Arriving by Plane

Find daily nonstop flights from the US, Canada and the UK. Airlines providing service from the US and Canada include American Airlines, JetBlue Airways, United Airlines, Delta Air Lines, Air Canada and WestJet. British Airways provides service from the UK. Bermuda's L.F. Wade International Airport (BDA) is located at the east end of the island in St. George's Parish.

Arriving by Cruise Line

Cruise passengers are welcomed at three ports of call. Cruise lines sailing to Bermuda include Celebrity Cruises, Norwegian Cruise Line and Royal Caribbean.

Arriving by Private Vessel

For a smooth arrival, follow the simple clearance guidelines and extended stay requirements listed at GoToBermuda.com.

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Passport & Visa Requirements

All travellers must carry a valid passport as well as a return ticket to their own country or to another country. This applies to children and infants. As of March 1, 2014, entry visas and visa waivers are not required for leisure visitors, business visitors and work permit holders.

Currency & Banking

The Bermuda Dollar and US Dollar are used interchangeably. ATMs are widely available, and Visa, MasterCard and American Express cards are accepted almost everywhere.

Transportation

Public transportation is safe, convenient and carefree. Buses, mini-buses, ferries and taxis cover the island year-round. Pink buses are plentiful and frequent: get tickets, tokens or Transportation Passes, or board with exact cash. You can rent mopeds and bicycles (also called pedal bikes). We drive on the left and we drive slowly. Three scenic ferry routes connect major island hubs. Rent-A-Cars are now



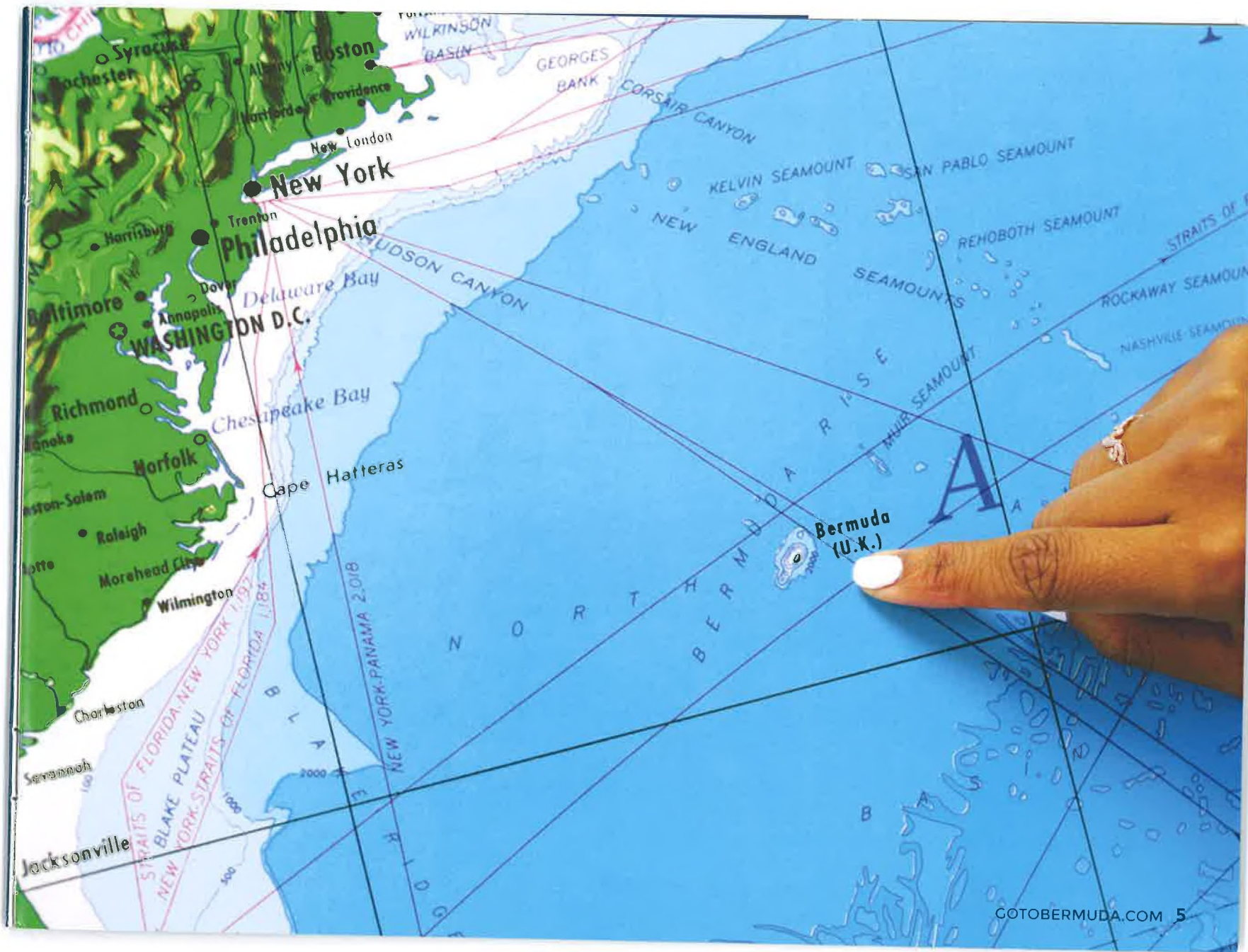
available in the form of electric two-seater called a Twizy from Current vehicles. It can travel up to 50 miles on a single charge.

DAY 1 | *St. George's & Crystal Caves*

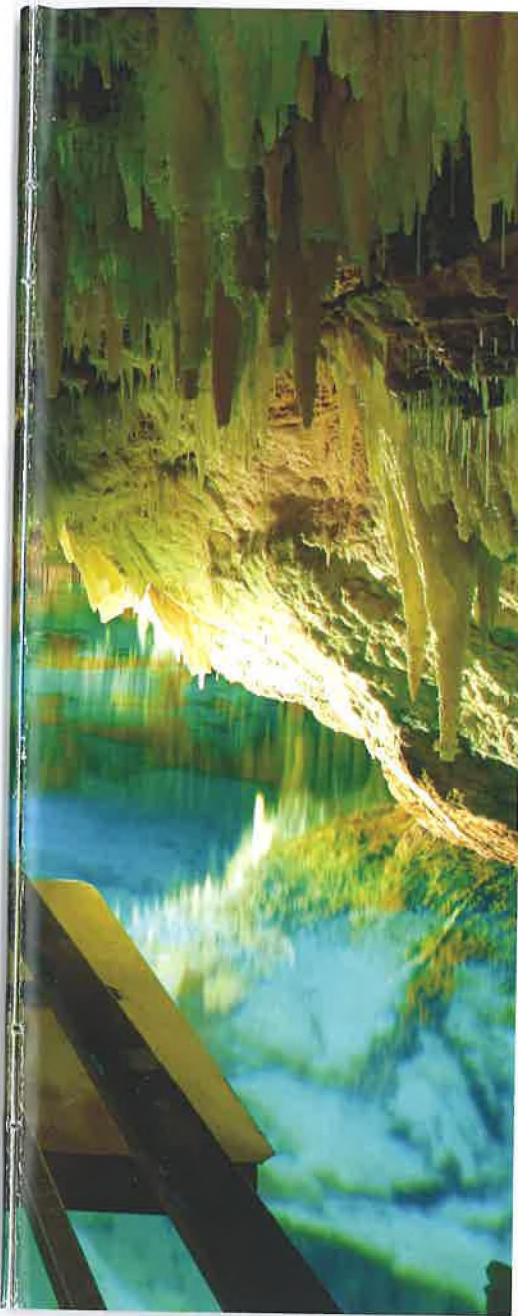
Cobblestone streets and quaint lanes crisscross the Town of St. George, which has been designated a UNESCO World Heritage site. Take a walking tour to discover historic architecture, colonial landmarks and alluring shops



and restaurants. St. Peter's Church, completed in 1612, and the Bermuda Perfumery are popular stops. Nearby, visit the sprawling Fort St. Catherine to see interesting artefacts and incredible views. Heading west, descend into Bermuda's Crystal Caves to witness otherworldly formations framing blue subterranean lakes. Cap the night with a Rum Swizzle at the iconic Swizzle Inn at Bailey's Bay, Bermuda's oldest pub.

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DAY 2 | *Hamilton & Sunset Sailing*

The City of Hamilton, Bermuda's capital, is a stylish harbour town buzzing with local and international businesses. Along Front Street, explore a pastel palette of shops, museums, galleries, restaurants and bars as you soak up the harbour breezes. Down the street at the Bermuda Underwater Exploration Institute, you can step into a shark cage and dive in a virtual submarine. Nearby, uncover more mysteries of the deep at the Bermuda Aquarium, Museum and Zoo.

Other key area attractions include The Masterworks Museum of Bermuda Art and the Bermuda Botanical Gardens. In the evening, take a sunset sail available through Island Tour Centre and relax on Bermuda's Great Sound. Then get re-energized by Front Street's dining and nightlife.



DAY 3 | *Ferry to Royal Naval Dockyard*



Start your day with a SeaExpress ferry ride to the Royal Naval Dockyard and spend the day exploring this historic fortress turned hub for shopping, dining, arts and entertainment. Get to know the island's storied maritime history at the National Museum of Bermuda, which houses cannons, shipwreck artefacts, small watercraft and artwork. Browse the colourful Bermuda Craft Market for locally made souvenirs, then shop the Clocktower Mall and Dockyard Glassworks.

At Dolphin Quest, you can touch or swim with dolphins. For more water-themed adventure, take a Jet Ski Tour with K.S. WaterSports – you'll skim by historic sites and shipwrecks, explore coves and inlets, and try to spy creatures like sea turtles and rays.

