Learning to Be Content

The book of Philippians is one of the more informal letters penned by the Apostle Paul. Thought by most to be written around A.D. 61, it is one of the four Prison Epistles that Paul wrote during his second imprisonment. Unlike some of the other letters that Paul wrote, the book of Philippians was not written in response to a crisis or to give correction to some ongoing problem, but was instead written for Paul to express his appreciation to the church of Philippi for the gift that they sent him during his imprisonment.

Throughout the letter, while expressing his appreciation for the monetary help he received from the Philippians, Paul takes time to encourage his brothers and sisters to continue to grow in their commitment to God and each other. He reminds them that “to live is Christ” (Phil. 1:21), to walk with unity and humility to God (Phil. 2:1-11), and continue to be intentional in the building up of their individual faiths (Phil. 2:12). However, one of the biggest themes that we can see in this letter is Paul’s constant reminders to rejoice in the Lord no matter what may be going on in our lives. Paul had spent around the last four years of his life imprisoned for charges that were falsely raised against him and yet, despite his earthly freedoms being taken away, Paul is just happy to continue to have opportunities to share the gospel and to work to deepen his own faith. Never once in his letter to the Christians in Philippi does he make a complaint about his circumstances. In fact, in Philippians 4:11, he makes the statement that he has “learned in whatever state I am, to be content...”

Whether or not Paul intended for it to be, his letter of appreciation to the Christians in Philippi serves as an excellent example of trusting in God’s power in our lives, no matter what one may be going through. Paul had, long before this letter, come to understand that God and the heavenly reward he was striving towards were far more important than any short season of suffering he may go through during his earthly life. He instead looked for opportunities to glorify God in those seasons of earthly suffering.

This week, let us all try and take this example that Paul set and try to be content in whatever state we are in.
