

“BEHOLD, YOUR MOTHER”
John 19:25-27

INTRODUCTION:

- In Romans 1 Paul described a despicable class of humanity (vss. 28-31).
 - In vs. 31 my mother's Bible uses the words “_____.”
 - I have at times wondered what that meant – until I saw it in action. Then I knew.
 - It means _____, _____, _____.
- What would you do for the woman who brought you into this world?
 - What does she mean to you? How much do you love her?
 - She provided for you. Would you provide for her?
- What did _____ see when she _____ on the _____?
 - She saw her son being put to death. I don't know any mothers who could do that.
 - The prophecy of Simeon was here to be completed (Lk. 2:34-35).
 - The strength of a mother – others ran and ridiculed, but she remained.
 - She saw her son as her Savior (Matt. 1:21).
- What did _____ see when he _____ out from the _____? (vss. 25-27).
 - First he addressed his mother: “_____!”
 - Then he addressed the beloved disciple: “_____!”
 - What did it mean to this disciple to be asked to serve in Jesus' place?
- Had John prepared himself for a sermon on affection? If so, how?

DISCUSSION:

- Do people know where you stand and with whom?
 - In John there was no hint of compromise nor hint of disloyalty.
 - No one drew a sharper contrast between light & dark, love & hate, life & death.
 - No one thundered more loudly against the enemies of the Lamb Jesus.
 - We stand with Jesus when we allow our lives to be transformed into his image.
- Jesus had siblings – why could they not have taken care of their mother?
 - Her other children did not see Jesus the way she did (Matt. 13:55-56; Jn. 7:5).
 - Later, that all changed (Acts 1:14-15).
 - John was the right person, at the right & place and with the right heart.
 - We all have deeds, services or works to be done that only we can do.
- Jesus could no longer stand by his mother.
 - He has left his earthly work in the hands of his people.
 - He has asked us to be his church – his hands, his feet in the world.

CONCLUSION:

- Jesus said: “Behold, your mother” – that is, “See your task now!”
- “Here is the mission I have given you. I'm putting my work in your hands.”
- When John's great moment came he did what he could do for Jesus.
- He will always be known as the apostle who carried on Jesus' work of affection.
