

Six Month Reporting Period Detail

August 29, 2000 – February 28, 2001

Supplemental background material to specific questions on registration form where space was limited for representation provided to the Blue Water Bridge Authority (5272)

Item 11

The Firm of William-Lynn-James, Inc. is under contract with the Blue Water Bridge Authority to assist the Authority with long-range business decisions and to serve as subject-matter experts on border crossing issues. To this end, the Firm has made a number of contacts during this time period. The Firm has attended U.S. Department of Transportation Public Information hearings and has monitored the state of Michigan House and Senate Transportation committees.

The Firm has also reviewed possible legislative alternatives and operational budgets for the Michigan Department of Transportation. The Firm has monitored but not commented publicly on the negotiations between the State of Michigan and Transport Canada concerning the International Bridge. The Firm has monitored but not commented publicly on the debate concerning the Peace Bridge. The Firm has monitored but not commented publicly on policies related to the third bridge study on the Michigan frontier. The Firm has worked with the Bridge Tunnel Operator's Association President Allen Gandell on regional transportation issues. The Firm has worked with the CANAM/Border Trade Alliance on regional transportation issues. The Firm participated in the establishment of a working group concerning traffic movement across the U.S./Canadian Border. This group is comprised primarily of state, provincial, and local law enforcement officers.

During this reporting period, the focus of the Firm has been on Canadian issues and their impacts on our U.S. partners. Accordingly, the focus of the Firm's work for this reporting period has been in Canada and not the United States. Several of the new subcontractors hired under the last reporting period have been working extensively on Canadian plaza planning issues. The Authority is undertaking to build a new truck entryway onto Canadian Highway 402. The Firm has been involved in arranging financing for this project. In conjunction with its Canadian consultants, the Firm has produced a number of reports concerning the Blue Water Bridge International gateway. The Authority's Board of Directors has not released the reports and there are no plans, at this time, to provide the report to any U.S. government officials.

The Firm made no contact with national U.S. news media during the reporting period. The Firm did contact *The Flint Journal* in Flint, Michigan.

The Firm has attended a number of receptions and functions at the U.S. Canadian Embassy in Ottawa. The Firm attended the Bilateral MPO Seminar meetings conducted by SEMCOG.

It is important to step back and note that, at the end of the contract, the materials and arguments developed will be used extensively in the United States. Currently, this material is still under development, and several of the reports have not been approved or accepted by the Blue Water Bridge Authority. The Blue Water Bridge Authority's Board of Directors will provide copies of these reports and findings to the U.S. Department of State and the U.S. Department of Transportation upon the acceptance of the material by the Blue Water Bridge Authority's Board. No specific time frame for this has been determined.

Item 12

It is clear that the activities of the Firm have enhanced the public image of the Blue Water Bridge Authority to several American officials. The Firm's activities have helped clarify the role the Authority plays in developing public policy on border crossing issues affecting the Michigan Frontier. These activities were limited to explaining the history of the Authority and accurately reporting its position on policy issues being debated.

During this time period, the Firm discussed no specific bill, resolution, accord, or treaty in relationship to the Blue Water Bridge Authority's long-range plan with U.S. officials. Acting independently of the Firm, the Authority, through its Chairman Doug Keddy and the local Federal Member of Parliament Roger Gallaway, has expressed its concerns about the implementation of Section 110 and State to Federal negotiations between the state of Michigan and the Federal government of Canada.

The Firm, acting on behalf of the Authority, has monitored Section 110 and become a subject matter expert on this and related subjects.

The Authority, working with the Firm, is presently developing a pre-processing center for commercial freight with the U.S. Customs Service. This facility will be located in Canada.

Item 14

See attached report provided by the Blue Water Bridge Authority. This report reflects the implementation of several elements of the Blue Water Bridge Authority's plan. The report reflects disbursements from August 29, 2000 through February 28, 2001. \$20,850.00 of professional fees was paid to the Firm, William-Lynn-James, Inc., as a retainer. The remainder of the fees covered travel and expenses, computer presentations,

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computer modeling, EIS submittals, traffic safety reports, traffic revenue studies, PowerPoint presentations, blue line drawings, concept drawings, engineering reports, sub-consultants, and research.

Item 15

To accurately report the distribution of funds from the Blue Water Bridge Authority and how the Firm of William-Lynn-James, Inc. has used these funds, the following response to Item 15-A is provided. The Authority's report outlines each reportable disbursement during the reporting period. During the reporting period, \$20,850.00 of professional fees was used for salary. None of this amount was charged to office expenses. Travel included trips to Ottawa, London (Canada), Windsor (Ontario), Niagara Falls (Ontario), Toronto, Sarnia, Detroit, Lansing, and Washington, D.C.

During this reporting period, no entertainment was conducted by the Firm to any Federal U.S. government official or the media.

During this reporting period, no travel was provided to any Federal U.S. government official or the media.

During this reporting period, no expenditures were made to an agent in conjunction with the Firm's activities.

Item 18

The Authority's Board of Directors will be discussing this subject in its March board meeting. The duration of the Firm's continued employment with the Authority has been extended. The financial compensation to the Firm is yet to be determined and will be based upon the needs outlined by the Authority's Board of Directors.
