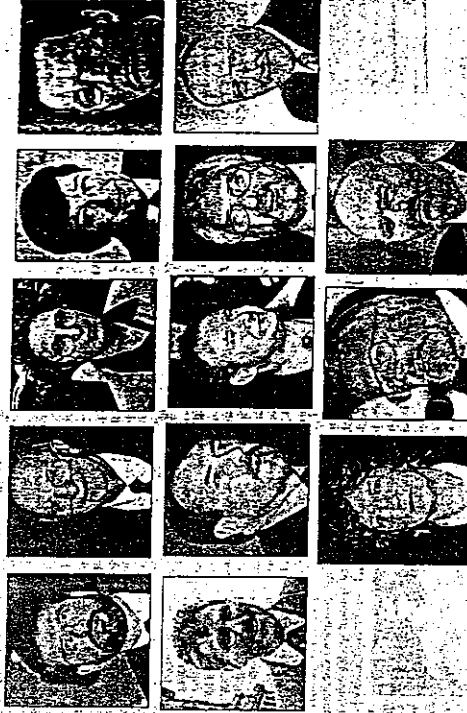

Itinerary for Gerry Adams and Richard McAuley

Gerry has a busy schedule. This is unavoidable given the distances to be traveled and the effort to break into new territory. However, I have been mindful of the fact that he needs downtime and I believe that there is a fair bit of downtime in this schedule.

Gerry and Richard will need to leave Dublin on the morning of 3-11 at 6:30 am. I have discussed this with Dessie and agree that the best thing would be for them to stay in Dublin the evening before. They will take a 6:30 a.m. flight to London's Gatwick Airport. There will be a brief layover and they will then catch a British Airways flight directly to Dallas, Texas.

They will arrive in Dallas at 2:30 pm. I will meet them there.

There will be a 4:00 pm press conference in Dallas at which Gerry can discuss his tour and indeed the whole concept of the 13 individuals being sent to the United States with a message that the Good Friday Agreement must be implemented. (Across the street from the press conference is a large television studio which is seeking an interview with Gerry. We have not agreed but it remains an opportunity for us.)

Also, the Dallas Morning News Editorial Board would like to meet with Gerry Adams after the news conference.

The next event is a 6:30 to 8:30 cocktail reception. This will be our fund raising event in Dallas. It will be at the home of Kevin and Brinda Curley, who have previously hosted events for Ambassador O'Huigin at their home. Kevin is a former New Yorker, the chairman of the Dallas St. Patrick's Day Parade and was put in touch with us by Todd Allen and one of Todd's friends at the MERC.

After the cocktail reception Gerry can go to his hotel which is a very short distance and be free for the night. However, Richard McAuley has requested that we attempt a CNN interview at the home before going to the hotel. This is OK with the Curleys.

Friday, March 12 is a busy day. We will catch a flight at approximately 9:00 o'clock and arrive in Houston at approximately 10:00 o'clock. At 11:00 am Gerry is scheduled to deliver a speech at the University of St. Thomas. This will be approximately one hour. Gerry will speak for about thirty minutes and take questions. There will be a brief press conference prior.

Thereafter, we will travel a short distance to a lunch hosted by the AOH. This will be our fund raising event in Houston.

After the lunch, Gerry was scheduled to do a radio interview for a nationwide program called "Democracy Now." Per Richard this has been cancelled. They would like to do it by phone on Saturday or Monday?

Thereafter, we will catch a 4 o'clock flight to San Antonio which arrives at 4:45. Upon arrival in San Antonio we will

take a short drive to the hotel. Gerry will have approximately an hour to an hour-and-fifteen minutes at the hotel. Then we will take a short drive to St. Mary's School of Law, which I am told is the most prestigious law school in the State of Texas. At the law school there will be a fifteen minute press conference and then Gerry will deliver a speech and take questions from an audience that will include many of the top lawyers, judges and politicians in Texas. Thereafter, there will be a reception hosted by the law school and Gerry will be through by 9 pm. There will be a short drive back to the hotel.

On Saturday, there is nothing scheduled for Gerry until 7 pm. Gerry can use this time to rest, work, sight-see, whatever he wants. He is invited to march in a small St. Patrick's Day Parade that day but I have indicated he will not do so unless he changes his mind at the last moment. Our host in San Antonio will be Jim Delaney. I believe Gerry has met him before. He has been intimately involved with the Irish-American Unity Conference since at least 1983.

