. IAI also opposed S.J. Res. 212. A detailed list of meetings with members of Congress and Congressional staff is attached hereto (Attachment B).

An IAI officer appeared as a panelist on C-Span to discuss the overall foreign aid program and proposals to modify it. IAI also helped arrange for President Ozal to address the Council on Foreign Relations on January 23, 1990.

The staff of International Advisers, Inc. (IAI) has been working to increase mutual understanding between the peoples of Turkey and the United States to promote effective cooperation between the two governments so that the Republic of Turkey is able to carry out its significant defense responsibilities within the framework of the Western Alliance. IAI assisted the efforts for the appropriation of U.S. military and economic assistance to the Republic of Turkey in conformity with the principles contained in the Side Letter of the Agreement for Cooperation and Defense and Economy between the governments of the USA and the Republic of Turkey. In this connection, IAI assisted in efforts to oppose S.J. Res. 212, and advised the Embassy regarding the promotion of bilateral trade and other economic relations including promoting the objective of U.S.-Turkish defense industrial cooperation.

IAI maintained contact with officials of the Executive Branch, Members of Congress, and Congressional staff responsible for matters of importance to Turkey. It informed the Embassy of political and news media developments in the United States affecting Turkey's interests, including such matters as military and economic assistance, NATO, and regional issues such as Cyprus and the Aegean. It provided to the responsible Executive Branch agencies and congressional offices the information concerning Turkey and Turkish positions that they need to discharge their duties responsibly and effectively.
