GENERAL RULES

- *Any Normande breeder or owner is eligible to exhibit at the show.
- *Cattle exhibited must be registered or eligible for registration in the North American Normande Association herd book
- *Cattle can arrive no earlier than 8 am Friday September 29, 2022.
- *Cattle will be released as soon as the show is over.
- *Exhibitors are expected to assist with the cleaning of the barns immediately after the show. (A skid steer and spreaders will be there to make it easier and quicker.)
- *Cattle must have at least 50% Normande genetics.
- *IF ANIMALS ARE NOT YET REGISTERED THERE WILL BE
 REGISTRATION APPLICATIONS AVAILABLE AT THE SHOW AND
 CAN BE SUBMITTED TO THE NANA REGISTRY SECRETARY BEFORE 11:00 AM

ON SEPTEMBER 30, 2022.

<u>Entry deadline is September 17, 2022</u> and there is no entry fee. Entries will be accepted up until time of show for a late fee of \$5.00/animal, but the animal's information will not be in the show catalog. **Mail your entries to:**

ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS (See Wisconsin regulations below.)

JUDGING

- *Showmanship classes will be judged before placing classes.
- *Separate classes will be held for dairy and beef Normandes.
- *See entry form for class selections. If a class has less than 2 entries, it may be combined with another class. If a class has a large number of entries it may be split into two or three classes.
- *Class order will be Bulls, Heifers and Cows. During the show beef classes will show first and then the dairy classes. Beef classes are shown first and then the dairy classes. This is done to allow the dairy exhibitor's time to prepare their animals for showing since many of them may arrive the morning of the show.
- *Qualified judges will be hired to place each class.
- *Ribbons will be awarded to the first four places in every class and trophies/platters will be awarded to the Champion and Reserve Champion in each division.

FACILITIES

The Iowa County Fairground is located on Fair Street in Mineral Point, WI.

No bedding or feed will be provided; all exhibiters must bring their own.

RV or camper parking is available at the fairgrounds and several motels are located in Mineral Point.

WISCONSON HEALTH PAPER REQUIREMENTS

This is a summary of animal health requirements for fairs, shows and exhibitions only. They are not necessarily the same as requirements for importing animals into Wisconsin or moving them within the state for other purposes. They may change if animal diseases occur in Wisconsin or elsewhere, so you should always check Wisconsin's website (www.datcp.wi.gov) or contact them at 608-224-4872 for current information.

General Requirements

Animals that show evidence of having contagious or infectious diseases may not be commingled (or housed/kept) with other animals at a fair, show, or other exhibition in such a way as to allow disease to spread. Such animals should not attend the fair, show, or exhibition. Animals may be denied entry if they arrive at these events with contagious or infectious diseases, isolated and/or removed if they develop disease after arriving, or be subject to other action as would be necessary to control disease.

Bovine animals with ringworm, mange, warts or scab will be removed from the fair or exhibition premises, unless the veterinarian in charge finds warts or ringworm lesions are incapable of transmitting disease.

Cattle from within Wisconsin have no requirements for tests or health documents.

Cattle from outside Wisconsin must:

Be accompanied by certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI or health certificate) documenting official animal identification (ID) and all required tests and certifications Have at least one form of official individual ID (including steers)

Meet all of Wisconsin's normal requirements for import (see https://datcp.wi.gov/Pages/Programs_Services/CattleBison.aspx)

Acceptable animal IDs for all cattle from outside Wisconsin:

USDA metal ear tag number that is part of the National Uniform Eartagging System (NUES) (starts with state 2-digit code, also known as "brite" tag); this includes the orange brucellosis vaccination tag

15-digit "840" tags (visual or RFID)

Valid only if applied before March 11, 2015:

a-Manufacturer-coded RFID tag - 15-digit number with the first three digits in 900s

b-American ID tag - 8 to 12-digit number prefaced with "USA"

Brucellosis requirements for cattle from outside Wisconsin: No cattle from outside Wisconsin are currently required to be brucellosis tested or vaccinated to come to fairs and shows in Wisconsin

Tuberculosis (TB) requirements for cattle from outside Wisconsin: For requirements by state, see: https://datcp.wi.gov/Pages/Programs_Services/CattleBison.aspx

Cattle from Michigan's Modified Accredited Zone (for cattle from Michigan's TB Free Zone, see requirements by state above) also need:

Import permit

To originate from a herd that has a negative whole-herd TB test within 12 months before arrival in Wisconsin that includes all animals 1 year and older

Negative individual TB tests within 60 days before entering Wisconsin

To return directly to the state of origin after the show, and there must be a statement on the CVI that they will be doing so

- *Showmanship classes will be held **before** the regular placings classes.
- *Ribbons will be given to the top four in each category.
- *You do not need to sign up beforehand.
- *You do not need to own the animal to show in the showmanship class.

FARM DISPLAY EXHIBIT

Rules: This category is for anyone who would like to bring Normandes to the show but feels uncomfortable with leading them in a show ring. No awards will be given, just an opportunity to showcase your cattle tied in the barn.

2022 WISCONSIN FARM TECHNOLOGY DAYS



The Beef Tent at the 2022 Wisconsin Farm Technology Days had a very steady stream of visitors during the three day Wisconsin Farm **Technology Days show** near Loyal, WI. in July. The weather was very cooperative with very little rain during the day time hours of the show. And the result was a total attendance of over 40,000 people during its three day run in Clark county.

As part of its exhibit, NANA had a live cow/calf pair which drew a lot of attention

to NANA's exhibit. The Normande cow/calf pair was provided by Double M Cattle Company LLC from Rewey, WI, and many folks stopped just to pet the calf. Among those who stopped to pet the Normande calf were two young members of the campaign staff of U.S senatorial candidate Mandela Barnes, who was campaigning at the Wisconsin Farm Technology Days for one day.

Jerome Chateau of Normande Genetics assisted NANA with speaking with those interested in the Normande breed and fielding questions. Many of the questions centered around the amount of milk Normandes would produce and what their butterfat and protein tests were in comparison to other breeds. Normande Genetics has a fair number of clients in Clark and surrounding counties, and a good number of them stopped to talk Normandes. NANA thanks Jerome for assisting in fielding questions and promoting the Normande breed.

GENETIC INFORMATION ON REGISTRATION PAPERS

For several years now NANA has been placing genetic information on animal's registration papers as long as it is submitted to NANA's office so the information can be entered into the Herd Book. The information we are talking about primarily is A2A2, A1A2, beta casein, and kappa casein.

A fair number of individuals contacting NANA about where they might be able to obtain some milking Normandes often specify they are looking for animals that are A2A2. Not knowing if you genetically test your animals for those genes, we can not direct them to you. This is especially true for those of you who are milking your Normandes. The inquiries are often from soneone desiring a "family cow or two".

You as a breeder will need to determine if the genetic test is worth the expense. But we want you to be aware there are people looking for Normande females to milk that possese the A2A2 gene.
