

A VERY SPECIAL VISITOR



In Late 2018, Double M Cattle Company LLC received a phone call that resulted in a visit to our farm by a very special individual, his son and two of his friends. On June 7, 2019, Art Nachtigal, from Reedsburg, WI, his son Tim, and friends Ron Synder and Richard Running, came to our farm to see our Normande cattle.

Art Nachtigal is a member of the United States "greatest generation." Seventy-five years earlier, on June 6, 1944, at age 19, Art was in the U.S. Navy Armed Guard, a little known branch of the Navy assigned the dangerous task of guarding the ships carrying vital supplies to American forces around the world.

Initially, Art served as a gunner on an oil tanker and he made several trips from the East Coast through the Panama Canal to Hawaii during the war without encountering any enemy ships during their voyages. Art was eventually transferred to a supply freighter, the SS Michael J. Stone. In 1945 the SS Michael J. Stone was assigned a supply voyage that started in Texas and would take them around the world via Morocco, Calcutta, Australia, and then back to Texas. After having gone through the Strait of Gibraltar on that assignment, the SS Michael J. Stone was torpedoed on February 17, 1945 by a German sub after the sub had sunk a British tanker. Art was off duty and in his bunk reading when the torpedo struck. As soon as he heard the explosion he knew what had happened. Fortunately the SS Michael J. Stone did not sink, but it was crippled and had to limp to Morroco, one of their destinations in their voyage around the world. Everyone on the ship survived the German U-boat attack, but they could not continue their voyage circumventing the world.

After World War II, Art returned home and married Ramona Middlesteadt, on May 6, 1946. They had seven children and were married seventy-one years at the time of Ramona's death.

On April 17, 2010, Art and his son Tim, took part in one of Wisconsin's World War II Veterans Honor Flights to Washington D.C. to see the World War II Memorial



built to honor World War II veterans. Art is very thankful he was able to make the trip as an honored veteran.

Art had become aware we had a herd of Normandes and he wanted to see them while he was still able to be out and about. So arrangements were made for Art to visit our farm to see some Normandes. His visit turned out to be one day after D-Day, seventy-five years later.

After introductions, we related to our visitors how we had become interested in Normandes, the year we had obtained our first Normandes, and the size of our current herd and farming operation. Our farm tour started with showing Art and company some of the baby calves we were feeding on a bottle and some yearling heifers. We then drove out and viewed some of the cows, and their new born calves, grazing in our paddocks. From the paddocks we went to the pasture where we were grazing our breeding bulls. The size of our mature breeding bulls (Zoland, Arello, Candyman, and Cap'n Crunch) made an impression. After viewing the bulls, we stopped at the feedlot and to look at the steers and heifers we were fattening. Art and his companions spent nearly two hours viewing our Normandes and our farming operation. They had lots of questions and were a delight to visit with. It was an honor for Double M Cattle Company LLC to have Art, his son Tim, and their friends see our herd and farming operation. And everyone in NANA expresses their deep appreciation to Art and his fellow veterans for their sacrifices and service to our beloved country, the United States.

JUNE 6, 1944

This day in history marks the beginning of the end of World War II. No one knows for sure what our world would look like if the joint Allied military efforts on D-Day had not had the success that they did. D-Day involved 156,000 Allied troops, 11,590 Allied aircraft that flew 14,674 sorties, and 6,939 Allied naval vessels delivering troops and supplies to begin the effort to liberate Europe. World War II began on September 1, 1939 and ended on September 2, 1945. It is estimated 75 million people died because of the war. (One third military deaths and two thirds civilian deaths.)

A VERY SUCCESSFUL FIELD DAY



On July 20, 2019, High-Gem Normandes and Holsteins hosted a very successful NANA Field Day. Chris, Brenda, Mykala, and Paige Conley went all out to showcase their farm and their Normandes. And their efforts were rewarded with one of the best attended NANA Field Days over the years NANA has sponsored the event.

Chris and Brenda love being dairy producers and take great pride in their registered Holstein and registered Normande herd. They currently milk 60 cows and have 60 young stock. Having started to add Normandes to their dairy herd in 2012 by using French Normande semen, they now have 18 Normandes (5 milk cows and the rest young stock) in their herd that range from 50% to 88% Normande. They eventually want their herd to

consist of one-half Holsteins and one-half Normandes. They graze their milking herd during the summer months and feed stored silage, haylage and baled hay during the winter.



