Discharging upon the North American Continent, and in the United States in particular, the objects for which its parent organization in South Africa was established by an Act of the South African Parliament, namely to 'Develop the Tourist Industry of the Republic of South Africa by encouraging persons to visit the Republic from Elsewhere' etc., which activities have been conducted in a manner similar to other foreign Government travel offices, that is, maintaining an information centre to assist the general public and the travel trade to plan trips to South Africa and encouraging the undertaking of such trips by the distribution of South African travel information, through personal interviews and advertisements in the press, radio and television, and through the media of tourist brochures, folders, posters, films, slides, photographs, travel newsletters, form letters and displays.
The registrant also acted as the official representative of the South African Tourist Corporation at any official Governmental, business or social functions or Quasi-Governmental functions which he had cause to attend and conducted the normal administrative duties connected with the running of the office during the period.
