Porcelain Sinks

PAMPER YOUR PORCELAIN

Porcelain sinks naturally shine on their own, but every now and then they could use your help. Use this polishing tip to pamper your porcelain back to shine whenever it is looking dull.

INSTRUCTIONS

Pour some vinegar straight from the bottle into the sink bowl.

With a nylon brush, give your sink a good scrub down.

Rinse away vinegar smell with pure water and dry.

SUPPLIES NEEDED



RUB PORCELAIN SCUFFS AWAY

We get it, scuffs happen. Use this tip to help remove unsightly scuff marks without causing damage to your porcelain sink.


INSTRUCTIONS

Mix baking soda with water until you have a paste-like consistency.

With a soft sponge, rub paste on scuffs until they are no longer visible.

Rinse thoroughly with water and dry.

SUPPLIES NEEDED



WIPE AWAY PORCELAIN GRIME

Don't let a build-up of toothpaste and other gunk in your sink be the way your bathroom guests are greeted. Keep your sink looking fabulous with this easy tip.

INSTRUCTIONS

Cover your sink with a mild chlorine bleach cleaner.

With a soft sponge, scrub around your entire sink in a circular motion.

Rinse immediately with pure water and dry.

SANITIZE YOUR PORCELAIN

INSTRUCTIONS

Mix a solution from 1 part bleach and 3 parts water.

Let solution soak in sink for 30 minutes to an hour.

Drain solution, rinse well with pure water, and dry.

INSTRUCTIONS


Mix detergent or a mild, non-abrasive cleaner with water.

With a soft sponge, scrub around your entire sink in a circular motion.

Rinse immediately with pure water and dry.

TRULY FLAWLESS QUARTZ GRANITE

To maintain the surface of your Quartz Granite sink, avoid cleaning with harsh citrus cleaners and ammonia. Be sure to dry your sink after each use and regularly clean your sink with this tip.

INSTRUCTIONS

Cover your sink with a mixture of mild soap and

With a nylon brush, gently scrub around your entire sink.

Rinse immediately with pure water and dry.

SUPPLIES NEEDED

BLEMISHED QUARTZ GRANITE

Rusty water or oily substances left in your Quartz Granite sink can cause discoloration. Unwanted blemishes can be eliminated by using a Mr. Clean® Magic Eraser® or by following this tip.

INSTRUCTIONS

Wearing protective gloves, fill sink with approximately 2 inches of warm water and 3-4 splashes of bleach.

Allow solution to soak in the sink for 15 minutes.

Drain solution, rinse well with pure water, and dry.

DAZZLING DRAINS

Regular drain maintenance is key to making sure your kitchen sink keeps smelling fresh. Add this easy tip to your daily cleaning routine to help prevent odors caused by bacterial buildup.

INSTRUCTIONS

SUPPLIES NEEDED

Empty your strainer.

Under hot, running water, scrub away buildup with a nylon brush.

Rinse away any loose debris and place your strainer back in the drain.

SEND ODORS DOWN THE DRAIN

Although daily cleaning can effectively prevent most odors from occurring, sometimes foul odors are unavoidable. Use this tip to put a stop to foul odors as soon as they begin to surface.

INSTRUCTIONS

SUPPLIES NEEDED

Run extremely hot water down your drain.

With water running, pour a teaspoon of baking soda, vinegar or bleach down the drain. If needed, lemon juice may also suffice.

Keep water running for 15 seconds.