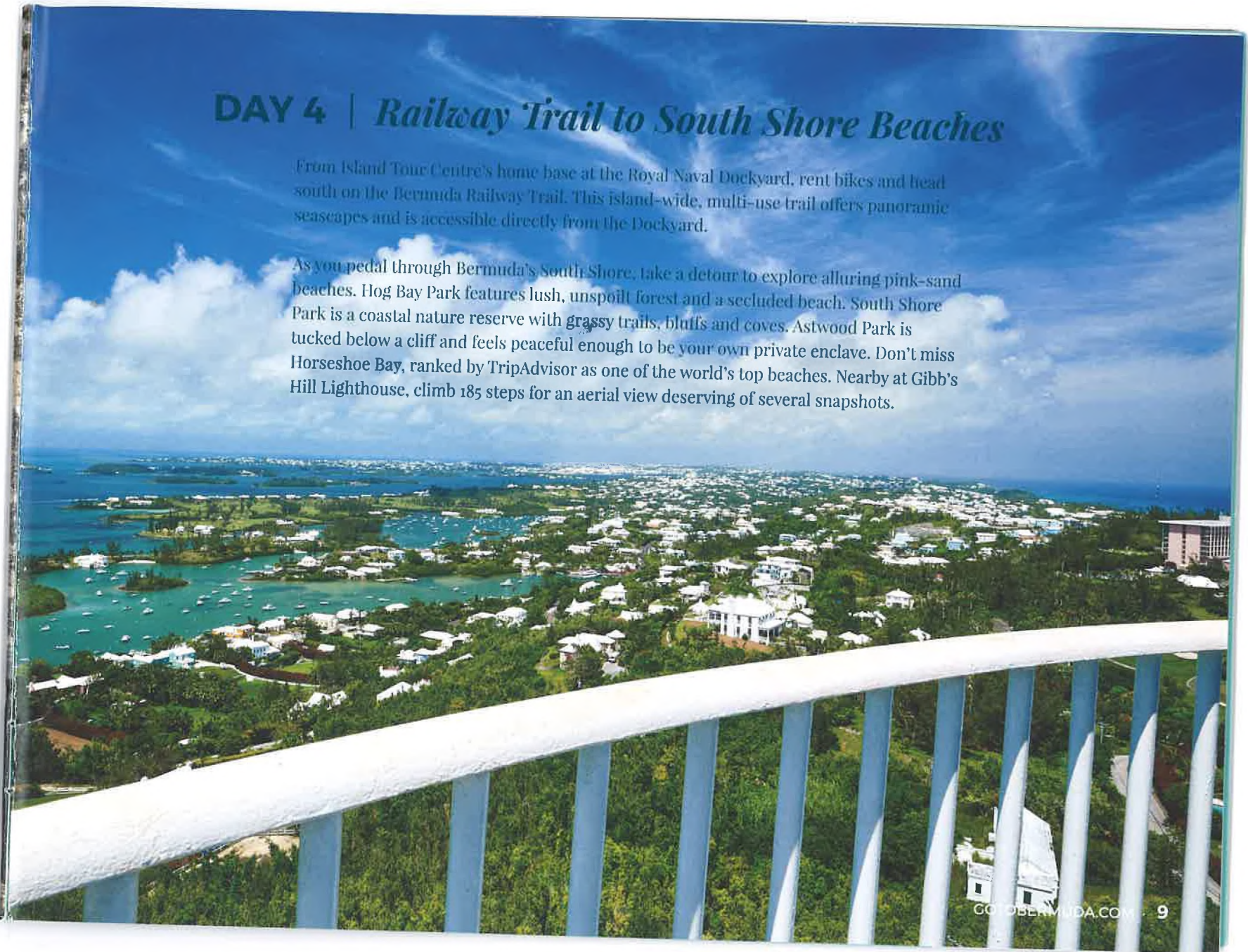
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DAY 4 | *Railway Trail to South Shore Beaches*

From Island Tour Centre's home base at the Royal Naval Dockyard, rent bikes and head south on the Bermuda Railway Trail. This island-wide, multi-use trail offers panoramic seascapes and is accessible directly from the Dockyard.

As you pedal through Bermuda's South Shore, take a detour to explore alluring pink-sand beaches. Hog Bay Park features lush, unspoilt forest and a secluded beach. South Shore Park is a coastal nature reserve with grassy trails, bluffs and coves. Astwood Park is tucked below a cliff and feels peaceful enough to be your own private enclave. Don't miss Horseshoe Bay, ranked by TripAdvisor as one of the world's top beaches. Nearby at Gibb's Hill Lighthouse, climb 185 steps for an aerial view deserving of several snapshots.

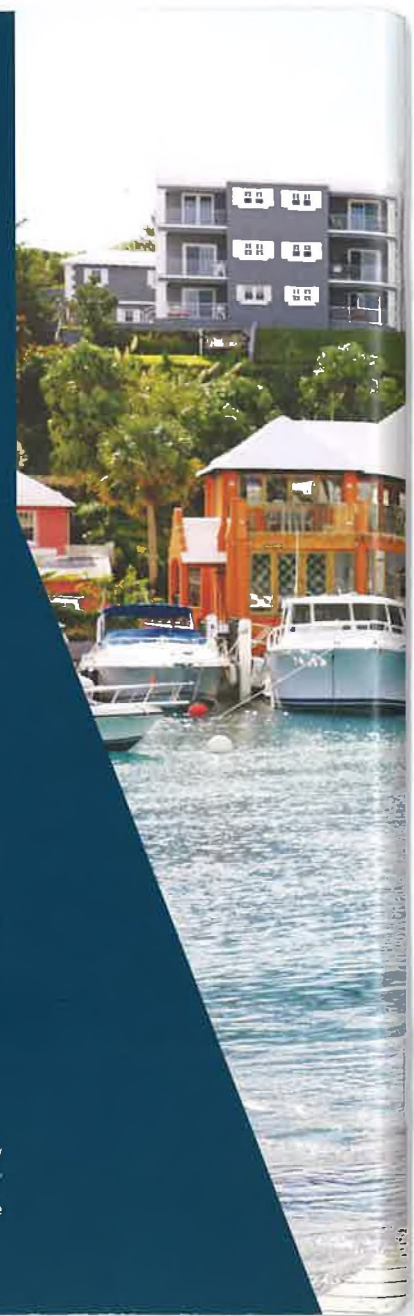

Public Buses

Regularly scheduled buses operate at frequent intervals to most of the destinations throughout Bermuda which visitors find of interest. There is a Central Bus Terminal on Washington Street in Hamilton, just off Church Street and a few steps east of the City Hall & Arts Centre. Bus stops are designated throughout the island either by pink or blue poles - solid pink inboard to the City of Hamilton; solid blue outboard from the City of Hamilton.

Motor Scooters

For hire at liveries throughout the island and through your hotel or guest house - visitors must be 18 years or older to drive. Law requires all persons (driver and passenger) riding motorised cycles to wear safety helmets. It is always wise to lock cycles when not riding them.

Remember - We Drive on the Left! Pedestrian crossings are indicated by black and white zebra stripes on the road. A single yellow line denotes 'no parking'. Do not speed and do not keep looking behind you.

Traffic Lights in the City of Hamilton. At most intersections where there are traffic lights, pedestrians do not have the right of way on the crossing except when the green pedestrian light is showing. Pedestrian must push button on light pole for pedestrian green light. For the convenience of the blind, a bell will ring when the pedestrian light turns green. At other pedestrian crossings throughout the island (marked by zebra stripes across the road), pedestrians do have the right of way and motorised traffic must stop in deference to pedestrians.

East End



The Historical Anchor

Site of the island's former capital and UNESCO World Heritage site, the Town of St. George, the East End is rich with British Colonial history and culture. You'll also discover many natural attractions, including Tom Moore's Jungle and the Crystal Caves of Bermuda.

Doreen Williams-James

Herbalist and founder of Wild Herbs and Plants of Bermuda

"St. George's is very much a historical community," said Doreen Williams-James, who hosts historical cooking demonstrations in Mitchell House's 300-year-old kitchen. "A lot of the cooking I do is based around the Jamestown Virginia era, 16th and 17th century."

Born and raised in the East End, James incorporates Bermuda's wild plants in her recipes. Her Wild Edible tours take guests foraging to learn of the "many health benefits" of the island's flora. Look out for prickly pear cactus that's in full bloom in the winter, golden nasturtiums that are high in vitamin C, purslane, scurvy grass and wild spinach.

The town is a fitting setting for reenactments, from Somers Garden, where the heart of Sir George Somers is purportedly buried, to the replica ship *The Deliverance* in Kings Square.

But her love of the East End lies with its people. "They're friendly, easy to talk with. You get the same people that sit out on the square every day. You can chat with and develop bonds with people in the community."

West End

The Maritime Mainstay

A hub for sightseeing, shopping and entertainment, the historic Royal Naval Dockyard is one of Bermuda's most popular destinations. Also in the West End, you'll find many of the renowned South Shore beaches, including Horseshoe Bay and Warwick Long Bay.

Graham Foster *Artist and sculptor*



"Everywhere you go in Bermuda, there are reminders of our amazing, multi-faceted history, from the almost sculptural 18th-century architecture, former stone quarries and railway pylons to the upturned cannons used as mooring bollards," said Graham Foster, whose mural, "Hall of History," can be viewed in the Commissioner's House, the world's first cast-iron residence.

A resident of Warwick's Witchery Lane, named for the puritanical witch trials of the 17th century, Foster spent 7,000 hours researching and painting the work. For him, inspiration is always around the corner - South Shore's towering limestone rocks, the rusty remains of 19th-century shipwrecks in Black Bay, the old Royal Naval graveyard and banyan-filled Southlands Estate, complete with crypt.

There's plenty more to explore in the Royal Naval Dockyard, from the Transport Museum to the National Museum, to the old Casemates prison, ending on Calico Jack's Floating Bar for a sundowner.

He confessed, "I became hooked on Bermuda's history and, even a decade later, am still adding to a list of things I missed out in the mural such as 1920s maypole dancing, old stone horse troughs, children hunting loquats in the trees and the little sets of stairs to nowhere which more modest ladies used to side saddle onto horses."





Central

The Island's Soul

Central Bermuda is home to the capital City of Hamilton, a harbour town known for its blend of global sophistication and local flavour. Enjoy dining, shopping, nightlife and the island's most cosmopolitan culture, and find great beaches, gardens and golf nearby.



Ed Christopher

Hamilton Town Crier

"There were no indigenous people here so we're all from different cultures. The Christophers come from St. Kitts. We all envelop that difference," said the Town Crier, whose DNA reveals roots in Benin, Côte D'Ivoire and Nigeria.

Born in Pembroke, Ed Christopher has loved watching his city evolve. Known by locals, his spirited heritage tours of the capital follow no set route as he reveals places of historical significance and pop culture along the way, ending at City Hall where guests can continue to the Arts Centre.

The former footballer, cricketer and self-described "pond dog" - he grew up in the Pond Hill area - won the National Town Crier Competition at Helmsley Castle in North Yorkshire in 2018. He has passed his ambitions to his three children: an HR director, opera singer and Broadway actor.

"As a father whose children grew up in Bermuda, this is a great place for kids to freely and safely enjoy life as young people. They're my greatest accomplishment and contribution to the world."

He continued, "We embrace visitors and each other year-round. Tooting a horn to say 'hello' rather than tooting a horn to say 'get out of the way' - that's unique to Bermuda."

Getting Around

Whether by bus, bike, ferry or taxi, Bermuda is safe and easy to explore. Public transport is a great way to get a taste of Bermuda's warm, welcoming culture. Rent a bike or Twizy and zip around to hidden gems.

Four scenic ferry routes connect major island hubs.

The blue and green routes head west; the pink stops in central Paget and Warwick; the orange operates in summer, connecting Dockyard to the Town of St. George. All depart from the Ferry Terminal on Front Street in the City of Hamilton. Cash is not accepted, so have your transportation pass, ticket or token ready.

Taxis provide transportation and sightseeing by the hour.

Many taxi drivers are also excellent tour guides, eager to share the stories behind Bermuda's landmarks for \$50-\$70 USD per hour. Find them outside larger hotels, near the airport or on busy streets.

Pink buses are plentiful and frequent.

Colour-coded stops make it easy - pink to town (Hamilton); blue to head out (east or west). Tickets, tokens or transportation passes are available at bus or ferry terminals. Or board with exact change.

Rent electric cars to explore at your leisure.

These compact two-seaters, available from Current Vehicles and Oleander Cycles, can travel up to 70 miles on a single charge.

Explore like a local on a scooter or bicycle.

We drive on the left and we drive slowly - the official speed limit is 21 miles per hour. Bikes can be rented from Elbow Beach Cycles, Eve's Cycle Livery, Oleander Cycles and Smatt's Cycle Livery.

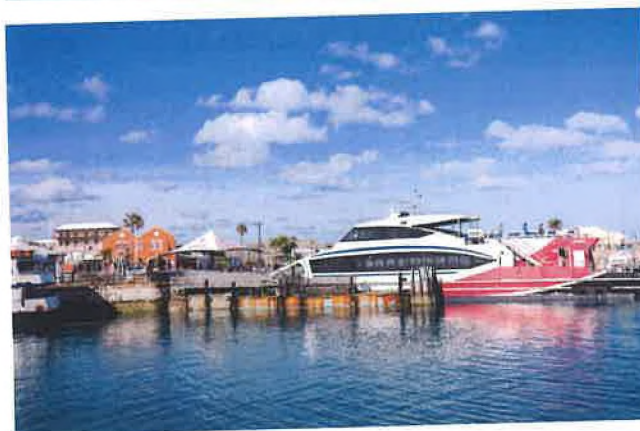

Beach *Bliss*

With cooler waters in the winter season, take advantage of the sun-filled skies by getting out on and around the ocean. From sweeping crescents of pink-flecked sand to rocky coves and colourful pebbles made of glass, there's so much to discover. Here are a few highlights.



Work Your Way from Warwick Long Bay to Horseshoe Bay, South Shore

Limestone bluffs, secluded coves and pink sand dunes – play castaways for the day as you follow grassy trails through Bermuda's prized South Shore Park, straddling Warwick and Southampton.

Explore Cooper's Island Nature Reserve, St. David's, St. George's

Composed of eight pristine beaches, Cooper's Island is a treasure trove of eco discoveries. Trek secluded nature trails teeming with flora and fauna, or relax at Combey's Bar and Restaurant.

Seek Seclusion at West Whale Bay, Southampton

Overlooking the open Atlantic from Bermuda's southwest coast, this small beach and coastal bluff provides the perfect vantage point for ocean sunsets and whale-spotting in March and April.

History & Horseback Riding from Tobacco Bay to Fort St. Catherine, St. George's

Explore the alluring beaches, turquoise Atlantic waters and historic sites of Bermuda's East End by horseback with private guided tours from Moran Meadows Bermuda Horse Trail Rides.

Pink, Blue & Green Beaches at Glass Beach, Somerset

A beautiful detour on your way to the Royal Naval Dockyard, this small beach in Black Bay is awash with colourful sea glass crafted naturally by the waves from submerged bottles. Enjoy the location, but please don't take the glass.

The Bermuda *Railway Trail*

Spanning the island from end to end, the Railway Trail follows an abandoned railbed that winds 18 miles through tranquil landscapes and rocky coastline. During winter, the trail becomes a paradise for walking, hiking and pedal biking along lush, shaded pathways; no motorized vehicles are allowed.

Cycle the West End from Dockyard to Hog Bay Park

Ride the ferry to the Royal Naval Dockyard. Adventure lovers can make a day of it by biking the six miles from rental shop Oleander Cycles in Dockyard to the ancient lime kiln and abandoned cottages at Hog Bay Park, an untouched 32 acres. Stop for pies at Baxter's, a family-run kitchen on Scott's Hill Road. Climb the hill to historic Scaur Hill Fort Park and take in views of Ely's Harbour – perfect for watching the sunset – and the Great Sound, an excellent spot to watch the sunrise. To get to Hog Bay, cross Somerset Bridge, the world's smallest working drawbridge. Check the tides; the park sits on a steep coastal hillside that slopes down to Black Bay, a small beach that becomes fully submerged during high tide.





Hike (or run) the East End from Hamilton Parish to Coney Island

Enter the trail from the foot of Crawl Hill gas station and work your way to Coney Island, where until 1871 a horse-drawn ferry connected St. George's to the mainland.

A quiet three miles, away from traffic noise, the trail reaches a high bluff overlooking the ocean. There are well-spaced benches along the trail and a dock in front of Francis Patton school where the brave can access the water via a ladder. At dusk the sea comes alive with fish visible from the bridges.

Breathe in the wild fennel, pass old slipways and protected 17th-century ruins, visit a small beach and stop by Swizzle Inn or Bailey's Bay Ice Cream Parlour across the road. Bermuda's natural caves are nearby and also well worth a visit.

Stroll

the North Shore from Devonshire to Smith's

For dramatic coastal views spanning the North Shore to Royal Naval Dockyard, enter the trail from Palmetto Road by Ocean View Golf Course for a safe three-mile walk over four bridges.

This section of the trail is edged by Bermuda's only major dairy farm before reaching a deep cut where the soft limestone was hand-carved for the narrow-gauge railway, thought to be the most expensive (per mile) railroad of its time. Peek through hedges at carefully restored old Bermuda cottages on your way to Flatt's Inlet, a shallow and sheltered beach perfect for a refreshing plunge.

On North Shore Road you can catch a bus or walk carefully along the roadside for about 10 more minutes to Flatt's Village. Here, you can pay a visit to The Bermuda Aquarium, Museum and Zoo and have lunch at a neighbourhood favourite like Village Pantry or Rustico.

Dishing on the *Destination*

Out here, one of the things that sets this island country apart (besides the fact that it's 650 miles from Cape Hatteras, North Carolina) is the warmth, pride and diversity of Bermudians. Its 65,000 residents are a welcoming, eclectic swirl of cultures — many of English, African, Caribbean, Portuguese and Native American descent. Their influences are reflected in everything from customs (proper politeness like saying good morning to *everyone*) to food, which includes a mash-up of Creole spices and proper English dishes and Portuguese donuts.

From fishcakes to rum cake, you'll taste the various ethnic influences in restaurants and markets island-wide.

Lobster season runs from September to March, a period in which you'll find the crustacean on nearly every menu, including Bella Vista Bar & Grill, LITT: Lost in the Triangle and Wahoo's Bistro & Patio. Smaller than its Maine counterpart and without claws, Bermuda's spiny lobster is known for tender, flavourful meat found mostly in the tail.

On land, Bermuda's food is equally fresh. Winter is harvest time for the island's fruit trees — from avocados to guavas, citrus and the distinct, yellow loquats. Local preserves are a great way to take home the island's offerings. Browse the farmers' market at the Bermuda Botanical Gardens on Saturdays from 8 am to 12 pm for jars of cherry and loquat chutneys and pepper jelly, a spicy-sweet versatile jam that's great in sauces, on toast and even in craft cocktails. Fresh produce, home-baked goods, Bermuda-made gifts, spiced popcorn and seasonal soups are all on the table. Then head to Devil's Isle, Marée or The Cottage Café for brunch featuring season-focused menus.

In winter, the roads are also lined with wild fennel, the perfect pairing for fresh fish. Surrounded by miles of ocean and coral reefs brimming with grouper, hogfish, wahoo and snapper, Bermuda is a fish lover's dream. You'll find a fresh catch on every daily menu. With nothing going to waste, the bones are boiled down in a classic Bermuda fish chowder enjoyed with a splash of Black Seal Rum and Outerbridge's Original Sherry Peppers.

One Bite at a Time

1 // *Art Mel's Spicy Diey*

A perennial menu staple in Bermuda, the fish sandwich is treasured island-wide. Try it at Art Mel's, an off-the-beaten-path gem. The walk-up counter shop serves deep-fried fillets of fish with tartar sauce on raisin bread. Go for "the works" and add lettuce, tomato, grilled Bermuda onions, cheese, hot sauce and coleslaw.

2 // *Woody's*

Owned by a family of fishermen, Woody's offers expertly fried snapper, wahoo and grouper with all the fixin's. Find this colourful dockside joint in Somerset on the island's West End.

3 // *OM Juicery*

This back-o'-town pressery at the corner of Elliot and Court Streets specialises in cold-pressed juices and superfood smoothies, blended in small batches from imported organic and local seasonal produce direct from Bermuda farms.

