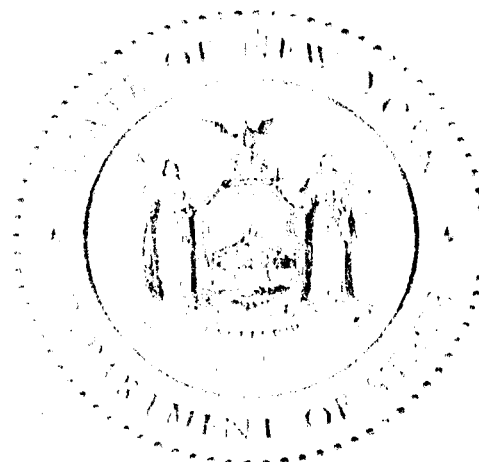

ACTIVITY AND MILEAGE LOG

JANUARY THROUGH SEPTEMBER, 1992

During this period, I was the only person working for PROTECT, except for a brief period when we had part time clerical help. I worked general business hours, roughly 9 to five, Monday through Fridays, doing routine office chores such as going to the post office each day for the mail, filing, ordering supplies, answering the phone, some administrative work and so on. I did all janitorial work, all clerical, administrative. I served as writer, editor, circulation manager, bookkeeper, subscription manager and mail room for the James Bay UPDATE, produced periodically and sent to roughly 175 individuals and organizations concerned about the James Bay issue. I received some assistance from volunteers in assembling the newsletter and stuffing it into envelopes, and some assistance from volunteers in attending to 'tabling' of informational materials at various environmental festivals. Otherwise, I was mostly on my own.

I simply served as Helen's guide and moral support. She very briefly explained to the crowd the effect of James Bay development on her people.

159 mi Monday, March 9: Dianne Engleke wanted to meet Helen Atkinson, the Cree lady, so we drove back to NY City and spent the day showing Helen some of the city.

62 mi 3/10 -- shopped locally for office shelving

Tuesday, March 10: Had an appointment to go do a field strength reading in Rockland County but it was so foggy in the Harriman State Park I had to turn back and postpone the appointment.

72 mi 3/12 -- to PROTECT's attorney in Poukeepsie

Friday, March 13: Mailed Justice Dept. report.

Sunday, March 15: Orange County group met again and decided to hold a candlelight vigil for James Bay in Monroe, NY.

110 mi 3/17, to Albany, from where I carpoled to Montreal to participate in the Quebec hearings on the Great Whale River project.

110 mi 3/18 -- Albany to home from hearings

Saturday, March 21: Volunteers processed a bulk mailing together with Orange Environment for the vigil in April. I was away for the weekend.

159 mi Monday, March 30: Drove Claude to NYC for the students' candlelight vigil near the UN, where Claude spoke.
