Basic Facts from...The REVELATION (Part 8)

Chapters 12-13 mark the pivotal point of the Revelation; the "picture" widens in scope to present the "contest" between heaven and hell on a much more comprehensive scale. John's attention no longer focuses only on the plight of the oppressed saints; now he sees the conflict between good and evil from a heavenly perspective. Satan's purpose and activities, along with the "allies" who serve him in the world are vividly pictured. This fearful vision is followed in chapter 14 by the image of Jesus – the Lamb – gathered with His faithful saints to act as the great Vindicator of their faith and as the Judge who executes justice upon the earth (humanity).

What John sees explains and puts into a larger context Imperial Rome's hostility against the church, which was growing even as John wrote. Jesus had foretold such persecution and hatred during His personal ministry (John 15:20); what John now sees depicts the conflict that began in the garden of Eden. These images show the saints that the suffering they are about to experience is actually part of this much larger conflict, and they are meant to reassure them that even though their adversary continues to struggle against the Almighty, the crucial battle had already been won when Jesus arose in triumph from death and the grave (cf. Acts 2:24).

Beginning at Revelation 13:7 John shows a sort of "Divine flashback," a glimpse of God's view of Jesus' birth and king Herod's attempt to kill Him. This vision is expressed in symbols and images common to the apocalyptic writings of that time, and they would be readily understood across a number of cultures. John had marked the beginning of a new series of visions at vs. 1 by introducing them with a new word (in this book) - "sign," meaning a "pointer" or indicator - a portent. (The disciples used this same word in Matthew 24:3 in asking Jesus for a "sign" of His coming, and of the end of the world.) John now sees a woman, a dragon, and a male child (verses 1-6), followed by images of war in heaven that culminate in the dragon's being vanquished. The dragon then (unsuccessfully) turns his dying fury against the woman.

The visions of chapters 13-14 continue the narrative of battle that began in chapter 12, introducing two of the dragon's "agents," a sea-beast and a land-beast. Their appearance emphasizes that the dragon continues to touch the whole world with such power as he still has.

These beasts reflect the dragon's hatred for the church; having failed to destroy the manchild in chapter 12, he turns his fury against the saints. That the beasts cover both sea and land suggests that they symbolize all the worldly power he can be muster against the church - politically, morally, or emotionally. The **unifying** characteristic of these figures is their unbending malevolence toward the Christ and His people. In one sense, the dragon and the beasts form a sort of "false trinity" in contrast to the Godhead.

After the fury and terror of these visions, the **tranquility** of Revelation 14:1-5 is a welcome change! Here John sees a Lamb on Mt. Zion, surrounded by 144,000 redeemed ones, all singing a new song. This is followed by three angels who call for the repentance of all people, announce the fall of "Babylon," and warn of the consequences of worshipping the beast and accepting his mark. The dire warnings of these angels are followed (in 14:13) by words of comfort and reassurance before the Son of Man commands His angels to reap the "harvest" of earth and gather in her "vintage" in the final verses of this chapter.
