ATTACHMENT A

Republic of Cyprus

During the six-month period ending March 31, 1996, the registrant provided advice and information regarding developments in the Congress and the Administration that affected or might affect the interests of the Republic of Cyprus. Our activities and services on behalf of Cyprus were as follows:

- Reporting orally and in writing on legislative and Administration actions and/or plans of concern or interest to Cyprus.
- Monitoring and preparing reports on Congressional hearings and business meetings on issues of direct interest to the Republic of Cyprus. The relevant committees whose activities we monitored included the House International Relations Committee, the Senate Foreign Relations Committee and the House and Senate Appropriations Committees.
- Preparing background papers and talking points for Members of Congress and their staffs to use during meetings of the above committees in support of matters of interest to the Republic of Cyprus as well as statements for use during floor debates in the House and Senate on matters involving the interests of Cyprus.
- Analyzing legislation to identify provisions that may affect the interests of Cyprus.
- Drafting suggested language for inclusion in committee reports accompanying legislation.
- Urging Members of Congress, either directly or through their staffs, to co-sponsor or vote for legislation, including House and Senate resolutions, of interest to Cyprus.
- Meeting with Members of Congress and/or their staffs to brief them on issues involving or of interest to Cyprus.
- Arranging meetings for visiting officials of the Government of Cyprus with Members of Congress.
- Advising officials of the Republic of Cyprus on strategies and methods to advance the objectives of Cyprus in Washington.
- Obtaining copies of Congressional and Executive Branch documents and reports dealing with topics of interest to Cyprus.
- Preparing periodic reports on the American political scene, with special emphasis on the November 1996 elections.

ATTACHMENT B

During the six-month period ending March 31, 1996, the registrant engaged in specific and sustained political activities on behalf of the Republic of Cyprus as detailed below.

Interests and policies sought to be influenced. The registrant worked to ensure that the House and Senate conferees on the fiscal year 1996 foreign assistance appropriations bill adopted the Senate's earmark of \$15,000,000 for Cyprus. At the same time, the registrant worked with Members of Congress on legislation capping aid to Turkey. The registrant worked to obtain additional co-sponsors for the Cyprus demilitarization resolution (H.Con.Res. 42) and to advance the resolution closer to passage by both house of Congress. The registrant worked with Members of Congress on letters to President Clinton urging him to develop a plan of action consistent with H.Con.Res. 42.

Work was done in an effort to rebut Congressional criticism of Cyprus's record of implementing UN sanctions against Serbia and to promote Congressional understanding of Cyprus's concerns regarding an impending US sale of tactical missiles to Turkey. The registrant also arranged meetings with Members of Congress for Foreign Minister Aleco Michaelides (October 1995); Yiannakis Matsis, President of the Democratic Rally party of Cyprus (January 1996); and Alexis Galanos, President of the House of Representatives of Cyprus (February 1996). These meetings provided an opportunity for these senior officials to exchange views with Members of Congress on matters of interest to Cyprus.

Means employed to achieve the above objectives. The registrant contacted, in personal meetings or by telephone, Members of Congress and their personal staff, or the staff of relevant House and Senate committees as indicated below, on one or more occasions. Contacts were made with Administration officials as well. The contacts made on behalf of Cyprus were as follows:
