Dear Ms. Hunt:

Please find in this document the answers to your letter of February 10, 2003.

(1) Yes, we continue to represent the Ministerio de Comercio Exterior e Inversión of the Government of Bolivia(MCEIGB).

(2) Yes, we have rendered the following services to the MCEIGB:

- Dissemination of information about Bolivia and the investment climate in Bolivia. This information was disseminated through (a) motion picture films, (b) pamphlets and publications.
- Visits to potential investors in the US in the areas of wood and textile.

(3) Yes, we have received payments that are part of a lump sum that is intended to cover both compensation and expenses. The amounts received are:

- \$59,657.10 less Bolivian taxes (12.5% = 7,457.13) = **\$52,199.97 (June, 2002)**
- \$79,542. less Bolivian taxes (12.5% = 9,942) = **\$69,600 (August, 2002)**
- \$59,657.10 less Bolivian taxes (12.5% = 7,457.13) = **\$52,199.97 (October, 2002)**

(4) The following is the list of expenses related to visits to investors in the US:

Please note that it is impossible for us to allocate expenses according to the companies that were visited by our subcontractors, Global Communicators and APCO. Please also note that these expenses were NOT made of behalf of the MCEIGB, but they are part of a lump sum that BG Consulting receives periodically for the fulfillment of its obligations according to the contract entered into between MCEIGB and BG Consulting, Inc.

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## Resumen Ejecutivo

Durante las semanas del 23 de septiembre al 4 de octubre se realizó la 1a. ronda de visitas a empresas en los sectores textil y maderero ubicadas en la Costa Este de los EEUU, de acuerdo a lo contemplado en la estrategia de Atracción de Inversiones para los Sectores Maderero y Textil de Bolivia, impulsada por el Gobierno de Bolivia. **Esta primera ronda de visitas sirvió para la realización de presentaciones acerca de las oportunidades de inversión que ofrece Bolivia en los sectores textil y vestido, así como también forestal y maderero a un número de 42 empresas norteamericanas, distribuidas en 5 Estados de la costa este de los EEUU, a saber, Carolina del Norte, Georgia, Nueva York, Pennsylvania y Virginia.** Del grupo de empresas visitadas, 29 pertenecen al sector textil y vestido, mientras que 13 pertenecen al sector forestal y maderero.

Del total de las empresas contactadas en esta primera ronda de visitas se lograron identificar 6 empresas con interés en considerar seriamente opciones estratégicas de inversión del tipo "greenfield investment" y "asociaciones estratégicas" en Bolivia en base a modelos de negocios diversos. Igualmente 8 de las empresas visitadas mostraron interés en considerar opciones estratégicas de inversión del tipo "contratos de subcontratación de mediano y largo plazo". De las acciones de seguimiento que se derivan de las reuniones sostenidas, existen buenos prospectos de visitas para el último trimestre de 2002 para un número de 8 empresas, así como para un número de 7 empresas a partir del 1er. Trimestre de 2003. Para el resto de las empresas las posibilidades de visitas a Bolivia dependerá entre otros factores referidos de la capacidad de producción de empresas, tipos de productos y tiempos de entrega, factores éstos críticos para el desarrollo de negocios con Bolivia.

Los esfuerzos de seguimiento se concentrarán en mantener el interés mostrado por las empresas visitadas, así como en motivar la consideración de algunas de las opciones estratégicas antes mencionadas, por parte de aquellas empresas que en un primer contacto si bien se mostraron interesadas en recibir información adicional acerca de Bolivia, aún no se pronunciaron a éste respecto.

El presente informe contiene un resumen de la metodología utilizada para la realización de la ronda de visitas, las empresas contactadas y visitadas, la matriz estratégica del interés mostrado por las empresas, las acciones de seguimiento así como las conclusiones, las cuales incluyen las tendencias observadas en cada uno de los sectores así como los factores críticos que afectan la competitividad de Bolivia para competir en la atracción de inversiones con otros países.

## 2. METODOLOGIA (cont.)

De la lista de empresas líderes en cada uno de los estados seleccionados, se procedió a contactar telefónicamente a cada uno de los representantes (Presidentes o Directores Ejecutivos en la mayoría de los casos). Para cada una de las empresas se realizaron al menos 5 llamadas telefónicas a fin de hacer seguimiento al paquete informativo # 1 enviado, conocer el interés de reunirse con la Misión Boliviana y agendar las reuniones en los casos de las empresas interesadas. En total se realizaron más de 1.300 llamadas telefónicas en el plazo de 3 semanas a partir del inicio del seguimiento, el 29 de agosto, con los resultados que se muestran a continuación.

### **3. OBJETIVOS**

Con la finalidad de motivar las visitas a Bolivia de empresas norteamericanas en los sectores objeto del presente proyecto, se organizó la Ronda de Visitas (Road Shows), de la Costa Este de conformidad con los criterios acordados en el desarrollo de los módulos 1 y 2 del proyecto.

Los estados seleccionados para la realización de las visitas a empresas fueron, a efectos de maximizar el esfuerzo de viaje así como simplificar las implicaciones de logística, aquellos con mayor densidad de empresas en ambos sectores (ver distribución geográfica de la lista de empresas por sector en la sección de anexos del presente documento). De ésta manera se contactaron a todas las empresas líderes en los estados de Nueva York, Carolina del Norte, Georgia, y Pennsylvania. Igualmente vista la importancia del sector maderero así como la cercanía geográfica se decidió visitar a empresas en el estado de Virginia.

El objetivo general de la visita a las empresas fue el de realizar una presentación acerca de las oportunidades de inversión y negocios que Bolivia ofrece a las empresas norteamericanas. De igual forma se persiguieron los objetivos específicos de:

- Conocer del estado de desarrollo y estrategias de la empresa
- Conocer de las tendencias del sector - industria
- Conocer el interés de la empresa en la realización de inversiones y negocios en Bolivia, y evaluar las posibilidades de una próxima visita al país
- Responder a algunas primeras inquietudes de las empresas en cuanto a las posibilidades de inversión y negocios
- Conocer principales preocupaciones o desafíos de Bolivia al momento de atraer inversiones hacia la región
- Tomar nota de requerimientos informativos adicionales a fin de enviarlos en una ocasión posterior
