THE TOWN OF ST. GEORGE

A UNESCO World Heritage site, the Town of St. George is the oldest continuously occupied town of English origin in the western hemisphere. Wander down cobblestone alleys and lanes, visit historic homes and watch reenactments of Bermuda's colonial past.

CARTER HOUSE

Thought to be the oldest home in Bermuda, the Cartor House on St. David's Island was constructed in 1640 by descendants of Christopher Carter, one of the island's original settlers. The museum here features exhibits on whaling, farming and early Bermudian life.

TUCKER HOUSE

Constructed in the 1750s, the Tucker House became the home of Colonel Henry Tucker, in 1775—the same year the Colonel planned the legendary Gunpowder Plot, which helped win the American Revolution.

Transportation



Whether by bus, bike, ferry, scooter, taxi—and now a Twizy, Bermuda is safe and easy to explore.

Buses and ferries cover the island all year long and, since this is how most locals get around, they're a great way to get a taste of Bermuda's warm, welcoming culture. Rent a scooter and zip around to hidden gems, or hop on a ferry to see the island from the water as you get to where you're going.

BUSES

The island's buses are frequent, plentiful and service most areas of interest. You can't miss them—they're pink with blue stripes. The island has 11 bus routes and 14 bus zones. Most buses leave from the Central Terminal on Washington Street, next to City Hall in Hamilton. Download a copy of the bus schedule, from www.CoToBermuda.com.

FERRIES

Four public ferry routes offer a picturesque alternative for travel around the island. All ferries depart from the Ferry Terminal on Front Street in Hamilton.

TWIZY

Visitors can now explore the island by renting electric two-seat Twizy vehicles from Current Vehicles Bermuda at locations including the Hamilton Princess & Beach Club. Twizy stands for "twin" and "easy" designed by Renault's Formula One racing team and can travel up to 50 miles on a single charge. The fleet of 25 electric carts are available on a first-come, first-served basis, visitors must be 18 years and older with a valid driver's license. TAXIS

Taxis provide reliable transportation for direct point-to-point travel or by-the-hour sightseeing. Raise your hand to hail one and off you go!

SCOOTERS & BICYCLES

Motor scooters (mopeds) and pedal bikes (bicycles) are ideal for exploring the island's winding streets and for stopping in at a lay-by (a.k.a. scenic overlook) to take in the ocean views. It's a truly Bermudian way of getting around.

