

**RE: Visit to Taiwan this year or next.**

Dear Jack,

Now that the World Health Organization and the Center for Disease Control have taken Taiwan off the SARS list, I'm writing to invite you and your spouse to visit Taiwan during the August recess, after adjournment later this year or in February 2004, at the request of the Chinese National Association of Industry and Commerce (CNAIC) in Taipei, which has sponsored such trips by literally dozens of Congressmen and Senators over the last decade.

During the course of such a visit you would have an opportunity to meet with President Chen Shui-bian, Foreign Minister Eugene Chien, and other government officials responsible for Taiwan's relations with China and its economic relationship with the United States. It would also be possible, if you so desired, to meet with the business leadership of the country as well as the leaders of the main opposition parties.

Since I'm told that you haven't yet had an opportunity to visit Taiwan, it seemed to me that sometime this year or early next year might be a good time for you to go. If you can possibly fit it into your schedule, I should think that you'd find it extremely worthwhile. The transformation of Taiwan from an impoverished backwater into an industrial powerhouse, and from a one party dictatorship into multi-party democracy, is among the most impressive economic and political "miracles" of our time, and a trip there would give you a real opportunity to find out more about what made it possible.

Taiwan has now become our seventh largest trading partner, with a volume of over \$60 billion in trade between our two countries. Perhaps more importantly, with Beijing still refusing to rule out the use of force as a way of resolving the "Taiwan problem," there is a very real possibility that this vibrant democracy and long time friend of the United States might one day be the victim of Chinese aggression.

How that can be avoided and what the US should do if it occurs are questions to which a timely visit to Taiwan would undoubtedly enable you to give

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
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an informed and insightful response to what may well emerge as one of the major foreign policy challenges confronting our country.

There is also an increasingly influential and politically active Taiwanese community in the U.S. which would, I am sure, welcome your visit to the land of their birth.

Should you decide to make such a journey, the CNAIC would pick up all of your expenses including first class round trip travel as well as your hotel and restaurant charges in Taipei. I'm told that the Ethics Committee has previously approved trips to Taiwan sponsored by the CNAIC, so you shouldn't have any problem getting such a trip approved for yourself. If you would like to visit Taiwan at anytime in the next year, please give my assistant, Bobbi Avancena, a ring at 202-778-1480, and she'll make sure the necessary arrangements are made.