On Saturday night 7-9 pm there will be a cocktail reception/fund-raiser for us. Our host will be Jim Delaney.

On the morning of the 14th we must catch a flight at approximately 9:45 am to take us to Tampa, Florida. We will land in Tampa at approximately 3 pm. This is due both to the length of the flight and a time zone change.

Gerry is scheduled to deliver another press conference, speech and question-and-answer session at the University of Tampa at 4 pm. We are being paid \$50,000 for this speech.

Gerry is to appear at a second, smaller fund-raiser at the Four Green Fields at approximately 7 pm. We should be out of there no later than 8:30. That will be the end of the night for Gerry.

On the morning of the 14th there is nothing scheduled. We are due to fly out of Tampa at 2:45. We will take a one-hour flight to Atlanta, Georgia. When we arrive in Atlanta we are not scheduled for anything until a 6:30 dinner appointment. This will be a small dinner of approximately ten people who are very successful Irish-American business people. After the dinner we are scheduled to go to Emory University where Gerry will hold a press conference, deliver a speech and answer questions. The speech at Emory is a fund raising event for us.

We are scheduled to leave Atlanta on the 16th at approximately 10 am. This will be a one-hour flight to Savannah, Georgia. Gerry is scheduled to deliver a speech at the Savannah College of Art and Design at 1 o'clock. This should be approximately an hour-and-a-half and is the only event scheduled for Gerry on the 16th. The speech at the College is a fund-raising event for us.

The next morning at 10 o'clock Gerry is scheduled to march in the Savannah parade. After the parade, Gerry is scheduled to fly to Washington for the President's dinner at the White House. We are scheduled to arrive at 5 pm.

I have been requested to get Gerry Adams A to DC on the evening of March 16. Therefore the Parade will be cancelled.

Gerry is due to return to Ireland on the 18th. He will

fly directly from Washington to London and then catch a connecting flight, after a short layover, to Belfast. This means Gerry will have a full day in Washington on the 18th with nothing on his schedule.

Disappointment at Minister's negative response on Dublin-Monaghan bombings Trimble urged to "establish trust on basis of Agreement"

Sinn Féin TD Caoimhghín Ó Caoláin has expressed disappointment at the negative response of the Minister for Justice, Equality and Law Reform John O'Donoghue whom the Cavan/Monaghan deputy urged at the British-Irish Inter-Parliamentary Body to establish a tribunal of inquiry into the Dublin and Monaghan bombings of 1974 as requested by the relatives of the dead and the injured. The Sinn Féin TD also raised the murder of human rights lawyer Rosemary Nelson and the demand for an independent international inquiry into her death. Deputy Ó Caoláin said:

"The 25th anniversary of the Dublin and Monaghan bombings is coming up in May. The relatives of the dead and injured deserve a positive response from the Irish government. I believe that in the weeks ahead the Irish government will have to reconsider the issue and take the initiative on this and other examples of collusion between loyalist paramilitaries and British armed forces, including the RUC."

Deputy Ó Caoláin supported the motion passed by the Body which commended both governments and the political parties on progress made thus far in implementing the Good Friday Agreement. An amendment from the British Tory MP David Wiltshire seeking to insert a sentence demanding decommissioning as a precondition was rejected. Addressing the current impasse Deputy Ó Caoláin said:

"We entered the Assembly despite the fact that all the repugnant apparatus of

the Northern state remain in place- the armed sectarian RUC, the British Army, the emergency legislation, the biased judiciary, the 130,000 licensed weapons in the hands of the unionist community, economic and cultural discrimination against nationalists. We are prepared to enter an Executive in spite of the fact that all of these things remain place.

We could in conscience, and consistent with our politics and with our long experience of the Northern state, have made the immediate redress of any or all of these injustices a precondition to our participation in the new institutions. If we had insisted on such an approach we would have ensured that the Agreement was either not achieved or else broken apart once achieved. We could have attempted to rewrite the Agreement and insert preconditions. We have not done so. Others must not be allowed to do so.

I urge David Trimble to establish trust on the firm basis of the Agreement we reached last Good Friday. Mindsets were decommissioned on that occasion. Failure to follow through now will serve only to reverse that process. It is through the Agreement that mutual trust and political progress can be achieved. ENDS

Itinerary for Gerry Adams and Richard McAuley

Gerry has a busy schedule. This is unavoidable given the distances to be traveled and the effort to break into new territory. However, I have been mindful of the fact that he needs downtime and I believe that there is a fair bit of downtime in this schedule.

