I am writing to ask if you would be willing to meet with Mr. Egeman Bagis, a member of the Turkish Parliament and the chief foreign policy advisor to Prime Minister Erdogan on Wednesday, June 13, 2007 or Thursday, June 14, 2007. Mr. Bagis will be traveling to Washington with a high level delegation of parliamentarians from Turkey. The main topic of the meeting will be the House consideration of H. Res. 106, the Armenian Resolution. They would like to share with you the Turkish viewpoint on this legislation before it is considered by Congress later this session. They will also be prepared to discuss any other topics relating to US-Turkish relations of concern to you.

Mr. Bagis has been constructively active in promoting closer and better relations between Turkey and the United States. 
Dear Congressman Sestak,

Hopefully you have already received the attached invitation to a major agriculture product signing ceremony with members of a trade mission from Taiwan. I want to encourage you to attend the letter of intent ceremony taking place in the Mansfield Room on Thursday between 10:00 AM and 12:00 PM, which will allow you to greet the trade delegation. I think you will find this ceremony of particular interest as the delegation will be signing letters of intent to buy agriculture products from your home state and there will be many agriculture industry representatives present as well.

By signing the letters of intent, the Agricultural Trade Goodwill Mission intends to purchase 15 million metric tons of U.S. wheat, soybeans and corn along with up to 150,000 metric tons of U.S. beef, poultry, and chicken in 2008 and 2009. The total value of the aforementioned U.S. agricultural products to be exported to Taiwan amounts to \$3.9 billion U.S. dollars. In addition, representatives of our Industrial Trade Mission will sign 3 contracts with their U.S. partners and also consider to purchase U.S. industrial products worth \$11.34 billion U.S. dollars in 10 years.

After visiting Washington, D.C., the Agricultural Mission will then travel to nine states, including Iowa, Illinois, Minnesota, South Dakota, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Georgia, and Nebraska, to meet with state and local officials and suppliers.

Taiwan is our 8th largest trading partner and a strong ally of the United States. This is a tremendous opportunity to improve the bilateral relationship with Taiwan.