4 // *D&C Grill*

For a genuine local dinner, order from D&C's authentic jerk grill. With outposts in Devil's Hole and Southampton, their jerk chicken, pork, rice and peas are easily at hand.

5 // *Flanagan's Irish Pub & Restaurant*

On Sunday mornings, locals tuck into a hearty codfish breakfast - a heaping plate of steamed salt cod with boiled potatoes, onions, sliced bananas, a hard-boiled egg and avocado slices. It's topped with a tomato or butter onion sauce. Enjoy yours with their house-made Rum Swizzle.

6 // *Sweek Saak Bakery*

Satisfy your sweet tooth with fresh-baked cinnamon buns and gingerbread at this celebrated family-run bakery - complete with secret family recipes - in the Town of St. George.

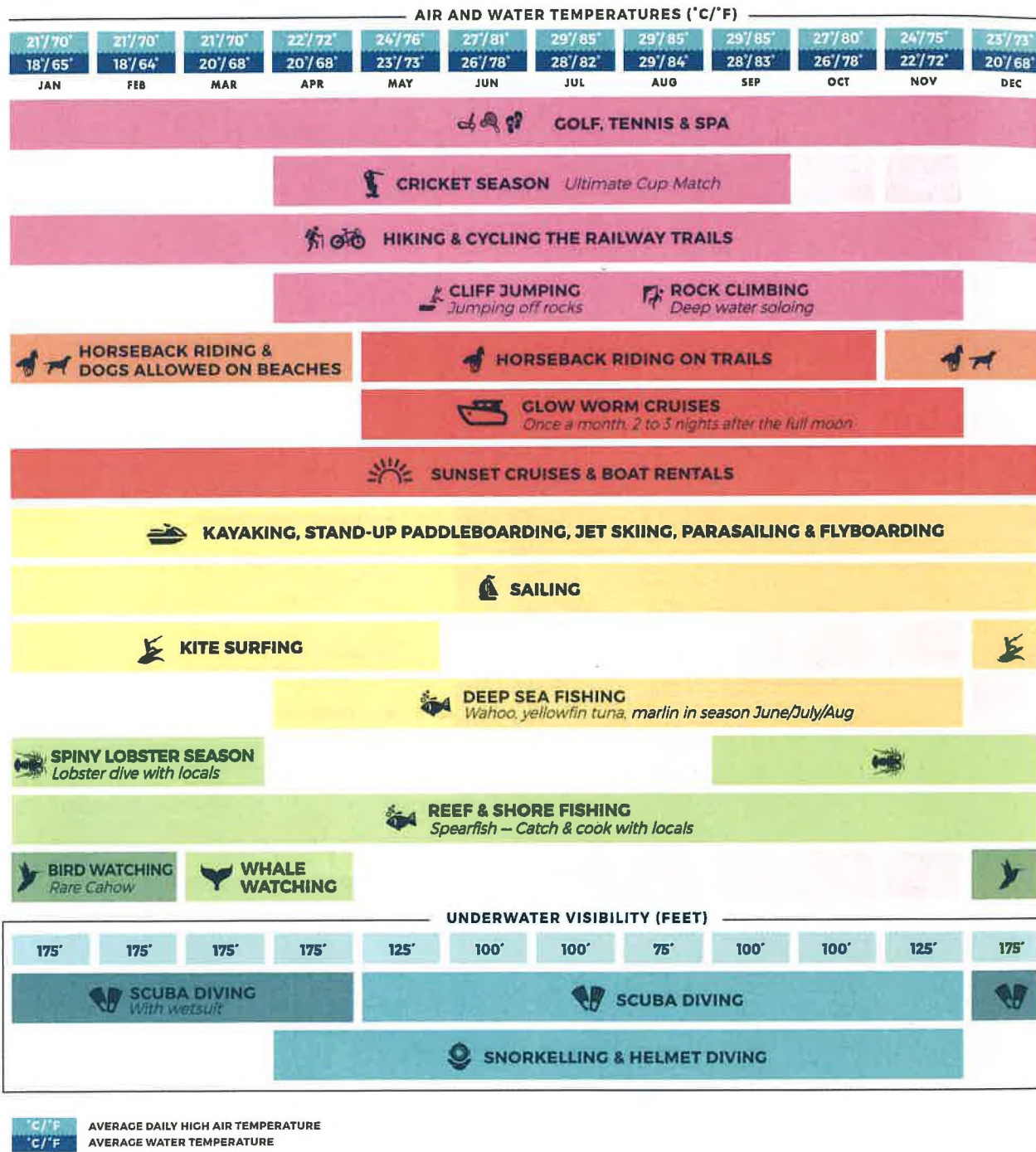

East End

The island's former capital and a UNESCO World Heritage site, the Town of St. George on the East End is rich with British Colonial history and culture. You'll also discover many natural attractions, including Tom Moore's Jungle and the Crystal Caves of Bermuda.

Explore with Tyler Simmons // Cyclist and owner of Victoire Café

Tyler Simmons opened Victoire Café last year as a hub for cyclists to commune, grab a coffee and put air in their tires. The coffee shop has fast become a favourite hangout for locals and anyone passing through.

The Vibe at Victoire Café: Situated at the end of Water Street, the modern, cosmopolitan café is framed by original cedar beams – but there's nothing dated about it.

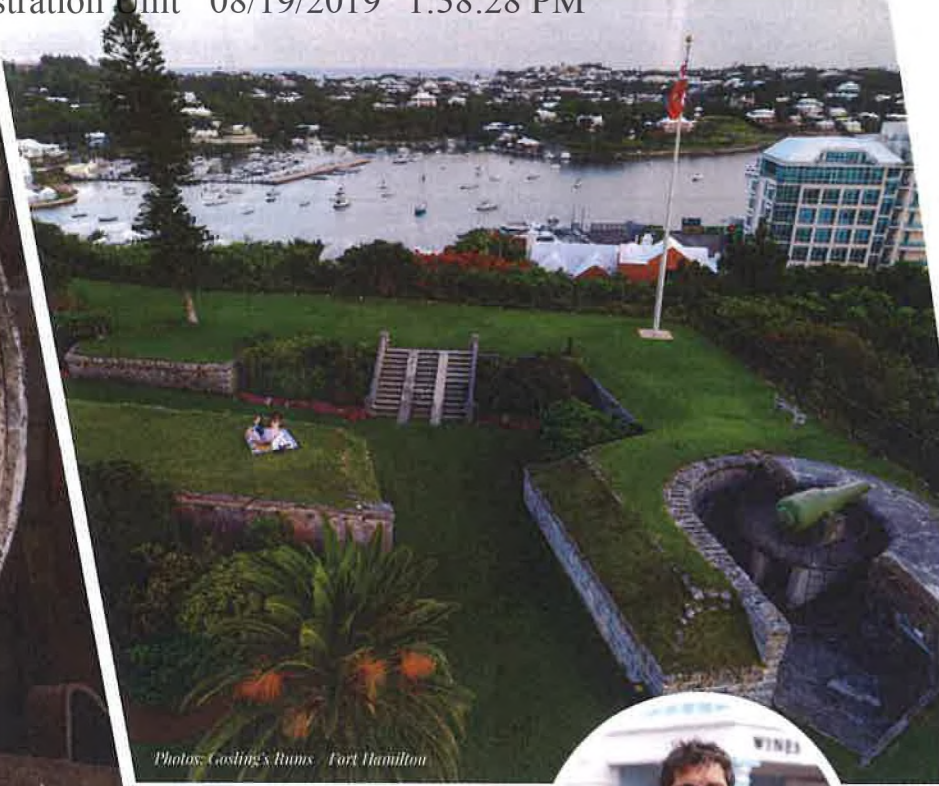
The Vibe in Town of St. George: "It's a little slower here than in Hamilton but it's charming and full of character and history," Tyler said. "People walking down the road

with bare feet and fish in their hand or carrying a bushel of flowers is commonplace."

"St. George's is like a living organism – it's its own functioning entity away from other parts of Bermuda."

Experience it Like a Local: "I enjoy discovering places that I never knew were there by turning over rocks and looking down lanes and reading the plaques on the historical homes; things that maybe go overlooked. A lot of people want to go to Tobacco Bay or Fort St. Catherine. There's so much more to see in St. George's."

Pro Tip: Rent some race bikes from Bicycle Works in Hamilton for the 13-mile ride to St. George's. Up the street, Long Story Short rents beautiful day cruisers, perfect for exploring the town.

Central

Central Bermuda is home to the cosmopolitan capital City of Hamilton, a harbour town known for its blend of first-world sophistication and local flavour. Enjoy dining, shopping, nightlife and the island's most cosmopolitan culture, and find great beaches, gardens and golf nearby.

Explore with Andrew Holmes // Brand director of Gosling's Rum, Promoter 441 Productions

As an event promoter and brand director of Gosling's Rum, Bermuda-born Andrew Holmes has a unique perspective on Hamilton, where he lives and works - and on rum.

A Legacy of Local Rum: A self-professed lover of "cocktail cruising," Holmes' passion for rum runs through everything he does - from premier music events like Cup Match Summer Splash to intimate rum dinners across the island, which showcase Black Seal Rum as well as Bermuda's food culture.

"In Bermuda, everyone knows how versatile the rum is. They use it in their fish chowder, their piña coladas, their bloody Marys - everything!"

Hamilton Haunts: Holmes begins his day with meetings at Rock Island, Devils Isle or Brew, and he frequents a legendary seafood spot.

"In Bermuda, everyone knows how versatile the rum is."

"Lobster Pot was one of my grandmother's favourite restaurants. They've updated it over the years, but

it's still maintained that charm of a 1970s seafood restaurant," he said. Sunset cocktails begin at Marcus' for a signature drink called the Royal Hamilton Yacht Club, made with Hamilton Princess Single Barrel Reserve Rum, which Gosling's makes exclusively for the hotel.

Paddle Like a Local: "One of my favourite things to do is take the kayak out for a burst around the harbour," Andrew said.

Pro Tip: "I also really love going to Harry's. They have Old Harry Rum, which is another exclusive product that Gosling's makes for the Cox family. They have nice quality ginger ale there that they serve with it - that's how Harry Cox used to enjoy it."

West End

A hub for sightseeing, shopping and entertainment, the historic Royal Naval Dockyard is one of Bermuda's most popular destinations. Also in the West End, you'll find many of the renowned South Shore Beaches including Horseshoe Bay and Warwick Long Bay.

Explore with Kim Deuss // Designer and founder, Daughters of Summer

Kim Deuss' swimwear brand, Daughters of Summer, uses high-quality Italian fabrics made from discarded marine materials like fishing nets. She grew up snorkelling and diving on the weekends.

West End's Allure: "What's so appealing about the West End is, there are so many beaches clustered together. On the South Shore the reefs are so close in to the beach, it's very accessible and very easy to go snorkelling," she said.

Stroll the Shoreline: "I love those little coves that are in between Warwick Long Bay and Horseshoe. You can either walk along the beach, or take the pathway along the coast that has really great views.

It leads you all the way to Chaplin Bay and Stonehole Bay," she said.

"I love those little coves that are in between Warwick Long Bay and Horseshoe."

Fuel Up Like a Local: An avid bruncher, she'll head to Island Cuisine in Warwick for codfish breakfast and a side of plantains before hitting the beach.

Some days she opts for rum cake in Dockyard - one of her favourites - or chocolate croissants from the Dockyard Pastry Shop, a French-style café and bakery. Lunch at beachfront restaurant Breezes at Cambridge Beaches is a must, as is a stop at The Swizzle Inn's West End outpost for its namesake beverage.

Pro Tip: "We rent paddleboards or kayaks from H2O Sports, go around the peninsula and come into Cambridge Beaches for lunch. It's a lot of fun."

Getting Around

Whether by bus, bike, ferry or taxi, Bermuda is safe and easy to explore. Public transport is a great way to get a taste of Bermuda's welcoming culture. Rent a bike or two-seater and zip around to hidden gems.

Four scenic ferry routes connect major island hubs.

The blue and green routes head west; the pink stops in central Paget and Warwick; the orange operates in summer and connects Dockyard to the Town of St. George. All depart from the Ferry Terminal on Front Street in the City of Hamilton. Cash is not accepted, so have your transportation pass, ticket or token ready.

Taxis provide transportation and sightseeing by the hour.

Many taxi drivers are also excellent tour guides, eager to share the stories behind Bermuda's landmarks for \$50-\$70 USD per hour. Find them outside larger hotels, near the airport or on busy streets.

Pink buses are plentiful and frequent.

Colour-coded stops make it easy - pink to town (Hamilton); blue to head out (east or west). Tickets, tokens or transportation passes are available at bus or ferry terminals. Or board with exact change.

Explore like a local on a scooter or bicycle.

We drive on the left and we drive slowly - the official speed limit is 21 miles per hour. Bikes can be rented from Elbow Beach Cycles, Eve's Cycle Livery, Oleander Cycles and Smatt's Cycle Livery.

Rent electric cars to explore at your leisure.

These compact two-seaters, available from Current Vehicles, Oleander Cycles and Localmotion, can travel up to 70 miles on a single charge.

MORNING // A PRIVATE BERMUDIAN BRUNCH

Wake up and get on Winnow – the app provides boutique experiences for an insider’s look at the island. Get fuelled for the day with a traditional codfish breakfast on the terrace at the Ledgelets Cottage Colony, and try raw honey straight from their hive.

Active Exploring

EARLY MORNING // SOUTH SHORE
The heat of the sun peaks early in the summer, which means you’ll be up even earlier to run along the sandy trails that extend from Warwick Long Bay to Horseshoe Bay Beach. Once you’ve worked up a sweat, fling yourself into the ocean for a refreshing dip. For an added challenge: climb the rocks and jump feet first into the deep surf below.



Indulgent Retreat



MORNING // BREAKFAST AT HUCKLEBERRY

Start the day with breakfast at Huckleberry, named in tribute to Mark Twain, who loved Bermuda. The front porch is a throwback to Twain’s day, a setting that matches the Southern-inspired menu.

Family Adventure

MORNING // HORSESHOE BAY COVE

Perfect for kids who want to splash and wade *and* for parents who want peace of mind, this calm bay on the western end of the beach is situated right by Rum Bum Beach Bar, where you’ll find beach rentals, hot food and cold drinks.

AFTERNOON // JET SKI & CLIFF JUMPING SAFARI

Now you're hooked. Book with KS Watersports and make your way past shipwrecks, coves and coral reefs to Diving Board island in Paradise lakes. To test your courage, there are three heights from which to jump from, including a wooden platform that requires a running start.



EVENING // DINNER AT MICKEY'S BISTRO ON THE BEACH

Wind down with fresh fish at this Italian-Bermudian restaurant on Elbow Beach. After dinner, head upstairs to Sea Breeze, a patio lounge for cocktails and dancing.



AFTERNOON // SAIL MANGROVE BAY

Rent a Hobie Wave Catamaran, a sailboat fit for two, from H2O Watersports and navigate the gorgeous surroundings of Mangrove Bay. Anchor at a secluded island beach for a picnic lunch.



DINNER // 1609 AT THE HAMILTON PRINCESS

Enjoy dinner and a hand-shaken Piña Colada, Princess Mule or signature Sangria at 1609, a crowd's nest-style restaurant with stunning views over Hamilton Harbour and the marina.

AFTERNOON // FLOATING WATER PARK

Catch the No. 7 bus westbound to X2O Adventures at Daniel's Head for a taste of a classic Bermuda raft-up with inflatable slides, bouncers and more obstacles for all ages.



EVENING // SUNSET FUN GOLF

Hop back on the bus - No. 7 or 8 - to the Royal Naval Dockyard. Find Nannini Haagen Dazs, a family-owned ice cream parlour in Clocktower Mall, that features all your favourite flavours. Walk to Snorkel Park Beach to play iconic holes in miniature at Bermuda Fun Golf. The 19th hole is a casual restaurant and bar with unbelievable sunset views over the West End.



Beach *Bliss*

When temperatures peak and Bermuda's waters are warmed by the upward flow of the Gulf Stream, summer is truly beach season. While popular spots such as Horseshoe Bay and Elbow Beach provide ample amenities for a great day at the beach, with 75 miles of dramatic coastline, you can escape the crowds at some of the island's lesser-travelled bays.



Seek seclusion at West Whale Bay, Southampton

A small beach with tremendous allure, this secluded bay and coastal bluff provides the perfect setting for romantic picnics – and vantage point for sunsets.

Find serenity at Warwick Long Bay, South Shore

It's hard to believe you get so much of it to yourself, but Bermuda's longest shoreline offers an idyllic stretch of sand for sunbathing and swimming that's far from the masses thanks to its deep waters and a backdrop of steep shrubland.

Experience wild Bermuda at Southlands Beach, South Shore

A stone's throw from Swizzle Inn's South Shore outpost, the overgrown entrance to this wild and tranquil beach can be found opposite the tangled Banyan tree grove of the Southlands estate.

Swim with colourful creatures at Church Bay, Southampton

The only crowds you'll find here are the abundant angelfish and parrotfish. This bay is a snorkeller's paradise thanks to a network of shallow reefs that nurture marine life while sheltering swimmers from ocean waves.

Explore Cooper's Island Nature Reserve, St. David's, St George's

Composed of eight pristine beaches, it is a treasure trove of eco discoveries and rare quietude. For decades, it was off limits, occupied by the U.S. military before opening to the public in 2011.

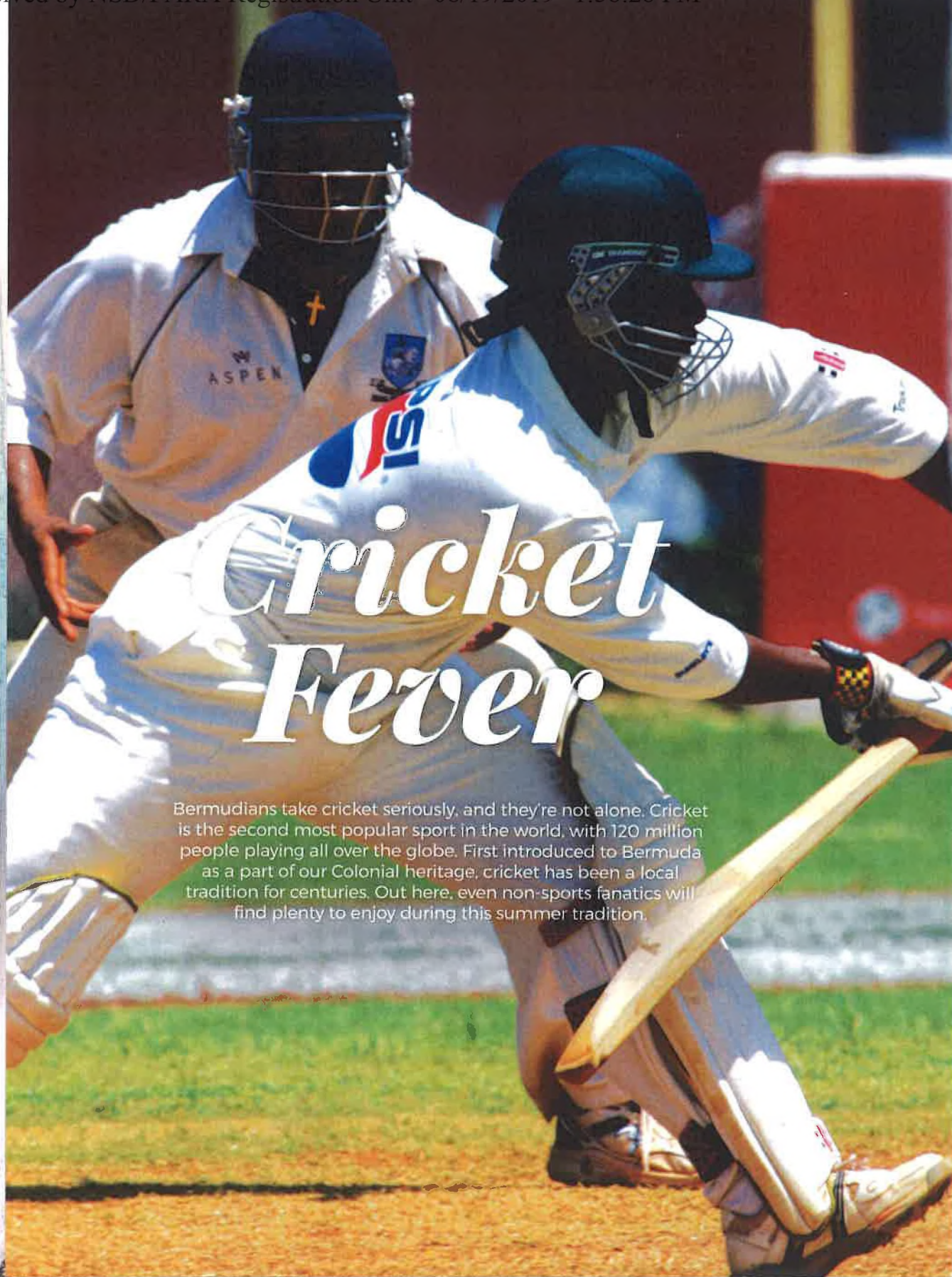

Cricket Fever

Bermudians take cricket seriously, and they're not alone. Cricket is the second most popular sport in the world, with 120 million people playing all over the globe. First introduced to Bermuda as a part of our Colonial heritage, cricket has been a local tradition for centuries. Out here, even non-sports fanatics will find plenty to enjoy during this summer tradition.



The Rules

The Laws of Cricket

Similar to American baseball, the game is played with a bat and ball on a large field. Two teams face off with the object of the game being getting the opposing team's players "out" and scoring points for your own team while at bat. And while there are many similarities to America's pastime, the game of cricket can seem a lot more complicated to the uninitiated. Don't worry if you don't get it, though. The match is important, but it's about much more than just cricket. Out here, some things are better experienced than explained.

Cup Match

August 1-2

The biggest event on Bermuda's calendar, Cup Match, is centred on a fierce Bermuda cricket rivalry between East and West, St. George's and Somerset. But it is also a chance to recognise one of the most significant moments in Bermuda's history: the abolition of slavery on the island in 1834. Emancipation Day coincides with the first day of Cup Match, a Thursday, and is followed by a second public holiday, which commemorates the Admiral Sir George Somers, whose shipwreck in 1609 led to the British colonisation of the island. Local cuisine is an integral part of the festival atmosphere. Try fried fish, conch, mussel and beef pies. Families will stake out their "camps" at the match grounds. If you're lucky enough to be invited, you'll find that each carries its own infectious, unforgettable festival spirit. At the game, fashions are coordinated around team colours - red and dark blue for Somerset, light blue and dark blue for St. George's - so pick a side!

The County Games

July 20 - August 31

These games are an insider's glimpse into Bermuda's local community. Visitors can enjoy a real taste of the warmth and spirit of local culture. Rival parishes compete on Saturdays and Sundays during the summer, and the games are whole-day, tailgate-style affairs with island festivities, Crown and Anchor and local cuisine. Three Eastern County games are held to name a champion. The first is held two weeks before Cup Match, then the rest follow two subsequent fortnights after Cup Match at Lords, St. David's Cricket Club field. The first is July 20, when St. David's Cricket Club plays Bailey's Bay Cricket Club. The second is August 17, when the winner of the first game will play Cleveland County Cricket Club. On August 31, the winner of the second game will play Flatts Victoria Recreation Club. Tickets are \$5 to \$15 and available at the game.

Crown & Anchor

A Game of Chance

Cricket isn't the only game played at a match. You can try your luck at Crown and Anchor, a simple dice game that was traditionally played by sailors in the Royal Navy. A fun and easy way to make a little tax-free spending money, it is a game of chance. To play: The table is divided into six sections, each marked with a crown, an anchor, a diamond, a club, a heart or a spade. Three dice are marked with the same. Players then place their bets on the symbols that they think will come up when the dice are rolled. Depending on which symbols come up - and how many - you can win up to three times the amount of your bet. If the symbol you bet on does not come up, you lose. Simple.

Keeping it Cool: *Icy Treats with an Island Twist*

With long, hot days filled with adventure, you might find yourself awe-struck, enthralled and just a little bit parched. There's no need to halt the fun and head back to your hotel room. From handmade popsicles and snow cones to frozen yoghurts and sundaes stacked with local flavours, these icy treats will cool you from the inside out.



Snow Cones at Snowy's, Church Street, City of Hamilton

A combo of shaved ice and sweet syrup, a classic Bermuda snow cone will take your temperature down a degree while providing a jolt of energy. Can't decide which of the 40 flavours is for you? Go for a *Round de World*, a local mix that swirls all the options into one.

Alex & Pete's Artisan Ice Cream, Royal Naval Dockyard

Head to this gazebo at Royal Naval Dockyard for homemade flavours such as Rum Swizzle, Rum and Ginger and a classic Pineapple Sherbet, revived from an old Bermuda recipe beloved by locals.

Ashley's Lemonade, Reid Street, City of Hamilton

This family-owned fresh-squeezed lemonade stand is a favourite refresher at every cricket match, festival and community event. Try their frozen version for extra sweet-and-sour thirst-quenching power. When in the East End, visit their newest location on King's Square in St. George's.

Duch Pops, Royal Naval Dockyard

These gourmet fresh fruit popsicles, sweetened with agave, are not only delicious but stunning to behold. Their signature pop is a colourful blend of mixed berries, pineapple, kiwi, peach and mango, while the Whistling Frog blends cucumber and lemon.

Yo Cherry, Town of St. George

With branches in St. George's and the City of Hamilton, this frozen yoghurt shop features an array of toppings that go well beyond the usual. Season-focused flavours include Bermuda Sweetcorn, Gingered Beets and Avocado-Cinnamon-Honey.

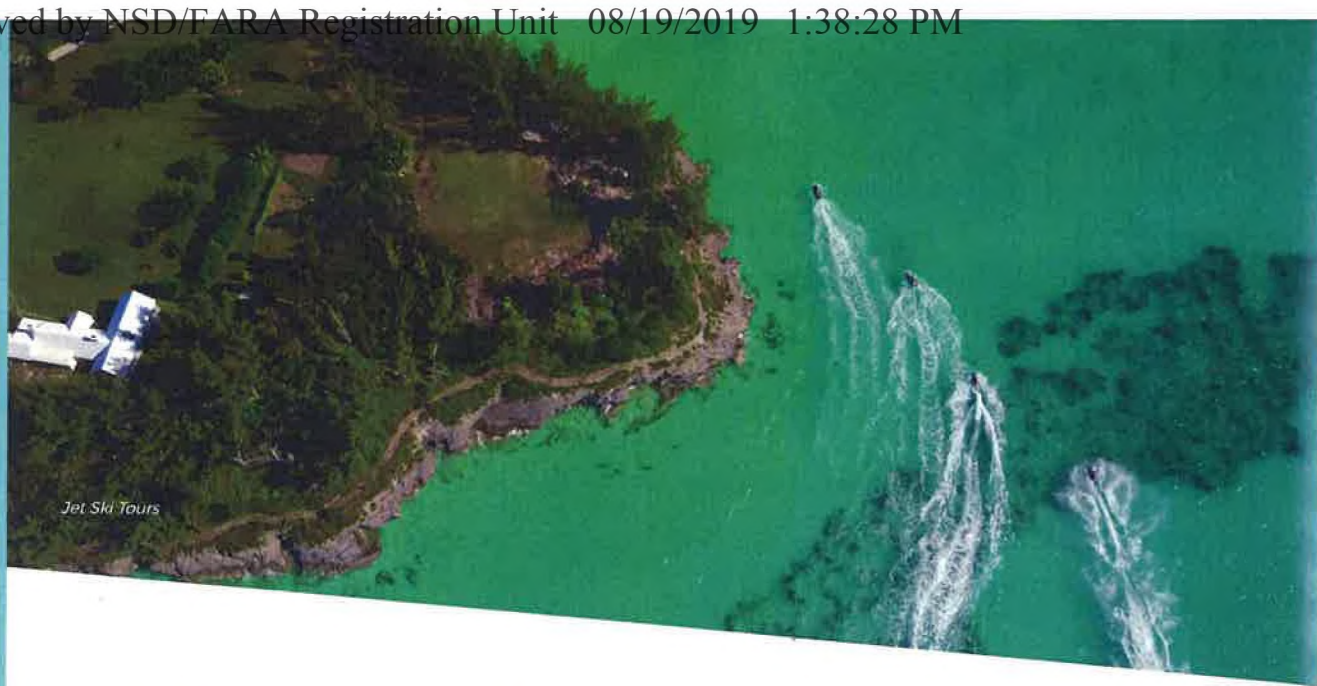

Dishing on the Destination

Out here, one of the things that sets this island country apart (besides the fact that it's 650 miles from Cape Hatteras, North Carolina) is the warmth, pride, and diversity of Bermudians. Its 65,000 residents are a welcoming, eclectic swirl of cultures - many of English, African, Caribbean, Portuguese and Native American descent. Their influences are reflected in everything from customs (proper politeness like saying good morning to *everyone*) to food, which includes everything from a mashup of Creole spices and proper English dishes to Portuguese donuts.

From fisheakes to rum cake, you'll taste the various ethnic influences in restaurants and markets island-wide.

With 75 miles of stunning coastline, you're never far from the ocean. A fish lover's dream, the seas are brimming with grouper, hogfish, wahoo and snapper.

With their striking orange and black quills, lionfish look like a typical tropical fish, but they cause major damage to reef and prey on other fish in our seas. The Groundswell Lionfish Tournament encourages locals and visitors to catch this invasive species and have them cooked up by professional chefs at a fun festival with live music on July 29th at Bermuda Institute of Ocean Sciences. A rallying cry, *eat 'em to beat 'em*, encourages creativity in preparing this venomous white fish - from bright ceviche to Baja-style fish tacos. If you're lucky, you'll find them on the menu at Marcus' or on ice at Miles Market. Bermuda's answer to Dean & Deluca.

If there's a quintessential Bermuda dish, however, it's fish chowder, an aromatic blend of seafood and spice that often includes potatoes, tomatoes, onions, carrots, green peppers and celery. Every recipe is slightly different, but the one thing they all share is the island's own Outerbridge's Original Sherry Peppers and a splash of Black Seal Rum.

Summer is a fragrant time on the island. White flowers bloom and the gardens are a carnival of jasmine, frangipani, honeysuckle and gardenias. The trails are covered with lantana, a kind of local sage, thick rosemary and wild fennel - the perfect pairing for fresh fish. Local corn is in season, as are juicy Bermuda strawberries. Browse the markets at Wadson's or Windybank Farms for jars of local preserves and chutney, fresh produce, home-baked goods and Bermuda honey. Head to Village Pantry, Marée or Huckleberry for season-focused, farm-to-table menus.

On Sunday mornings, locals tuck into a hearty codfish breakfast - a heaping plate of steamed salt cod with boiled potatoes, onions, sliced bananas, a hard-boiled egg and avocado slices. It's topped with a tomato or butter onion sauce. Bouchée, Paraquet and Speciality Inn are good bets.



Catch of the Day

Abundant marine life and optimal fishing conditions mean the daily catch is a staple on menus island-wide. Restaurants such as Marcus', Island Brasserie and Bella Vista pride themselves on their close links with local fishermen and their artistry in preparing fresh fish with Bermudian flair. But more than culinary savoir-faire, seafood is a cultural cornerstone out here. Here are a few ways to enjoy the island's fresh fish:

Woody's

Owned by a family of fishermen, this colourful dockside joint in Somerset offers beloved menu items like expertly fried snapper, wahoo or grouper with all the fixings. A perennial menu staple in Bermuda, the fish sandwich is as good as it gets. Deep-fried fillets of fish with tartar sauce and coleslaw on raisin bread are best washed down with a cold Dark 'n Stormy.

Catch and Cook

Baxter's Reef Fishing offers fishing day excursions on nearshore reefs aboard the *Ellen B*, a comfortable, 32-foot fishing boat that takes six passengers. Captain Baxter and his sons provide everything you need, from rods and reels to bait. At the end of the day, they'll clean, fillet and pack your fish so you can cook it yourself or take it to a local restaurant for the chef to prepare.

Dine In

Cook up a feast in your vacation rental home after a trip to M Soares & Son, a family-owned grocery in Spanish Point with a focus on fresh Bermuda fish. The fisherman's daily haul can be anything from yellowfin tuna and wahoo to mahi mahi and red hind. Find unusual offerings like locally made rockfish sausages.

Lost in the Triangle

Known locally as LITT, this Reid Street gem and local favourite is owned by fisherman Delvin Bean. Fresh fish is the focus of its casual but imaginative menu. The day's catch is infused with Gosling's Black Seal Rum.

Rustico

Another water enthusiast, owner Odilio Angeli features fresh, Italian-style seafood at this Flatts Village mainstay. Find the same attentive treatment at his sister restaurant, Gulf Stream, by Horseshoe Bay.

East End

The Historical Anchor

A UNESCO World Heritage site formerly home to the island's capital, the Town of St. George on the East End is rich with British Colonial history and culture. You'll also discover many natural attractions, including Tom Moore's Jungle and the Crystal Caves of Bermuda.

"I have always loved St. George's. It's just a beautiful place," said Nike Bada, who opened Merch in December 2017 on the day of the annual National Trust Christmas Walkabout. The tiny boutique, which can also be shopped online, showcases local brands and design-focused, global finds - a mix of books, jewellery, accessories and apparel - in a space built in the 1700s.

"That's what drew me to the location in the first place: I love the juxtaposition of having something quite modern inside in a very historic setting," she said.

The shop sits at the edge of King's Square, the focal point for much of the activity and events, including the Portuguese Festival and the Peppercorn Ceremony. Bada has created a handy map of the area, that marks Instagrammable locations and must-see sights, including the Unfinished Church, Pilot Darrell's House, the Tucker House Museum and the St. George's Historical Society - and its 17th-Century printing press.

"It's amazing to think a machine that old is still being used," she says. "You can't beat the atmosphere in St. George's. You're steeped in history. You walk the cobbled streets and it's like you've gone back hundreds of years. There's no other place like it."

"The best is in the west," said Tom Wadson of his fortunate position on Luke's Pond Road. "Whale Bay is three minutes away. My boat is on the other side in a protected bay. I can walk over there in 10 minutes."

Following a childhood dream, he became a farmer in the fall of 1976 and now has more than 2,500 chickens and turkeys as well as some Bermuda hogs on 40 acres. The shop attracts many visitors looking for fresh, local food and farm tours can be arranged by appointment.

There's so much more contact now between the food and the people. That's so important," he said. An advocate for fertilizer-free, clean and natural farming methods on the island, he never tires of Bermuda's profound natural beauty.

"I spend a lot of time in a lot of open space. I love the ocean, I love the land and I'm very passionate about what I do. Of all the places I've ever been, Bermuda is my favourite. To be able to farm in a place like this and to live in a place like this - I'm not interested in going anywhere else," he said.

"Why travel? We're already there."

"Hamilton has a broad range of things. You've got good food, interesting art and shops sourcing interesting and unique things. If you can't find something to do, then you're not looking particularly hard," said Peter Lapsley.

The artist spends his days in the capital since moving back from New York. In a short time, he opened & Partners, a gift and design store, and took on a leadership role at The Bermuda National Gallery, sharing its mission to bring in international artists and artworks while supporting the development of local artists.

"It's a great piece to the local arts puzzle," he said of the gallery. "We have our historical collections, but also contemporary works - local artists making work now."

With six shows a year alongside its permanent collections, the gallery invites art lovers to see up to three different exhibitions in one visit and then wander upstairs to the Bermuda Society of Arts. With the Bermuda Musical & Dramatical Society and commercial Gallery 117, Hamilton makes a great destination for visitors interested in the arts.

"You can see a print by Andy Warhol, a sculpture by KAWS, a painting by Gainsborough, as well as contemporary artists making work in Bermuda now," he said.

"Go to Marcus, have lunch, then wander round and see the impressive collection at Hamilton Princess."

Getting Around

Whether by bus, bike, ferry or taxi, Bermuda is safe and easy to explore. Public transport is a great way to get a taste of Bermuda's welcoming culture. Rent a bike or two-seater and zip around to hidden gems.

Four scenic ferry routes connect major island hubs.

The blue and green routes head west; the pink stops in central Paget and Warwick; the orange operates in summer and connects Dockyard to the Town of St. George. All depart from the Ferry Terminal on Front Street in the City of Hamilton. Cash is not accepted, so have your transportation pass, ticket or token ready.

Taxis provide transportation and sightseeing by the hour.

Many taxi drivers are also excellent tour guides, eager to share the stories behind Bermuda's landmarks for \$50-\$70 USD per hour. Find them outside larger hotels, near the airport or on busy streets.

Pink buses are plentiful and frequent.

Colour-coded stops make it easy - pink to town (Hamilton), blue to head out (east or west). Tickets, tokens or transportation passes are available at bus or ferry terminals. Or board with exact change.

Rent electric cars to explore at your leisure.

These compact two-seaters, available from Current Vehicles and Oleander Cycles, can travel up to 70 miles on a single charge.

Explore like a local on a scooter or bicycle.

We drive on the left and we drive slowly - the official speed limit is 21 miles per hour. Bikes can be rented from Elbow Beach Cycles, Eve's Cycle Livery, Oleander Cycles and Smatt's Cycle Livery.

Order this unmissable meal on raisin bread with coleslaw, tartar sauce and hot sauce, and take it to Admiralty House Park, a secluded reserve near Spanish Point, home to ruins of a grand home for admirals in the British Royal Navy. 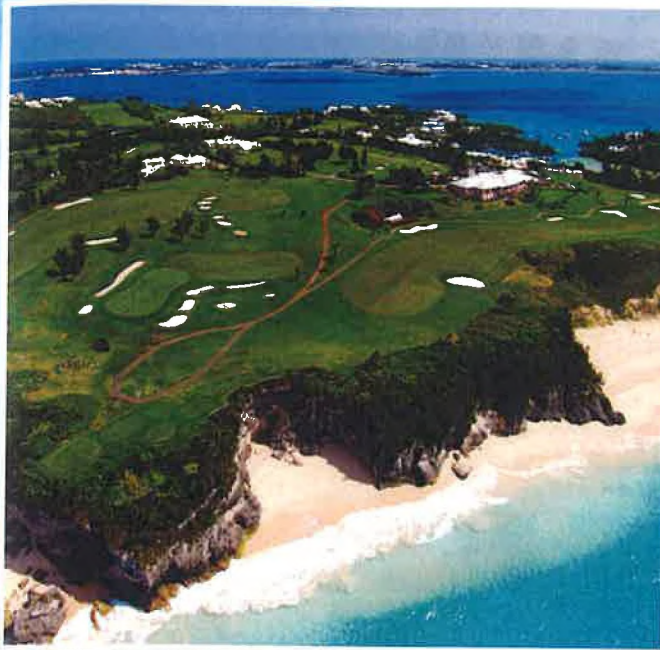

Right on Course: *A New Bermuda Triangle*

Founded by shipwrecked sailors, Bermuda's maritime history is woven into the very fabric of the island. Four centuries later, the island remains a top sailing destination thanks to its ideal weather, calm, clear waters and unbreakable ties with the international sailing community. This spring, Bermuda joins forces with New York and Newport to create a new Bermuda Triangle of sailing, luxury and lifestyle with premier sailing events that beckon sailors and travellers to hop from port to port.

The island's legacy of sailing goes back centuries, when Bermuda was founded by the survivors of the shipwrecked *Sea Venture* in 1609. We revolutionized sailing with the Bermuda rig, which is still used in 95 percent of all sailing yachts today. Visible from the dizzying heights of Gibb's Hill Lighthouse as well as Fort Scaur and Royal Naval Dockyard, Bermuda's Great Sound set the stage for the 35th America's Cup in 2017 and the 635-mile biennial Newport Bermuda Race, the oldest reoccurring ocean race.

