The law firm filed suit on behalf of the Government of Panama against former General Manuel Antonio Noriega in Federal Court in the Southern District of Florida (Miami).

The Government of the Republic of Argentina

Through December 31, 1990, the registrant represented the Republic of Argentina before Congress and various Executive Branch departments and agencies. It also rendered advice to Argentina on specific projects of interest to Argentina involving the major international financial institutions, commercial lenders in the United States and potential investors from the American private sector. The law firm advised the Government of Argentina on a wide variety of matters relating to U.S.-Argentina relations including trade issues, human rights, and potential aid programs.