The day's events, after introductions were made and a brief description of their farming operation, included viewing their milking Normandes and heifers in the milk barn. A hay ride to see the farmland, crops and scenic view of the farmstead followed the viewing of the cattle. Once back from the hayride a lunch of pulled pork and roast beef sandwiches, French cheeses, salads, watermelon, vegetable tray, chips and beverages was enjoyed. Following lunch, Brendan Blank, their dairy nutritionist,

spoke about the benefits of utilizing different forages in a dairy ration and how

beneficial such a feeding program has been to the Conley's. Jerome Chateau of Normande Genetics gave a brief presentation on French Normande genetics. Following Jerome's presentation there was a good question and answer session reference the Normande breed and French Normande genetics.





The Conley's were honored to have four out of state attendees to their Field Day. Bruce and Connie Bolen came all the way from Greentop, MO, to enjoy the day. And Ken Rabas and Ben Bolen traveled from Iowa to attend. NANA expresses to the Conley's our thanks for hosting and working so hard to make the NANA 2019 Field Day a worthwhile event. And NANA thanks Brendan Blank and Jerome Chateau for sharing their expertise with those who attended.

- *Cattle exhibited must be registered or eligible for registration in the North American Normande Association herd book. Animals recorded in another breed association herd book qualify as long as exhibitor submits a copy of the other Association's registration paper to a NANA representative prior to 11:00 am on September 21, 2019.
- *Cattle can arrive no earlier than 8 am Friday September 20, 2019.
- *Cattle will be released as soon as the show is over.
- *Exhibitors are expected to assist with the cleaning of the barns immediately after the show. (A skid steer and spreaders will be there to make it easier and quicker.)
- *Cattle must have at least 50% Normande genetics.
- *IF ANIMALS ARE NOT YET REGISTERED THERE WILL BE
 REGISTRATION APPLICATIONS AVAILABLE AT THE SHOW AND
 CAN BE SUBMITTED TO THE NANA REGISTRY SECRETARY BEFORE 11:00 AM

ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS (See Wisconsin regulations below.)

JUDGING

- *Showmanship classes will be judged before placings classes.
- *Separate classes will be held for dairy and beef Normandes.
- *See entry form for class selections. If a class has less than 2 entries, it may be combined with another class. If a class has a large number of entries it may be split into two or three classes.
- *Class order will be Bulls, Heifers and Cows. During the show classes will alternate between beef and dairy entries.
- *Qualified judges will be hired to place each class.
- *Ribbons will be awarded to the first three places in every class and trophies/platters will be awarded to the Champion and Reserve Champion is each division.

FACILITIES

The Iowa County Fairground is located on Fair Street in Mineral Point, WI.

No bedding or feed will be provided; all exhibiters must bring their own.

RV or camper parking is available at the fairgrounds and several motels are located in Mineral Point.

WISCONSIN HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR CATTLE

<u>Cattle originating from within Wisconsin:</u> There are no test or health document requirements for cattle from within Wisconsin.

<u>Cattle originating from outside of Wisconsin:</u> A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall accompany all cattle documenting animal identification and all tests or certificates required.

Steers are exemption from any brucellosis test requirement.

Cattle from Brucellosis Certified Free herds in Class A states may enter Wisconsin without a prior brucellosis test if the certified herd number and the last test date appear on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

All cattle originating from Tuberculosis <u>Modified Accredited Advanced</u> states shall have a negative tuberculosis test within 60 days of entering Wisconsin; these states are Minnesota and New Mexico. Call the Wisconsin Division of Animal Health for a current listing of these states. (608-224-4872)

Dairy animals from states not recognizing Wisconsin's Tuberculosis Free status shall be required to have a negative tuberculosis test within 60 days of coming into Wisconsin. These states currently include: Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Connecticut (beef also), Georgia, Idaho, Indiana, Kansas,

Missouri, Montana, Nebraska (beef also), Nevada, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania (beef also), South Dakota, Texas, Utah, Washington, West Virginia (beef also) and Wyoming. Call the Wisconsin Division of Animal Health (608-224-4872) to check on the current status of your state if you do not know it.

Cattle originating from Tuberculosis Accredited Free herds (except MI) may enter Wisconsin without a prior test if the accredited herd number appears on the Certificate of Inspection.

Cattle originating from Michigan must have a permit number and require special tuberculosis testing. Call the Wisconsin Division of Animal Health (608-224-4872) to determine testing requirements.

If you have any questions about what is needed to bring your cattle into Wisconsin contact your veterinarian or the Wisconsin Division of Animal Health (608-224-4872).






