Dear Petar:

We are delighted that you have chosen to retain Quinn to undertake the public relations efforts for Hvar Tourist Board.

1. *Compensation*

Under this agreement Hvar Tourist Board agrees to pay Quinn a fee of \$4,000 per month beginning May 1, 2019. The fee covers approximately 20 hours of account work that includes media relations and marketing initiatives designed to help achieve your PR, marketing and sales goals.

Crisis situations that require in excess of five hours of work in any given month will be billed at our hourly crisis rates listed in this agreement.

Fees are billed on the first of every month and are due on receipt. Any invoices unpaid after 90 days will incur a 5% finance charge. Out-of-pocket expenses (media monitoring, publications, research, materials, travel, third-party vendors, copying, taxis, messenger, etc.) are billed separately at the standard agency mark-up of 15%, once a month. The monthly fee increases 5% every 12 months beginning May 1, 2020.

2. *Term*

The term of this agreement begins May 1, 2019 and continues until October 1, 2019. Hvar Tourist Board and Quinn will then negotiate the contract for 2020. Either party may cancel this agreement with one month (30 days) written notice. Hvar Tourist Board is responsible for all fees and expenses related to services through the date of termination.

3. *Google Analytics*

Client will authorize access on the back end of client Google Analytics to Quinn, so Quinn can measure and report on the correlation between Quinn placements and increases in Client web traffic.







Project Fees

The following projects and project fees are not included in our base retainer. Please see below for what could cost extra:

- One group press trip: \$3,000 per month for three months (\$9,000 total) to cover the planning and execution of the trip.
* Hvar Tourist Board would have to cover all travel costs for the trip for press and Quinn including flights from the U.S.
- 4-6 individual media visits: \$3,000
* Hvar Tourist Board would have to cover travel costs

- 1 partnership per year (from a simple email collecting sweepstakes to a more in-depth PR-worthy creative activation) – this would be based on the level of involvement
