**OUALIE BEACH HOTEL, NEVIS, ANNOUNCES NEW PACKAGES,  
ADDS 10 ROOMS AND EXPANDED WATERSPORTS CENTER**

Several breaking developments and items of interest have been announced by John Yearwood, owner/operator of Oualie Beach Hotel in St. Kitts and Nevis. They include: the addition of ten rooms; an expanded watersports facility; discounts for early bookings; trade discounts for airline personnel; and two new packages for honeymooners and diving enthusiasts. Service charges and room tax are included in both packages, which are effective immediately:

Valid until December 14, 1993 the package is \$1,350. If one guest is a non-diver the combined price drops to \$975. The property, which is situated directly on the beach, has long been popular with SCUBA divers and guests who are keen about water sports of all types. It operates its own dive boats to a choice of 44 dive sites.

\* Oualie Beach broke ground earlier this month for the construction of ten additional rooms which, when complete before this summer, will raise their total to 22 rooms.

Eight of the new rooms will be deluxe, with marble vanities, air conditioning, cable TV, direct dial telephones, mahogany four-poster canopy beds, screened verandahs (facing sunset).

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The two remaining rooms are studios with full kitchens and connect to adjacent rooms to create suites.

Prior to the start of this past winter season Oualie Beach installed refrigerators in all rooms. All deluxe and studio rooms have air conditioning and cable television.

- \* New for this year is an expanded watersports center. Added to Oualie Beach's popular snorkeling and SCUBA activities guests can now enjoy Sunfish sailing and water borne Skimmer rowing machines. Carrier Employs 64-seat Super ATR

**ST. KITTS AND NEVIS ANNOUNCES THIRD FLIGHT,  
INCREASED LIFT FOR WINTER FROM AMERICAN EAGLE**

Effective December 1, the two-island Federation of St. Kitts and Nevis will have three daily roundtrip American Eagle flights between San Juan and Golden Rock International Airport. At least one of the flights will employ 64-seat Super ATR equipment, the newest aircraft in the American Eagle fleet. The move reflects an increase of 18 seats from the 46 seats presently available on ATR-42 aircraft which currently serves St. Kitts and Nevis, according to Hon. Roy Jones, St. Kitts and Nevis Minister of Tourism.

## ST. KITTS AND NEVIS DAILY AIR SERVICE FROM SAN JUAN INCLUDES TRIO OF AMERICAN EAGLE FLIGHTS

Daily airline service to the two-island federation of St. Kitts and Nevis increased by 50 percent earlier this year when American Airlines connecting sister inter-island carrier, American Eagle, put a third ATR-42 aircraft into roundtrip service between San Juan and St. Kitts and Nevis.

The southbound flight from San Juan is #5458, departing at 2:10 P.M. and arriving St. Kitts at 3:25 P.M. Northbound from St. Kitts it becomes #5459, departing at 3:45 P.M. and arriving in San Juan at 4:55 P.M.
