

ATTACHMENT B

During the six-month period ending September 30, 1997, the registrant engaged in specific political activities on behalf of the republic of Cyprus as detailed below.

Interests and policies sought to be influenced. The registrant worked with the Chairman and staff of the House International Relations Committee on the text of a resolution to be introduced by Chairman Ben Gilman (R-NY) and Ranking Minority Member Lee Hamilton (D-IN) urging the Administration to launch an initiative aimed at resolving the Cyprus problem. Such a resolution was introduced on May 15 (H.Con.Res. 81) and approved by the Committee on June 25. We also worked with members and staff of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee to develop a Senate version of this resolution. Led by Senators Gordon Smith (R-OR) and Joseph R. Biden, Jr. (D-DE), the Committee approved an original resolution (S.Con.Res. 41) on July 17. The House approved H.Con.Res. 81 on July 22, and the Senate approved S.Con.Res. 41 on July 23.

The registrant arranged meetings with five key Members of Congress for Foreign Minister Ioannis Kasoulides on June 5. These meetings provided an opportunity for Foreign Minister Kasoulides to exchange views with key members of the House and Senate on matters of interest and concern to both Cyprus and the United States.

The registrant worked with staff of the House International Relations Committee to ensure that the report accompanying the Foreign Policy Reform Act (H.R. 1486) included language relating to the Cyprus problem and the need to continue providing \$15 million in Economic Support fund assistance to Cyprus. This bill, in addition to making changes in the structure of the foreign affairs agencies, authorizes appropriations for foreign assistance and for the Department of State and related agencies for fiscal years 1998 and 1999. Included in the section of the report discussing the Economic Support Fund were five paragraphs devoted to Cyprus. In these paragraphs, the Committee expressed its opposition to the status quo on Cyprus, supported an early U.S. initiative to help resolve the Cyprus problem, reaffirmed its support for the demilitarization of Cyprus, observed that the prospect of Cyprus's accession to the EU could serve as a catalyst for resolving the Cyprus problem, and "strongly" recommended the continued allocation of \$15 million for Cyprus in fiscal years 1998 and 1999.

The registrant worked to reverse an action by the Foreign Operations Subcommittee of the Senate Appropriations Committee that would have replaced the customary "hard earmark" of \$15 million for Cyprus with a non-binding recommendation that \$15 million be provided to Cyprus. Working with several Senators and their staffs, the registrant helped to achieve a restoration of a binding earmark during consideration by the full Senate Appropriations Committee on June 24.

The registrant alerted staff of key members of the House Appropriations Committee of problems associated with new language inserted in the report accompanying the Foreign Operations Appropriations bill for fiscal year 1998. The registrant pointed out that the report should have referred to "two communities" on Cyprus rather than "two societies" and that the report's call for an "evenhanded" approach to resolving the Cyprus problem ignored the fact that Turkey was the

aggressor in 1974 and continued to occupy 37% of Cyprus in violation of numerous United Nations resolutions. The registrant further urged that such language not be repeated in the House-Senate conference report on the bill.

The registrant continued discussions with officials of the U.S. Export-Import Bank on the sale by McDonnell Douglas of passenger aircraft to an airline illegally operating in the occupied northern part of Cyprus. The registrant also kept key Members of Congress and their staffs informed of recent developments related to this sale.

The registrant contacted staff of the House International Relations Committee about the invitation extended on September 9 for the leader of the Turkish Cypriot community, Rauf Denktash, to meet with the Committee when he visits the U.S. in October. The registrant urged that care be taken to ensure that Denktash does not try to portray the meeting as Committee recognition of the legitimacy of a separate Turkish Cypriot state.
