On behalf of this foreign principal the registrant provided advice and information regarding developments in the Legislative and Executive Branches that affected the interests of the Republic of Cyprus. The registrant continued an outreach program to acquaint new Members of Congress and the new Leadership with the Cyprus problem. The registrant assisted in working to obtain fair treatment for the Republic of Cyprus under various provisions of U.S. foreign assistance legislation.

The registrant worked on matters affecting the interests of the Republic of Cyprus. These included Congressional efforts to consolidate the foreign affairs agencies and to authorize funding for their activities, including foreign assistance. The registrant also worked to obtain sponsors and co-sponsors for House and Senate resolutions expressing support for Cypriot President Clerides' proposal to demilitarize all of Cyprus.
