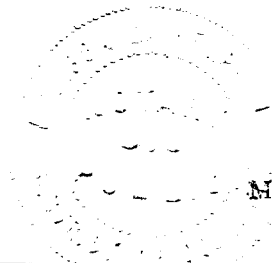



III — ACTIVITIES -- Item 11.

Taiwan Research Institute -- Various divisions of Cassidy & Associates have assisted the Taiwan Research Institute in advancing the appreciation of the ROC on Taiwan's history, culture and democratic development through contact with public officials and the media.

On behalf of Taiwan Research Institute, Cassidy & Associates has worked to promote understanding and awareness of the progress made by the democracy movement in Taiwan. In meetings with U.S. Executive Branch and Legislative Branch Officials, Cassidy & Associates personnel have expressed the message that the ROC's progress in embracing democratic principles warrants greater support from the U.S. government, including high level contacts between relevant government officials on both sides of the bilateral relationship. Specifically, Cassidy & Associates officials have:

- Met with senior members of both the House and Senate;
- Met with senior members of the State Department and National Security Council;
- Briefed journalists and commentators; and
- Pressed in selected state capitols for adoption of pro-ROC resolutions.

We have also contacted selected U.S. business organizations with interests in the ROC on Taiwan, encouraging them to push the U.S. government for a more supportive Taiwan policy.

Powell Tate provides general public relations services for the Taiwan Research Institute, a nonprofit policy research organization based in Taipei. In this capacity, Powell Tate provides TRI with ongoing strategic communications counsel; develops informational materials such as press releases and background papers; maintains a home page on the World Wide Web; communicates on a regular basis with foreign-affairs reporters and other journalists covering issues related to Taiwan, conduct outreach activities to interested third parties; and collects news reports on economic and political issues related to Taiwan.

Brazil -- U.S. Business Council -- Cassidy & Associates has been retained by the Brazil--U.S. Business Council to advise the Council on improving Brazil's standing with and understanding of and by the Legislative Branch to maintain and enhance strong and positive U.S.-Brazilian relations which benefit both nations. Cassidy & Associates has provided only advice to the Foundation during this reporting period; it has not contacted government officials.

Powell Tate was retained in June 1995 by the Royal Embassy of Saudi Arabia to provide strategic communications counsel with the goal of improving and broadening Americans' understanding of the U.S.-Saudi relationship. Services provided by Powell Tate include media relations and outreach, materials development, third-party ally development, media training, research on bilateral trade and cultural ties, and opinion research.

Avions de Transport Regional Marketing -- Powell Tate was retained in November 1994 by Avions de Transport Regional to provide strategic public affairs and communications counsel related to aircraft produced by the company and sold to the United States. Tasks have included development of fact sheets and other materials, dissemination of those materials in the United States, and ongoing liaison with U.S. media on behalf of ATR.

Electronic Industries Association of Japan (EIAJ) -- Since May 1992, Powell Tate has provided the Electronic Industries Association of Japan (EIAJ) with strategic public affairs and communications counsel regarding the organization's efforts to improve access to the Japanese market for U.S. manufacturers of semiconductors. During the reporting period, Powell Tate functioned as a point of contact with EIAJ's New York office and the U.S. media, and worked closely with EIAJ's legal advisors. In addition, during early 1995, Powell Tate worked with EIAJ to produce a booklet of fact sheets outlining the current state of the electronics and semiconductor industries in Japan, and demonstrating how those markets are changing. These fact sheets were distributed in the U.S. and Japan to members of the media, government officials, academics and other audiences.

Lucas PLC -- Powell Tate was retained in April 1994 by Lucas Industries, Inc., Reston, Virginia, a subsidiary of Lucas PLC which has its international headquarters in Solihull, West Midland, U.K. Public relations counsel is primarily related to the corporation's U.S.-based aerospace operations. Powell Tate continued to provide the following services to Lucas Industries; communications strategy, crisis management, media training, materials development, national media outreach, preparation of medial materials, and limited state and local media outreach. The contract was terminated in November, 1995.
