THE IDEAL LIFE

1 Timothy 2:1-4

INTRODUCTION:

1. Thesis of 1 Timothy, according to 1 Timothy 3:15, is conduct in the church.

a. The book of 1 Timothy is not a “church manual”.

b. It is rather a series of instructions showing Christians how to worship, live together, and serve God as members of His family.

2. There is a certain kind of life that God wants His people to “lead”.

a. James’ question is pertinent: “What is your life?” (Jas. 4:13-16).

i. “Life” not seen in quantity, but in quality.

ii. The real question is not: “how long did one live on earth?”, but “How well did one live?”

b. Timothy is urged to “lay hold” on the real life (1 Tim. 6:19).

3. Paul urges God’s people to pray for rulers that they may so govern that God’s saints “lead” this life.

4. Note the four characteristics of the ideal life for God’s people.

DISCUSSION:

I. A LIFE.

A. An calm (peace abiding in our hearts).

B. Christianity is reciprocal at this point.

a. One gains this peace by becoming a Christian, being a Christian promotes a tranquil life.

b. We make “peace with God” when we are (Rom. 5:1).

c. We obtain the “peace of God” (Phil. 4:6-7).

C. The quiet/tranquil life is not given by .

a. Peace comes from (1 Tim. 1:2).

b. In the salutation of the Pauline epistles, he usually includes the idea of peace.

D. A peaceful life is not produced by things (1 Tim. 6:6-10).

II. A LIFE.

A. A quiet life is one which enjoys a calm produced by the absence of disturbances.

B. External calmness resulting in an internal peace; peaceful circumstances surrounding us.

C. Here we often see a paradox: Christianity gives peace within but often brings persecution from without.

D. The church in went through a period of persecution (Acts 4-8:1-4).

a. Following the period of persecution there was “peace, edification, and growth” (Acts 9:31).

b. The book of 1 Peter encourages God’s persecuted people to persevere.

III. A LIFE.

A. A true reverence and respect for God.

B. Godliness is to be (1 Tim. 2:10).

C. Godliness is a great (1 Tim. 3:16).

a. “Mystery”: that which is not known until God reveals it.

b. God has a great plan for making people godly.

D. Godliness is a quality of life that involves personal (1 Tim. 4:7).

a. There is a contrast with godly exercise and bodily exercise.

b. There is a two-fold promise associated with godliness (1 Tim. 4:8).

1. Promise of life now.

2. Promise of life to come.

E. The doctrine/teaching of Christ produces godliness (1 Tim. 6:3).

F. Godliness with contentment is great gain (1 Tim. 6:6).

IV. A LIFE OF .

A. Seriousness of purpose.

B. Challenge of Peter seems appropriate: “make calling and election sure” (2 Peter 1:10).
