(TLG) continues to provide advice and assistance to the Ambassador from the Republic of Turkey to the U.S. To that end, TLG has worked to bridge the gap in information in the U.S. Congress about Turkey, oppose anti-Turkish lobbying with proactive activities, create a better environment for positive engagement by working to establish a dialogue between the Ambassador and members of Congress and their staff, and work on specific issues as they arise to the betterment of Turkey's position.

Air Window, Inc. TLG provided assistance to this private South Korean corporation which organized a trip to Washington, DC by a five-member delegation of political activists from the Republic of Korea. The delegation referred to itself as the "Korean Young Politician Delegation" and addressed issues concerning U.S./Korean relations.




