Dear Congressman Inslee,

This morning I learned that the State Department has approved a transit visa in **Seattle** for the **President of Taiwan**, Chen, Shui-bian, **on Friday, September 3** in the late afternoon through the late evening. He has asked me to let you know that he would very much like to meet with you. A private one on one meeting can be arranged or you could attend a dinner meeting with the President for Washington State officials.

I'm sure you are aware of the longstanding friendship between Taiwan and Washington State, but I thought it was worth running down some details of that relationship.

Washington State and Taiwan has a strong trade relationship.

According to the Washington State Department of Community Trade and Economic Development report from March 2004, exports to Taiwan from Washington State amounted to \$2 billion for the year ending 2003 which was an 87% INCREASE over the previous year 2002:

Washington State's main exports to Taiwan include aircraft, agricultural products and processed foods, computer software (not listed in statistics), electronic instruments and components. Other important exports include forest products, chemicals, medical devices, and services. If we also define tourism and education as 'exports', both would also rank as two of Washington's top 10 export 'products' to Taiwan.

Trade statistics alone do not fully reflect the importance of Taiwan to Washington's economy.

Here a few examples of significant business revenues generated by Washington State that are not included in trade statistics:

- One of Washington State's largest investments, a US\$1.2 billion semiconductor plant that employs over 1,000 people in Camas, Washington, came from the Taiwan Semiconductor Manufacturing Corporation.



- In January 2003, the Taiwan-based Evergreen Marine Corporation, one of the world's largest container lines, announced it will invest US\$210 million to develop a new mega-terminal complex at the Port of Tacoma. The site will become the largest container terminal north of Los Angeles and will generate about 1,200 direct port industry jobs.
- Microsoft had sales of US\$350 million in Taiwan in 2001, but its sales are not counted in trade figures, because software is considered a service, not a commodity.
- Taiwanese tourists and students respectively spend US\$27 million and US\$20 million in Washington annually.

President Chen is very much hoping to meet with you on Friday, September 3 to discuss both economic and foreign policy issues related to Washington State and to the U.S.-Taiwan relationship as a whole.