But sailing is only part of our shared story - our architecture, arts and culture, cuisine, coastline and lively communities set us apart as a world-class destination.



Bermuda

Out here, May is sailing month. A time packed with events, the Bermuda International Invitational Race is followed by the Argo Group Gold Cup from May 6-11, a one-on-one duel for a \$100,000 prize purse and the coveted King Edward VII Gold Cup. Bermuda's Great Sound creates a natural amphitheatre for watching these events from several viewpoints. From May 8-17, it's on to the Antigua Bermuda Race, a 935-nautical-mile course that finishes at the Royal Bermuda Yacht Club. From June 14-22, the biennial Marion to Bermuda Race takes sailors from Massachusetts to the Royal Hamilton Amateur Dinghy Club.

New York

SailGP's Regatta features bold, cutting-edge technology and awe-inspiring sailing with modified boats from the 35th America's Cup in Bermuda. From June 21-22, teams from Australia, China, France, Great Britain, Japan and the United States will battle it out in identical, supercharged F50 catamarans engineered for racing at electrifying speeds. Fans can catch the action from the lower Hudson River or from the onshore Race Village at Brookfield Place.

Newport

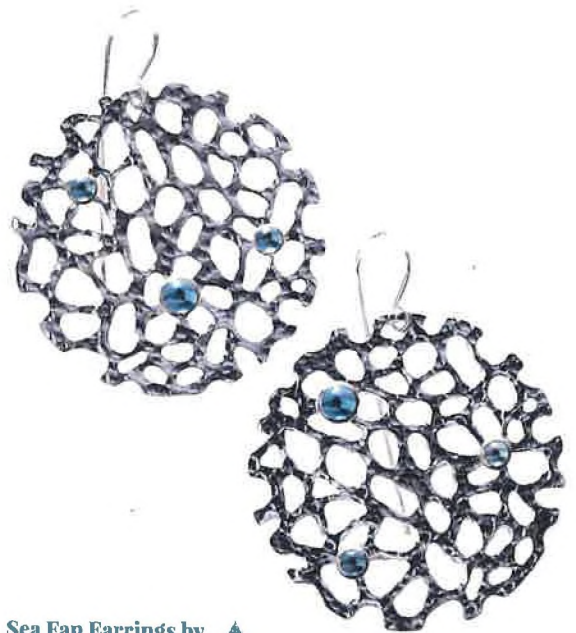
To end the sailing season, Newport will host the 35th Anniversary Newport Regatta® and the World Championship in July. From small single-handed dinghy classes to one-design boats that require a dozen crew, Sail Newport provides two to three days of challenging racing and shore-side events. A must on the sailing calendar, it takes place on the legendary waters of Narragansett Bay from July 5-7. The World Championship follows from July 8-13 with more than two-dozen boats from seven countries manned by elite sailors, America's Cup veterans and Olympic medallists from Australia, Canada, Denmark, Finland, Italy, Norway and the U.S.

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Dishing on the *Destination*

Out here, what sets this island country apart (besides the fact that it's 650 miles from Cape Hatteras, North Carolina) is the warmth, pride and diversity of Bermudians. Its 65,000 residents make up a welcoming, eclectic swirl of cultures drawing from English, African, Caribbean, Portuguese and Native American heritage. Their influence is reflected in everything from customs (proper politeness like saying good morning to *everyone*) to food, which includes a mash-up of Creole spices and proper English dishes as well as Portuguese donuts.

From fishcakes to rum cake, you'll taste the various ethnic influences in restaurants and markets island-wide.

With 75 miles of stunning coastline, you're never far from the ocean. A fish lover's dream, the seas around Bermuda are brimming with grouper, hogfish, wahoo and snapper, and the daily catch is a staple on every menu. Restaurants such as Marcus', Island Brasserie and Bella Vista pride themselves on their close links with local fishermen. As nothing goes to waste, the bones are boiled down in a classic Bermuda fish chowder enjoyed with a splash of Black Seal Rum and Outerbridge's Original Sherry Peppers.

On land, Bermuda's food is equally fresh. Spring arrives with the first buds of wild freesias, Bermuda roses and oleanders then bloom, followed closely behind by the iconic Easter lilies, calla lilies and the Bermudiana, our national flower. The days become longer, the citrus trees bloom - the lemons and oranges are a rare treat. The trails are covered with lantana, a kind of local sage, and fresh, wild rosemary - the perfect pairing for traditional roast lamb at Easter and Sunday brunches island-wide. Try Fourways Inn, Aqua Terra at the Reefs and Rotisserie Grill in Smith's.

Two major staples of Easter cuisine are codfish cakes and hot cross buns. Not unusual seasonal fare, except they are served together as a sandwich spread with a little mayonnaise or hot sauce. The savoury-sweet combination is a signature quality of the Bermudian palate. Those with Portuguese heritage also bake egg bread - a traditional, sweet Easter dish with a whole boiled egg hidden in the centre. Buy it fresh at the Portuguese Bakery on Addendum Lane.

Browse the farmers' market at the Bermuda Botanical Gardens for jars of local preserves and chutney, fresh produce, home-baked goods and Bermuda-made gifts. Spiced popcorn and seasonal soups are also on the table on Saturdays from 8 am to 12 pm. Head to Village Pantry, Marée or Huckleberry for season-focused menus.

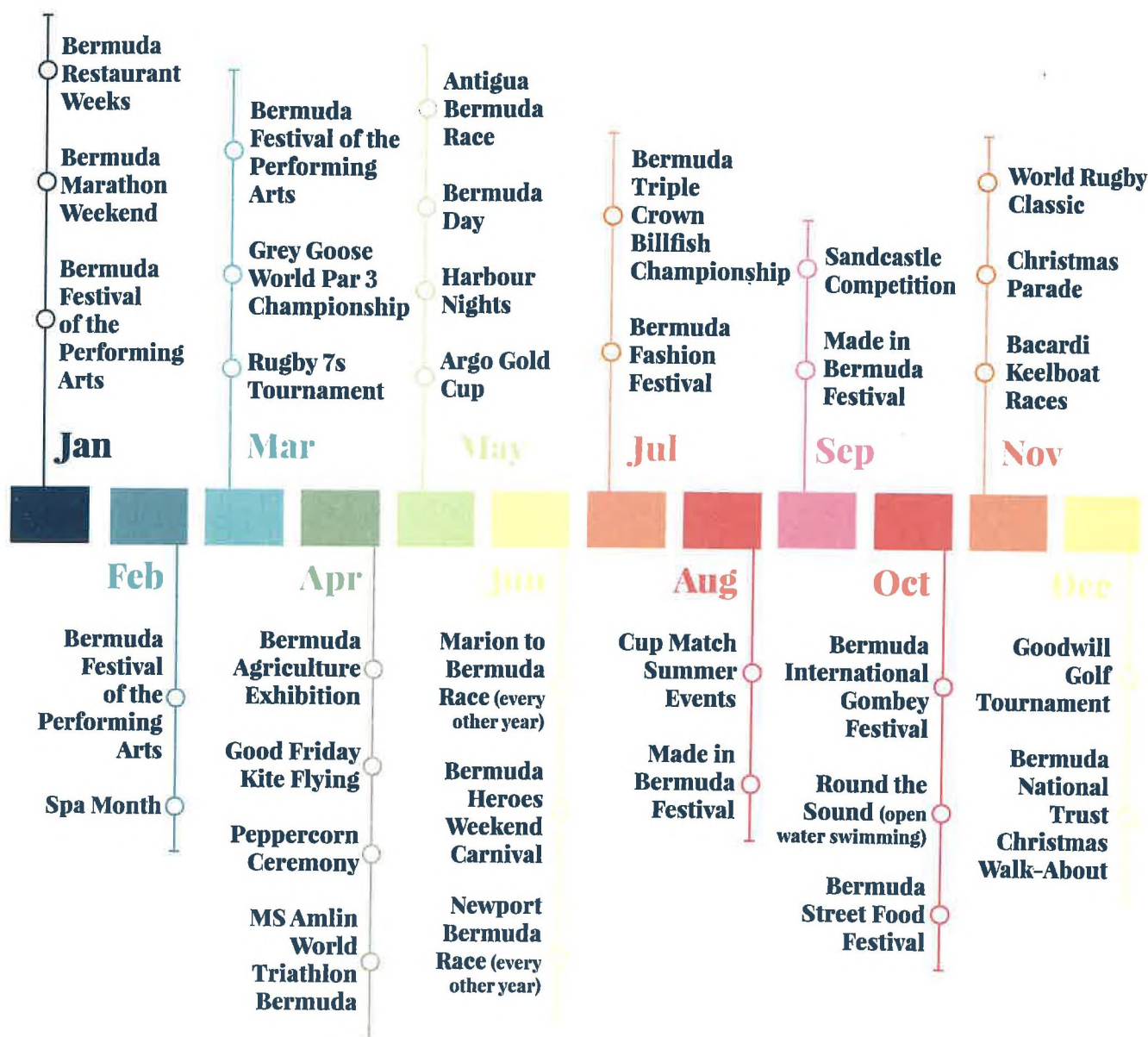

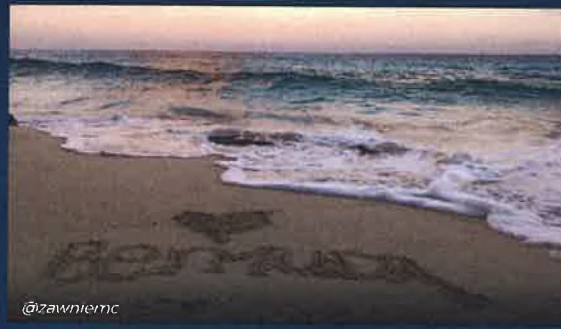

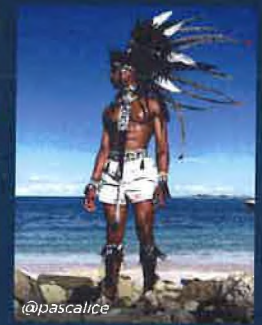
