SADIE KLUMPP RECEIVES HOOVES AND BOOTS AWARD



The Richard and Caroline Dibble family of West Winfield, NY, have selected Sadie Klumpp of Appleton, NY, as the recipient of their Hooves and Boots Award for 2017. This is the third Normande heifer the Dibble family has given in memory and honor of their son, Elijah Dibble. Their Hooves and Boots Award program is similar to NANA's Youth Heifer Program and gives a Normande heifer to a young person in the New York state area.

Sadie is a 15 year old high school student and is excited about her Normande heifer. Her family used to be involved in dairy farming but now as a family they raise Boer goats, chickens and rabbits on their property.

A unique feature of the Dibble's application for their heifer award program is the young person can check a box if they would like their application to be automatically considered the following year if they are not selected as the winner. In 2015 Sadie checked the box but then submitted another application in 2016. Sadie's determination impressed the Dibbles as she pictorially documented her animal showing experience and her work at home.

Sadie submitted the following to Normande Happenings, "My name is Sadie Klumpp. I am 15 years old and live in Appleton, NY. I am the 2017

Hooves and Boots winner. I have entered the contest every year and I am very thankful the Dibble family chose me. I look forward to learning more about Normandes and promoting the breed.

I received my calf, Grace, when she was two weeks old. I feed her at 6am and 6pm every day. I walk her on the halter and we are bonding well. I look forward to showing her for the first time in 2018. Until then I will continue to spend time with her every day and research the breed, and learn as much as I can. I love her so much!"

Richard and Caroline Dibble made the following comments to Normande Happenings: "The Dibble family feels privileged to come in contact with so many fine young people through this program. It is always a difficult decision, but Sadie impressed us with her extra effort. On the application is an option to automatically have your application reconsidered in following years, and Sadie opted for this. But she still submitted an impressive application a second time, showing a real willingness to invest herself. It was terrific to meet the Klumpp family and we wish them every blessing and welcome them to the Normande world."

The Polk County Fair located in Bolivar, MO, bills itself as one of the largest free admission county fairs in the entire state of Missouri. GENERAL RULES

- *Any Normande breeder or owner is eligible to exhibit at the show.
- *Cattle exhibited must be registered or eligible for registration in the North American Normande Association herd book. Animals recorded in another breed association herd book qualify as long as exhibitor submits a copy of the other Association's registration paper to a NANA representative prior to 11:00 am on September 9, 2017.
- *Cattle can arrive no earlier than 8 am Friday September 8, 2017.
- *Cattle will be released as soon as the show is over.
- *Exhibitors are expected to assist with the cleaning of the barns immediately after the show. (A skid steer and spreaders will be there to make it easier and quicker.)
- *Cattle must have at least 50% Normande genetics.
- *IF ANIMALS ARE NOT YET REGISTERED THERE WILL BE REGISTRATION APPLICATIONS AVAILABLE AT THE SHOW AND CAN BE SUBMITTED TO THE NANA REGISTRY SECRETARY BEFORE 11:00 AM ON SEPTEMBER 9, 2017

Entry deadline is August 25, 2017 and there is no entry fee. Entries will be accepted up until time of show for a late fee of \$5.00/animal, but the animal's information will not be in the show catalog. Mail your entries to:

ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS (See Wisconsin regulations below.)

JUDGING

- *Showmanship classes will be judged before placings classes.
- *Separate classes will be held for dairy and beef Normandes.
- *See entry form for class selections. If a class has less than 2 entries, it may be combined with another class. If a class has a large number of entries it may be split into two or three classes.
- *Class order will be Bulls, Heifers and Cows. During the show classes will alternate between beef and dairy entries.
- *Qualified judges will be hired to place each class.
- *Ribbons will be awarded to the first three places in every class and trophies/platters will be awarded to the Champion and Reserve Champion is each division.

FACILITIES

The Iowa County Fairground is located on Fair Street in Mineral Point, WI.

No bedding or feed will be provided; all exhibiters must bring their own.

RV or camper parking is available at the fairgrounds and several motels are located in Mineral Point.

WISCONSIN HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR CATTLE

<u>Cattle originating from within Wisconsin:</u> There are no test or health document requirements for cattle from within Wisconsin.

<u>Cattle originating from outside of Wisconsin:</u> A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall accompany all cattle documenting animal identification and all tests or certificates required.

Steers are exemption from any brucellosis test requirement.

Cattle from Brucellosis Certified Free herds in Class A states may enter Wisconsin without a prior brucellosis test if the certified herd number and the last test date appear on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

All cattle originating from Tuberculosis <u>Modified Accredited Advanced</u> states shall have a negative tuberculosis test within 60 days of entering Wisconsin; these states are Minnesota and New Mexico. Call the Wisconsin Division of Animal Health for a current listing of these states. (608-224-4872) Dairy animals from states not recognizing Wisconsin's Tuberculosis Free status shall be required to have a negative tuberculosis test within 60 days of coming into Wisconsin. These states currently include: Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Connecticut (beef also), Georgia, Idaho, Indiana, Kansas,

Missouri, Montana, Nebraska (beef also), Nevada, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania (beef also), South Dakota, Texas, Utah, Washington, West Virginia (beef also) and Wyoming. Call the Wisconsin Division of Animal Health (608-224-4872) to check on the current status of your state if you do not know it.

Cattle originating from Tuberculosis Accredited Free herds (except MI) may enter Wisconsin without a prior test if the accredited herd number appears on the Certificate of Inspection.

Cattle originating from Michigan must have a permit number and require special tuberculosis testing. Call the Wisconsin Division of Animal Health (608-224-4872) to determine testing requirements.

If you have any questions about what is needed to bring your cattle into Wisconsin contact your veterinarian or the Wisconsin Division of Animal Health (608-224-4872).

Rules: This category is for anyone who would like to bring Normandes to the show but feels uncomfortable with leading them in a show ring. No awards will be given, just an opportunity to showcase your cattle tied in the barn.

^{*}Showmanship classes will be held **before** the regular placings classes.

^{*}Ribbons will be given to the top three in each category.

^{*}You do not need to sign up beforehand.

^{*}You do not need to own the animal to show in the showmanship class.



Dr. Wachholz grew up on a family farm near Wautoma, WI, where they had a wide variety of farm animals, but primarily raised cucumbers for a packing company in Wautoma. But his interest was in the livestock animals they raised and so he focus his life on them. He earned an Agriculture Education degree from UW-Platteville and began his teaching career at the River Valley High School in Sawyer, MI. He continued his educational pursuits and soon returned to UW-Platteville to get a Master's Degree in Swine Nutrition. He then went on to South Dakota State University and earned a PHD in Swine Nutrition. After receiving his doctorate he returned to UW-Platteville where he taught as a full time professor for ten years.

In 1982 Dr. Wachholz was offered an opportunity to teach at the UW-River Falls campus and he took it, becoming an animal science instructor and coaching the UWRF livestock judging team. In 1990

his students chose him as the UWRF Distinguished Teacher. Following the end of the 2014 school year Dr. Wachholz retired from full time teaching but continues to assist with the Meat Animal Evaluation courses and the UWRF Beef Management team.

Dr. Wachholz and his wife, Judy (a native of Platteville, WI), continue to live in River Falls. They have two children, Lance and Erika, and a number of grandchildren.

TAMMY VOEGELI RETURNS AS DAIRY JUDGE



Tammy Voegeli will be returning as our judge for the dairy show. Tammy is a native of Arlington Wisconsin and is an active part of VoGrin Swiss Farms. 


