

# February is Teen Dating Violence Awareness and Prevention Month



According to data from the CDC, nearly 1 in 11 female and approximately 1 in 14 male high school students report having experienced physical dating violence in the past year. These numbers are sure to be even higher for young people in foster care, many of whom have already experienced abuse or neglect by adults in their lives.

Every young person needs and deserves the opportunity to have happy and respectful relationships of all kinds! By looking out for the young people we serve and having critical conversations, CASA volunteers and other caring adults can help prevent teen dating violence and support the development of healthy relationships. Check out these resources to get started!

LovelsRespect.org is the #1 source of information on teen dating violence awareness and prevention for youth and adults alike. It has just about everything you could need to get started, including information on the warning signs of abusive relationships, consent and boundaries, sexual health, how to get help, and so much more.