Gerry and Richard will need to leave Dublin on the morning of 3-11 at 6:30 am. I have discussed this with Dessie and agree that the best thing would be for them to stay in Dublin the evening before. They will take a 6:30 a.m. flight to London's Gatwick Airport. There will be a brief layover and they will then catch a British Airways flight directly to Dallas, Texas.

They will arrive in Dallas at 2:30 pm. I will meet them there.

There will be a 4:00 pm press conference in Dallas at which Gerry can discuss his tour and indeed the whole concept of the 13 individuals being sent to the United States with a message that the Good Friday Agreement must be implemented. (Across the street from the press conference is a large television studio which is seeking an interview with Gerry. We have not agreed but it remains an opportunity for us.)

Also, the Dallas Morning News Editorial Board would like to meet with Gerry Adams after the news conference.

The next event is a 6:30 to 8:30 cocktail reception. This will be our fund raising event in Dallas. It will be at the home of Kevin and Brinda Curley, who have previously hosted events for Ambassador O'Huigin at their home. Kevin is a former New Yorker, the chairman of the Dallas St. Patrick's Day Parade and was put in touch with us by Todd Allen and one of Todd's friends at the MERC.

After the cocktail reception Gerry can go to his hotel which is a very short distance and be free for the night. However, Richard McAuley has requested that we attempt a CNN interview at the home before going to the hotel. This is OK with the Curleys.

Friday, March 12 is a busy day. We will catch a flight at approximately 9:00 o'clock and arrive in Houston at approximately 10:00 o'clock. At 11:00 am Gerry is scheduled to deliver a speech at the University of St. Thomas. This will be approximately one hour. Gerry will speak for about thirty minutes and take questions. There will be a brief press conference prior.

Thereafter, we will travel a short distance to a lunch hosted by the AOH. This will be our fund raising event in Houston.

After the lunch, Gerry was scheduled to do a radio interview for a nationwide program called "Democracy Now." Per Richard this has been cancelled. They would like to do it by phone on Saturday or Monday?

Thereafter, we will catch a 4 o'clock flight to San Antonio which arrives at 4:45. Upon arrival in San Antonio we will

take a short drive to the hotel. Gerry will have approximately an hour to an hour-and-fifteen minutes at the hotel. Then we will take a short drive to St. Mary's School of Law, which I am told is the most prestigious law school in the State of Texas. At the law school there will be a fifteen minute press conference and then Gerry will deliver a speech and take questions from an audience that will include many of the top lawyers, judges and politicians in Texas. Thereafter, there will be a reception hosted by the law school and Gerry will be through by 9 pm. There will be a short drive back to the hotel.

On Saturday, there is nothing scheduled for Gerry until 7 pm. Gerry can use this time to rest, work, sight-see, whatever he wants. He is invited to march in a small St. Patrick's Day Parade that day but I have indicated he will not do so unless he changes his mind at the last moment. Our host in San Antonio will be Jim Delaney. I believe Gerry has met him before. He has been intimately involved with the Irish-American Unity Conference since at least 1983.

On Saturday night 7-9 pm there will be a cocktail reception/fund-raiser for us. Our host will be Jim Delaney.

On the morning of the 14th we must catch a flight at approximately 9:45 am to take us to Tampa, Florida. We will land in Tampa at approximately 3 pm. This is due both to the length of the flight and a time zone change.

Gerry is scheduled to deliver another press conference, speech and question-and-answer session at the University of Tampa at 4 pm. We are being paid \$50,000 for this speech.

Gerry is to appear at a second, smaller fund-raiser at the Four Green Fields at approximately 7 pm. We should be out of there no later than 8:30. That will be the end of the night for Gerry.

On the morning of the 14th there is nothing scheduled. We are due to fly out of Tampa at 2:45. We will take a one-hour flight to Atlanta, Georgia. The speech at the College is a fund-raising event for us.

The next morning at 10 o'clock Gerry is scheduled to march in the Savannah parade. After the parade, Gerry is scheduled to fly to Washington for the President's dinner at the White House. We are scheduled to arrive at 5 pm.

I have been requested to get Gerry Adams A to DC on the evening of March 16. Therefore the Parade will be cancelled.

Gerry is due to return to Ireland on the 18th. He will

fly directly from Washington to London and then catch a connecting flight, after a short layover, to Belfast. This means Gerry will have a full day in Washington on the 18th with nothing on his schedule.