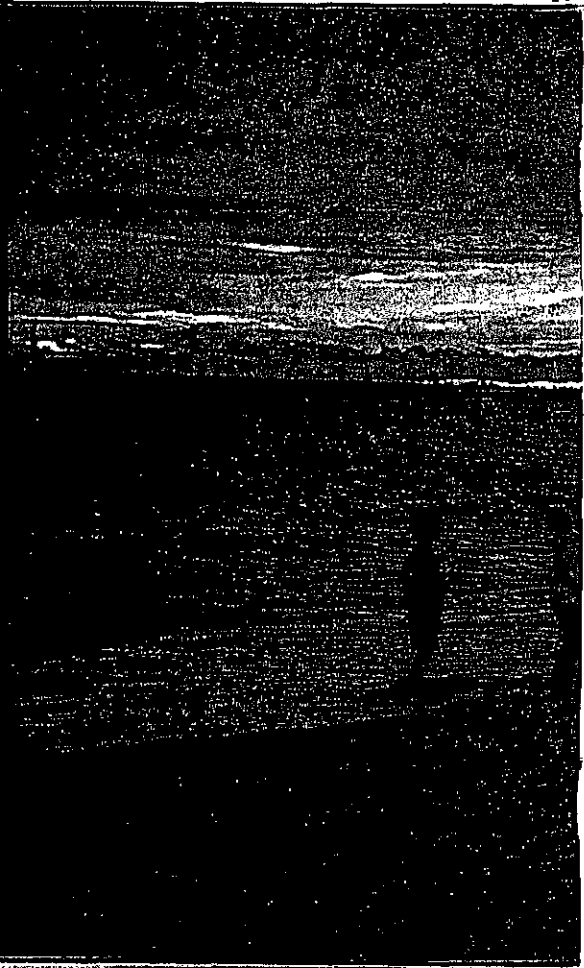

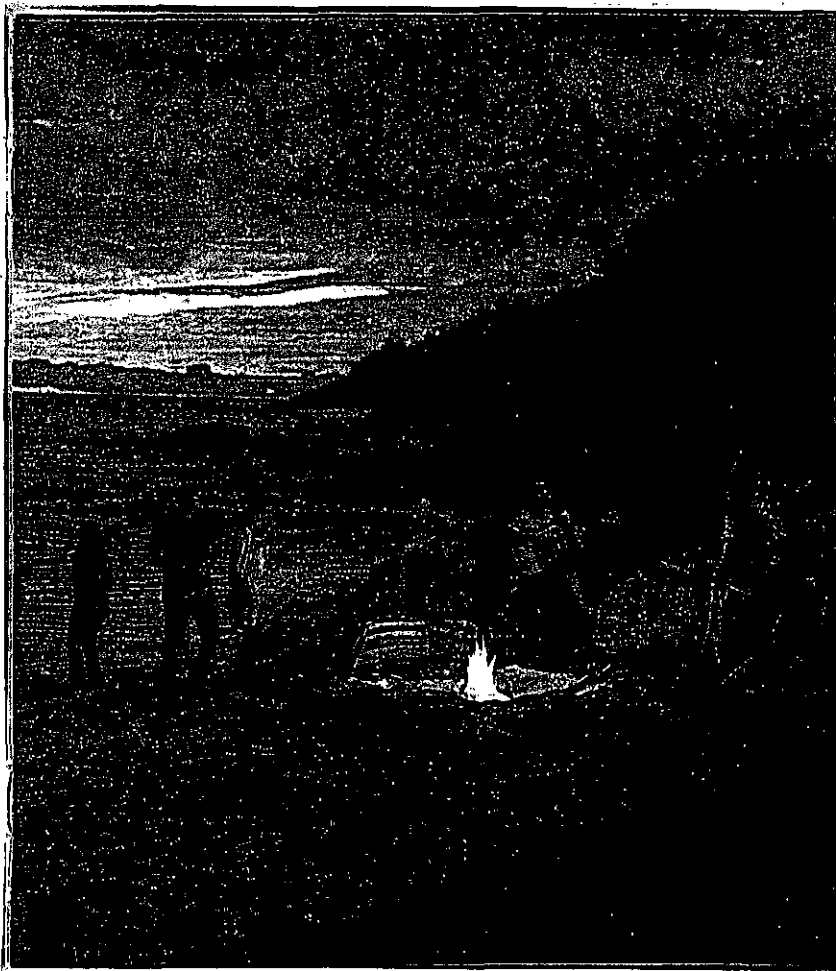

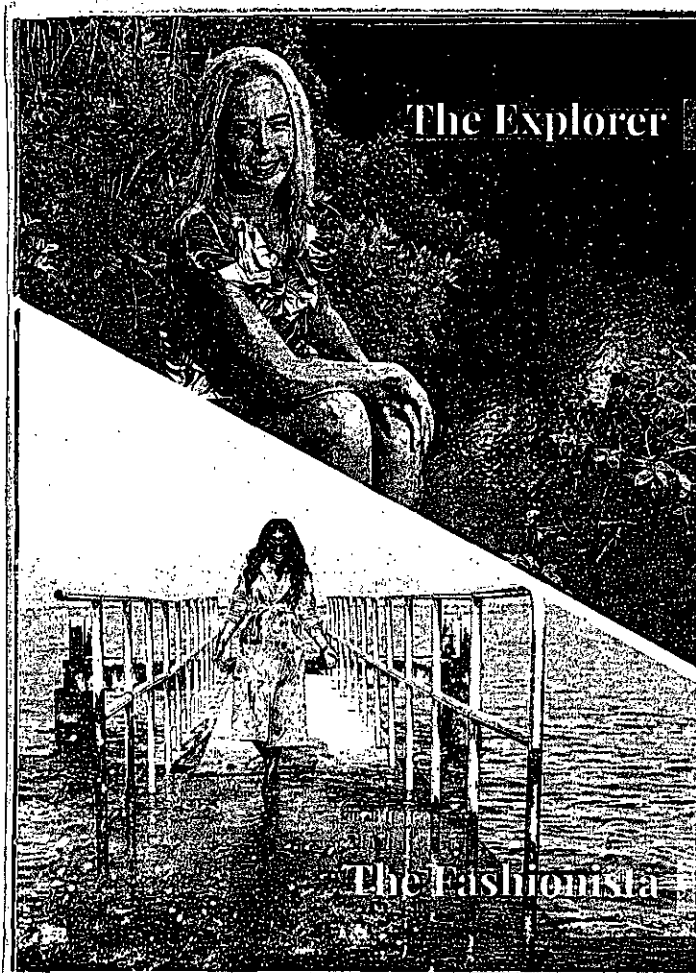

Arriving by Plane

Find daily nonstop flights from the US, Canada and the UK. Airlines providing service from the US and Canada include American Airlines, JetBlue Airways, United Airlines, Delta Air Lines, Air Canada and WestJet. British Airways provides service from the UK. Bermuda's L.F. Wade International Airport (BDA) is located at the east end of the island in St. George's Parish.

Arriving by Cruise Line

Cruise passengers are welcomed at three ports of call. Cruise lines sailing to Bermuda include Celebrity Cruises, Norwegian Cruise Line and Royal Caribbean.

Arriving by Private Vessel

Passport & Visa Requirements

All travellers must carry a valid passport as well as a return ticket to their own country or to another country. This applies to children and infants. As of March 1, 2014, entry visas and visa waivers are not required for leisure visitors, business visitors and work permit holders.

Currency & Banking

The Bermuda Dollar and US Dollar are used interchangeably. ATMs are widely available, and Visa, MasterCard and American Express cards are accepted almost everywhere.

Transportation

Public transportation is safe, convenient and carefree. Buses, mini-buses, ferries and taxis cover the island year-round. Pink buses are plentiful and frequent: get tickets, tokens or Transportation Passes, or board with exact cash. You can rent mopeds and bicycles (also called pedal bikes). We drive on the left and we drive slowly. Three scenic ferry routes connect major island hubs. Rent-A-Cars are now

