(1) Name. The Solomon Group LLC (FARA Registration #5352) ceased all lobbying activities as of December 31, 2001. This action followed the death, on October 26, 2001, of the President and CEO of The Solomon Group, Mr. Gerald B.H. Solomon. A new and separate entity, The Livingston-Solomon Group LLC, was legally organized on December 28, 2001 and subsequently acquired most of the assets and contracts of The Solomon Group.

For purposes of this reporting period (August 1, 2001 through January 31, 2002), all activities undertaken on behalf of foreign principals prior to December 31, 2001 were done by The Solomon Group; all activities undertaken on behalf of foreign principals between January 1, 2002 and January 31, 2002 were done by a new and separate entity, The Livingston-Solomon Group.

The Solomon Group did work on behalf of three foreign principals. The contracts with two of those principals --- the Taipei Economic and Cultural Representative Office in the United States and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Kingdom of Morocco --- expired on December 31, 2001. Neither contract has been renewed with The Livingston-Solomon Group as of this filing. The Solomon Group's other contract with a foreign principal --- the Government of the Republic of Turkey --- was retained by The Livingston-Solomon Group and ran through February 28, 2002, the date of this filing. All payments received from foreign principals pursuant to these three contracts were received by The Solomon Group during the calendar year 2001.

(2) Ownership or control. The Livingston-Solomon Group is a wholly-owned subsidiary of The Livingston Group LLC (FARA Registration #5356). The Operating Agreement is still in preparation. As soon as the Operating Agreement has been completed, it will be filed with the FARA Registration Unit.

(3) Branch offices. The Solomon Group maintained a business address at 801 Pennsylvania Ave., NW, Suite 750, Washington, DC 20004.
