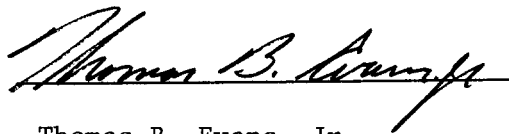

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ATTACHMENT A

Republic of Cyprus

During the six-month period ending September 30, 1998, the registrant provided advice and information regarding developments in the Congress and the Administration that affected or might affect the interests of the Republic of Cyprus. Our activities and services on behalf of Cyprus were as follows:

- Reporting orally and in writing on legislative and Administration actions and/or plans of concern or interest to Cyprus.
- Monitoring and preparing reports on Congressional hearings and business meetings on issues of direct interest to the Republic of Cyprus. The relevant committees whose activities we monitored included the House International Relations Committee, the Senate Foreign Relations Committee and the House and Senate Appropriations Committees.
- Preparing suggested questions for Members of Congress to ask during hearings held by the above committees on matters of interest to the Republic of Cyprus.
- Analyzing legislation to identify provisions that may affect the interests of Cyprus.
- Drafting suggested language for inclusion in committee reports accompanying legislation
- Urging Members of Congress, either directly or through their staffs, to co-sponsor or vote for legislation, including House and Senate resolutions, of interest to Cyprus.
- Meeting with Members of Congress and/or their staffs to brief them on issues involving or of interest to Cyprus.
- Arranging meetings for the Ambassador of Cyprus with research staff of Washington think tanks.
- Advising officials of the Republic of Cyprus on strategies and methods to advance the objectives of Cyprus in Washington.
- Obtaining copies of publicly available Congressional and Executive Branch documents and reports dealing with topics of interest to Cyprus.

ATTACHMENT B

During the six-month period ending September 30, 1998, the registrant engaged in specific political activities on behalf of the Republic of Cyprus as detailed below.

Interests and policies sought to be influenced

The registrant worked with the Embassy of Cyprus to assemble a group of leading think tank specialists for a dinner hosted on May 20, 1998 by the Ambassador of Cyprus in honor of Foreign Minister Ioannis Kasoulides. At the request of the registrant, the International Relations Committee of the U.S. House of Representatives hosted a meeting with Foreign Minister Kasoulides on May 21, 1998. The registrant contacted several Committee Members (either by phone or personally) to urge them to attend the meeting. The registrant also worked with the staff of Senator Paul Sarbanes (D-MD) to arrange a meeting for Minister Kasoulides. The purpose of all of these meetings was to provide information on recent efforts to end the division of Cyprus and to urge the United States to play an active role in helping to resolve the Cyprus problem in accordance with the relevant United Nations resolutions on the subject.

At the urging of the registrant, the House International Relations Committee met on June 3, 1998 with Ambassador Richard Holbrooke, the Presidential Emissary for Cyprus. The registrant worked to ensure that key Committee Members attended the meeting and asked relevant questions about U.S. efforts to help resolve the Cyprus problem.

The registrant alerted the Embassy of Cyprus that certain Members of the House of Representatives were giving thought to imposing political conditions on the provision of foreign assistance to Cyprus. The registrant contacted several House Members in an effort to prevent the imposition of conditions. The registrant also engaged in efforts to ensure that the report accompanying the fiscal year 1999 Foreign Operations appropriations bill contained balanced language on the Cyprus problem. The registrant also engaged in efforts to ensure that the Senate would continue to take the lead in earmarking funds for Cyprus in the Foreign Operations appropriations bill.

Dr. Takis Christopoulos, the Presidential Commissioner for Human Rights, visited Washinton on July 28 and 29, 1998. The registrant set up several meetings for him with Members of Congress. Dr. Christopoulos briefed Members primarily on his work relating to the missing persons following the Turkish invasion of 1974, but he also discussed the Cyprus problem and the Cypriot government's decision to deploy air defense missiles.

The registrant set up a series of meetings with think tank specialists for the Ambassador to discuss the Cyprus problem and to urge the United States to take an active part in promoting a solution to the Cyprus problem. The registrant also met on many occasions with Members of Congress to discuss the latest developments relating to the Cyprus problem.

Means employed to achieve the registrant's objectives

The registrant contacted, in personal meetings, by telephone or by fax, Members of Congress and their personal staffs, or staff members of various House and Senate committees as indicated below, on one or more occasions each at various times during the reporting period.