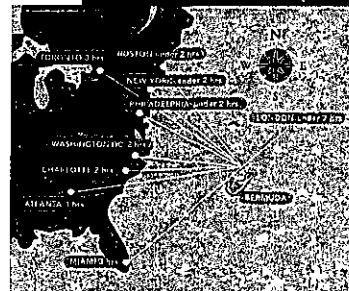

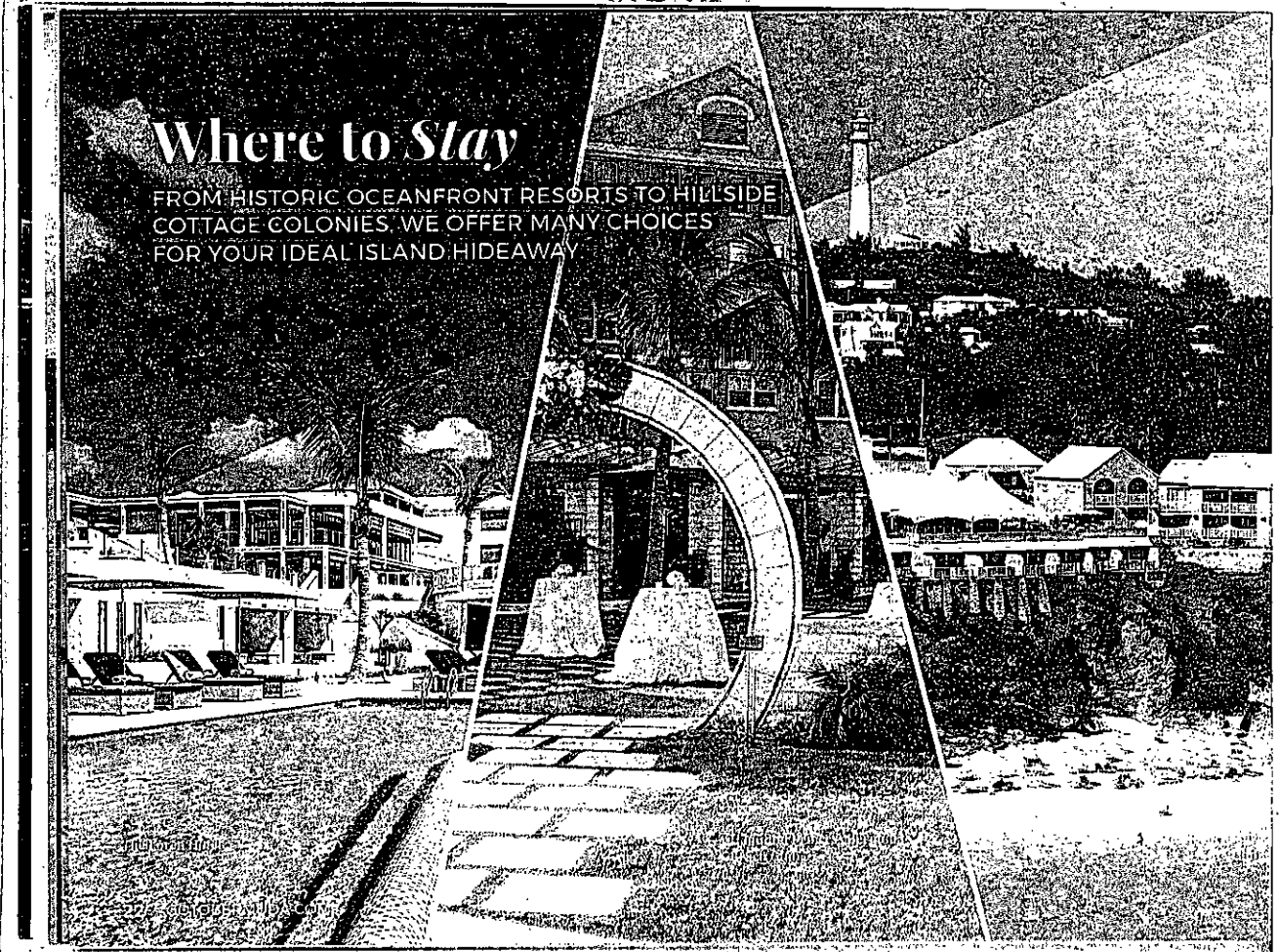


CUP MATCH

Public Buses

Regularly scheduled buses operate at frequent intervals to most of the destinations throughout Bermuda which visitors find of interest. There is a Central Bus Terminal on Washington Street in Hamilton, just off Church Street and a few steps east of the City Hall & Arts Centre. Bus stops are designated throughout the island either by pink or blue poles - solid pink inbound to the City of Hamilton, solid blue outbound from the City of Hamilton.

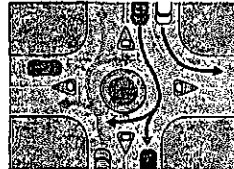
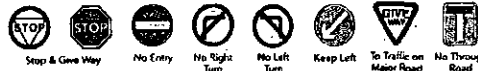
Motor Scooters

For hire at kiosks throughout the island and through your hotel or guest house - visitors must be 18 years or older to drive. Law requires all persons (driver and passenger) riding motorized cycles to wear safety helmets. It is always wise to lock cycles when not riding them.

