



THE CHURCH = A FAMILY

1 Timothy 5:1-16

INTRODUCTION:

1. The Bible has much to say regarding a Christian's relationship with his fellow man.
2. The apostle Paul pleads with brethren to "love one another" (1 Thes. 4:9), prefer "one another" (Rom. 12:10), "edify one another" (14:19), and be "forbearing and forgiving one to another" (Col. 3:13).
3. Those who are worldly-minded and filled with pride often envy their fellow man (Gal. 5:26) and are content to "bite and devour" (v. 15) him to accomplish their own selfish objectives.
4. Such demeanor does not complement Christianity and will not promote goodwill toward the Lord's people.
5. As we contemplate the way we should treat others, let us remember the apostle Paul's plea to the Philippians to do "Let nothing be done through selfish ambition or conceit, but in lowliness of mind let each esteem others better than himself. Let each of you look out not only for his own interests, but also for the interests of others." (Phi. 2:3-4).

DISCUSSION:**I. TREAT ONE ANOTHER LIKE _____ (VV. 1-2)**

- A. Paul begins with a simple but powerful principle: treat people in the church like family.

- B. This immediately sets the tone. The church is not a business, a social club, or a battlefield - it is a family.
- C. Paul specifically warns _____, a younger leader, not to speak harshly to older men. Leadership does not give permission to be disrespectful.
- D. **Application:** Before we speak, confront, or correct, we should ask: *Would I say this the same way to my own parent or sibling?* A healthy church treats people with dignity, regardless of age or position.

II. SHOW _____ THROUGH PRACTICAL _____ (VV. 3-16)

- A. Paul then turns to the care of widows, who were among the most vulnerable in the early church. He says, "Honor widows who are truly widows." Here, honor means more than words - it includes tangible support.
- B. But Paul also introduces _____. Not every situation is the same. If a widow has family who can care for her, that responsibility belongs first to the family. Paul even says that refusing to care for one's own family is a denial of the _____.
- C. This teaches us that the church is not meant to replace personal _____ but to step in where real need exists.
- D. **Application:** The church must be compassionate, but not careless. True love helps people without enabling irresponsibility. God is honored when families take responsibility and the church supports those who truly have no help.