Remember - We Drive on the Left! Pedestrian crossings are indicated by black and white zebra stripes on the road. A single yellow line denotes 'no parking'. Speed limit throughout the island is 35 kph (20 mph). Do not speed and do not keep looking behind you.

Traffic Lights in the City of Hamilton. At most intersections where there are traffic lights, pedestrians do not have the right of way on the crossing except when the green pedestrian light is showing. Pedestrian must push button on light pole for pedestrian green light. For the convenience of the blind, a bell will ring when the pedestrian light turns green. At other pedestrian crossings throughout the island (marked by zebra stripes across the road), pedestrians do have the right of way and motorized traffic must stop in deference to pedestrians.

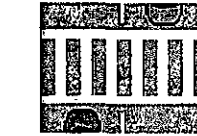
Some Important Traffic Signs



ROUNDABOUTS Traffic procedure, give way to traffic on immediate right.

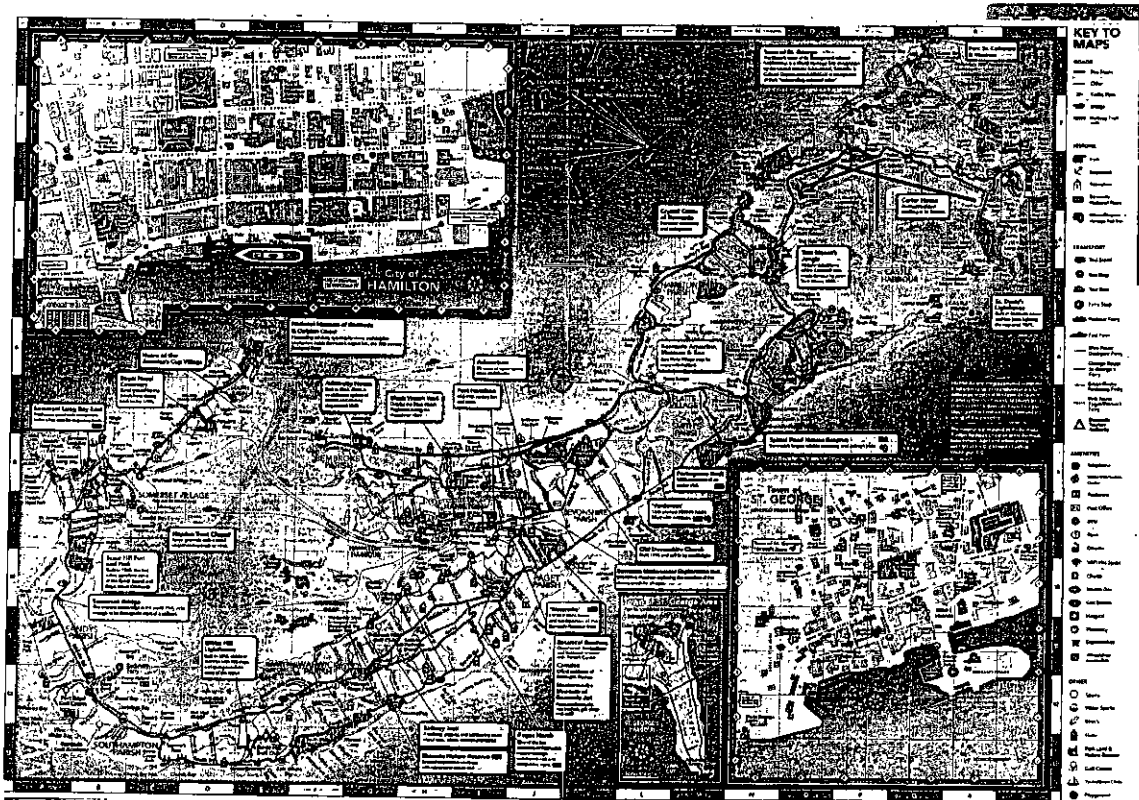


CYCLE PARKING Motor cycles are required to park in marked cycle bays.
